



The following local planning applications received by Wycombe District Council (WDC) In the 4 weeks to 8th February 2018 were discussed and any responses by NAWARA appear on the WDC website.

Planning Applications: 17/08435/FUL. 209 Main Road Naphill HP14 4SE. Demolishing of existing two storey residential building (209A&B) and factory/office (Buckshouse) and construction of 5 dwellings (3 x 2 beds and 2 x 3 beds), detached carport with 3 bays, gardens sheds and associated landscaping. Target date for Determination: 07.03.2018 (No Objection)

18/05033/FUL 22 Braeside Naphill HP14 4RY Construction of Single storey rear extension to form Kitchen and conversion of existing Kitchen to Ground Floor Bedroom. Target Date for Determination: 09.03.2018

Wycombe DC Planning Committee on 14.02.2018 considered 17/05605/FUL Timber Yard formerly Shana in GB/Chilterns AONB/on agricultural land. Appn. of 7th March 2017. Reminder. Application included extension of an existing workshop and erection of a new workshop (with all the additional noise neighbours may suffer), new offices for businesses in addition to business of storage and distribution of building and fencing materials, and extra parking.

Strong 3 minute objection by NAWARA voiced at the WDC Planning Committee meeting where Mr Michael Bryant's application was considered. NAWARA pointed out that WDC in allowing change of use from an equestrian establishment to an industrial centre, (which is inappropriate on GB/AONB/agricultural land) had limited its approval in 2014 by Conditions. Condition No.9 stated "..the land and/or buildings shall be used ONLY for the purpose of storage and distribution and FOR NO OTHER PURPOSE." Reason. "..to enable the Local Planning Authority to retain control over the use of the land and in the interests of protecting the residential amenities of nearby residential properties."

During their discussion (a) WDC did not address major breaches of planning controls on the site which NAWARA pointed out. (b) They brushed aside request that opening time at Timber Yard should be moved from 7 to 8am, because WDC had permitted 7am in 2014 (c) Little unease about the added noise residents might suffer from another noisy workshop (noise can be reduced through insulation they said); or the concerns about further businesses on the site and the extra traffic. (d) Not enough people had complained about noise to warrant WDC action. (e) A councillor commented that it was good to have a growing industrial centre in the GB/Chilterns AONB because it could offer more work on the village doorstep. So no councillor objections on that score. (f) Complaints about the ongoing problems and noise of HGVs entering and exiting the site was mentioned but not discussed because it is a Highways problem (g) Mr Michael Bryant's clearance of foliage and trees in GB/AONB mentioned by a concerned councillor was also not discussed because that was

said to be a matter for an environmental department.

WDC Planning Committee voted 100% to support Michael Bryant's application 17/05605/FUL for industrial expansion at Timber Yard, Walter's Ash. In doing so it put aside the WDC Head of Planning's overriding Condition 9 of 2014 related to initial application 12/07953/FUL.

Naphill & Walter's Ash Treasurer's Report 2018

Another year has flown by. They say that a year to a five year old seems a really long time but when you are in your seventies it is no time at all. How true.

This has been another successful year although rather more expensive than previously. Sonia has done a great job by introducing even more colour to the magazine which has created a far more interesting presentation. Whereas the average cost of the magazine each issue in 2016 was £1200 it has risen to £1400 this last year and we have been advised that there will be further increases in printing costs this year. This may be

mitigated by reducing the thickness of the paper in the central part of the magazine. Since we did not increase either the subscription rate or the fees for advertising last year this has meant that we have had a loss of £1595.55. We are not concerned about this as we have sufficient reserves in hand to cover the loss.

Income from subscriptions was very good this year being only slightly less than expected. Of the £2810.85 collected £2764.15 was paid in to the bank account and the remaining £46.70 used to top up the amount of cash in hand. The latter has been used throughout the year for incidental expenditure, such as postage, envelopes etc. We are obliged to send a copy each month to the British Library and The Agency for Legal Deposit Libraries.

In spite of the increased costs we have decided to keep the subscription rate at £3.00 for this coming year but may have to increase this to £4.00 in 2019.

Please make sure you have your money ready when your deliverer calls at the end of March with the April issue of the gazette.

As far as the advertisers are concerned the majority paid up promptly after receiving their invoices last November. Others had to be chased up in January in an attempt to get everything settled by the end of the financial year, but there are still some who have yet to pay. This makes life difficult for Sonia as she is unsure if they will continue advertising and she has to get everything set up by the middle of February. There are people on the waiting list who would like to advertise in our popular magazine and would welcome the opportunity to fill any vacant space.

Donations from the Methodist Church and Hughenden Parish Council were the same as previous years and for these we are most grateful. With the possible demise of the Methodist Church this may not be the same next year.

Interest on the small sum we keep in our reserve account remains at an insignificant amount.

There has been a significant increase in our general expenses mainly to enable our editor to improve the quality of the art work in the magazine.

Altogether quite a good year.

Chairmans Report

At the monthly meeting of the village hall it was confirmed that the concrete bases had been laid for the seats to be installed on the crick. Jonny Goddard came to the meeting to tell us that the fundraising for the table tennis table would start off with a car wash at the village hall. He also said that other fundraising ideas were for a charity football match, a fun run and lawn mowing. the events will be publicised on Facebook. Linda Clark outlined the Napfest programme for this year. As the R.A.F. is 100 years old there will be many R.A.F. personal in uniform at the event and they have donated £1000 for fireworks at the end of the music evening on the Friday and will also fund the bands for the event. The treasurer, Paul Riglar proposed that the Luncheon Club's annual rent be waived and a vote confirmed this. Some of the hall's lets had problems with the heating and steps will be taken to rectify this.

The maintenance of the hall continues with quotes being sought for repairs to the roof over the scout/guides hall and the guttering. Inside the hall the small hall needs a new floor covering and decorating. The posts in the car park also need replacing and so the list goes on! The village hall is your village hall and without your support we would not have such a great asset.


Our progress so far! The easy ones!

Thank you to all those who came to our AGM. I hope you will agree that it was a good evening with an interesting and informative talk by Mike Fisher of Fisher's Brewery in High Wycombe. It was enlightening to learn of the skill, enthusiasm and perseverance needed to produce just the right range of beers: and if you got a chance to taste some I am sure you will agree that Mike has succeeded.

But it was not all about beer; we had some business to do. The existing committee was re-elected. consisting of Chris Miller Chairman and leader of our short walks, Sheila Draper secretary, Peggy Ewart treasurer, Lynn McMinn membership secretary, Ron Collins leader of our long walks, Peter Davis leader of our work parties, Philip Hussey and Trevor Hussey. Our Chairman sketched out what we have done over the last year and some of our ambitions for the next twelve months. Lynn reported that our membership stands at 118, which is slightly down on last year. If you would like to join or re-join please do. Our large membership is our main strength in negotiating with those who have power over the fate of the Common. In her treasurer's report Peggy explained that we had a lot of expenditure over the last year, mainly on equipment needed by the work parties – but if you have seen the what they have achieved, especially the transformation of our ponds, I think you will judge the expenditure to have been worthwhile.

With spring coming we will soon have to cease work around the ponds. Frogs will already be preparing to spawn in late January and newts will start to reemerge in February, while toads spawn in March. Frog spawn is familiar and easy to spot, but toads lay long strings of eggs, up to 3 m long, wrapped around the stems of plants. Newts lay up to 300 eggs but each is laid individually and wrapped in the

leaf of a water plant. Later dragonflies will arrive. Some species inject their eggs into the stems of plants while others scatter them into the water. You can see why we have been careful to leave plenty of vegetation in our ponds.


We can look forward to our migrant birds returning. We should have at least three of the commoner warblers: chiffchaffs, willow warblers and blackcaps (some of the latter have been with us all winter), but our more open woodland might eventually attract wood warblers and garden warblers. Greater spotted woodpeckers will soon be drumming and we also have green and, perhaps lesser spotted woodpeckers. Look out too for nuthatches (with their heads down) and tree creepers (heads up) working their way up and down the main limbs of the trees.

Wessex Woodland Management have almost finished this session of felling and, after the common has had a chance to dry out a little, they will try to level some of the ruts and clean up the area. Once the worst disturbance is over and our open areas become green we should see more deer – not just muntjac, but also roe and fallow deer. Hares often visit the Common and more low vegetation may encourage them further. The changed conditions may help hedgehogs to find a living – they have declined dramatically in recent years and need all the help they can get.

The last major task remaining is to remove the Great Beech that has collapsed into Dew Pond. Let's hope we have a fine spring during which the Common can mend itself with a little help from us. Please enjoy its recovery.

The winter months have brought about some challenging weather conditions meaning the Council had to deal with several fallen trees due to the weight of the snow and high winds. Thankfully no injuries suffered, only the usual inconveniences that these conditions bring.

With Spring just around the corner, the start of the Allotment season is fast approaching. There are several vacant plots on both the Louches Lane & Walters Ash allotment sites and to help new tenants get off to a better start, the Parish Council is investing considerably in a much needed "cleanup" of all vacant plots. This will make it much easier for new tenants to get started on working their plots. The Council is also upgrading the water supplies at each allotment site meaning all taps will comply with health and safety standards.

If you would like to become part of the ever increasing "grow your own" population, then please get in touch with either Jill (Deputy Clerk) or myself in the office and we will be more than happy to help you. There are so many benefits to being an allotment holder not least that you get to enjoy the great outdoors and you also enjoy your own home grown fresh produce. The cost for half a plot is £23 and a whole plot is £35.

The Council have been busy over the winter months in Cockshoot Woods. In January, The Chiltern Rangers with the help of volunteers, cleared holly & laurel overgrowth as well as moving some saplings and dead trees to let more light into the wood to stimulate healthy growth. Cockshoot Woods is a beautiful little wood situated on the outskirts of Widmer End. The Council also owns and maintains three ponds in the Parish, Cockpit Hole in Great Kingshill, Vincent's Pond in Naphill & Walters Ash Pond. Work is about to begin on the Winter maintenance of these ponds - cutting back overgrown shrubbery and clearance of debris in the ponds to ensure they are in good condition for the rest of the year.

One of the delights of March is to savour delicious "allotment soup". This is where I make use of various root vegetables which are reasonably immune to the effects of snow, frost and incessant rain. I start the cooking off with finely chopped leeks, browned in the pressure cooker along with some garlic and perhaps the odd onion. Then I add whatever is to hand, such as carrots, turnips if available, a few parsnips, perhaps a few potatoes, celery, perhaps salsify, and complete the mixture with pieces of cooked chicken. After the pressure cooker has done its work I have

the most delicious soup one can imagine. Apart, that is, from simple leek and potato soup with a little garlic added, plus crème fraîche at the end of cooking. Two soups to die for!

I have found a way to stop Muntjac deer from eating my carrots, which I leave in the ground all winter. I simply cover the row with a roll of wire chicken netting and that always works. As for celery, I protect the plants against frost by putting fleece over and that seems to work most winters. Some of my celeriac this winter were about twice the diameter of the largest I have grown before; I cover them with fleece and reserve the celeriac to be eaten as a salad as céleri rémoulade, finely grated along with carrots in a food processor, and with mayonnaise, olive oil and capers added before serving. What joy! After all, the whole point of growing your own is to be able to eat really fresh vegetables and fruit which is rich in nutrients and free of man-made chemicals.

As for work on the allotment and in the garden, March is a month for tidying up and completing the spreading of farmyard manure. The greenhouse should be clean by now and all ready for the new growing year. On one side of my greenhouse there is a deep bed in which I grow tomatoes. The soil, over 12 inches deep, consists of almost pure farmyard manure which has been applied over 30 years, so providing a growing medium which is water-retentive and very, very rich in nutrients. On the other side of my greenhouse I have raised staging on which I place 75-litre bags of multi-purpose compost and use them as grow bags for peppers, aubergines and cucumbers. Before planting out I add generous quantities of slow release fertiliser pellets, since garden centre compost has only a small amount of plant food in the mixture. I start off all my greenhouse crops in a dark, warm place and bring them out into the light as soon as they have germinated, then place them on a warm, sunny windowsill. Some other crops such as celery, celeriac and parsley are started off on the windowsill since they seem to need light to germinate.

Points of Interest

Writing these notes on a beautiful morning in February, cold and frosty but a beautiful blue sky, even more appreciated now that the trees in front of my house have been considerably thinned out allowing the sunlight to shine through on my garden again. I say again because having lived in the house for over 55 years I have seen the beech and oak trees become very overgrown and with holly and

yew blocking out the light. Photographs taken of the common in 1902 show the frontage of the "Lady's Myle" (spelling as written on Deeds of my house, Middle English, from Old English and from Latin mīlia (passuum), as being open common land with few trees. My Great Aunt, Miss Edith Kennedy, could walk along Number One footpath in her Sunday best, to St Botolph's, Bradenham, for both Matins and Evensong Services.

I can still remember patches of what we called Cumberland grass, a very fine dwarf species which was well grazed by rabbits. I always understood that the Naphill Cricket wicket was created from this turf. Sadly, that patch of grass is now a patch of deep mud and the path is impassable. The similar situation two years ago, turned out not to be so bad after the paths and bridleways were "levelled" and the summer sun dried up the mud and restored a semblance of grass and vegetation. Last year I thought that the Common had benefitted from the thinning and I am hopeful that the present muddy morass will again be just an unpleasant memory when Summer returns!

I read recently that Buckinghamshire was the 'pothole' capital of the Country which I think was rather unfair as all local authorities are struggling to maintain their roads on very reduced financial support. What a difference could be the made if the 50 billion pounds to be expended on HS2 were used instead on our existing failing infrastructure. I feel sorry for the County Council as it struggles with an ever-increasing need for social care and the funding of both adult and children's services whilst at the same time facing severe cuts in central government support. One certainty I can foresee, is an increase in Council Tax from April onwards!

Letter from Bradenham Vicarage

Our calendar year literally Marches on. Named for Mars, the god of war, the third month of our year sees the Spring Equinox – from now on there are more hours of light in our day than dark. This day marks the astronomical beginning of our Spring. The long dark days of winter are gone and bright, happy days now lie before us, to be followed by the lush, bountiful days of summer. The sun will not be at this height in the sky again until September 21st.

The Spring or Vernal Equinox was a cause of great celebration in ancient times. The pre-Christian community of Britain called it Ostara, from where we get our word Easter. The word Easter also has associations with Eostre, the Germanic goddess of the spring. The new season marked the time of planting and new crop cycle. In a world that lived much closer to nature than we do now and where life and death depended on the fertility of your soil and livestock, appeasing the deities was vital. If you didn't make the right offering, a god could be offended and withdraw their blessing.

In our modern world, we no longer appease the gods of nature – we have created our own nature. If apples fail in England, we buy them from South Africa or France. Strawberries, tomatoes, grapes and avocadoes are now plentiful throughout the year. For most of us winter snow is a mere inconvenience – our cosy, centrally heated homes see to that. Reservoirs and our water agencies ensure that long, dry summers (remember those?) do not end in cropdevastating droughts. Yet in taking for granted our modern lifestyles, have we lost something?

The Christian Church challenges us to view our lives through the lens of eternity. It will hold its most important celebration at the end of this month and the beginning of next – Easter. During the final weeks of March, we will retell the story of how a young, outspoken teacher in a small outpost of the Roman Empire was hounded to death as a matter of political expediency. A sad story that has many echoes for us now in the stories of those such as Thomas More. Dietrich Bonhoeffer and Ken Saro-Wiwa to name but a few. But where the Christian story differs is in what happened 3 days after Jesus was put to death. In a world-changing event that no one at the time saw coming, Jesus Christ overcame death and returned to life - an event known as the Resurrection. This event means that Christians no longer need to live in fear of the capricious gods of nature, but can now live in friendship with the one God of the whole universe.

Afterwards, one girl who had been concentrating very hard throughout, declared to me that she was going to pick up litter every day during Lent – my heart was warmed to hear that, and I praised her – acts of kindness can replicate and spread.

I wonder what you and I might embrace this Lent?

The most important thing we can do in order to prepare ourselves before almighty God, is to admit how we might be in need of him in our lives, how often we shut him out, and soldier on alone, and how much better our lives are with him at the centre.

If home life is busy, or you fancy a change of scenery, then perhaps you can set time aside with God by going for a walk, a bus or car journey to somewhere peaceful for a period of quiet contemplation, or pop around and spend some time doing so with a likeminded friend.

My hope and prayers are that you will find that place of quiet contemplation this Lent and give the Lord the space to speak words of love, peace and reassurance in your hearts and lives.


