





#### Factoid #22

**Co-Option -** Councillors may resign from the Council before their term of office is up. A notice is then published to see if Parishioners want to hold a by-election. If this does not happen then the Parish Council can co-opt new Councillors onto the Council. This means that they can be appointed without an election — but they have to explain to existing Councillors why they want to join them.

Where does one start this month - it's got to be Napfest.

What a perfect weekend. The weather was so kind to us, the RAF and Napfest Crew were so organised, it all came together to create 3 days of wonderful village life. We'd like to thank everyone involved for a really fantastic weekend - and let's hope everyone who attended was really generous so that our Village Hall and Thames Air Ambulance benefitted as well.

Now back down to business. Work has started in the background on the redevelopment of Templewood play area. The team of parent volunteers mentioned last month have been "deputised" into the Council's Playground working group and have carried out a ground survey to measure the site. The next step is to produce some possible designs to share with the local community and get a feel for what we would all like to see in the space. The intention is to do this over the summer so that a formal design can be submitted to Full Council in September after the summer recess.

At June's Council meeting we approved some drainage connection work for a local resident that will mean a small amount of disruption at the top of Vincents Meadow. As the responsible landowner for Vincents Meadow we want to assure residents that all due diligence has been undertaken and that the works will make the minimum of disruption to the Meadow (we anticipate the footpath at the top end (opposite to Downley Road entrance) will only have to be slightly rerouted for a matter of a day. All works will be made good and the fencing which borders with the resident will be made better than it is currently. Thames Water will also take on full responsibility for the drain connection after it has been made. Making the connections here means that there is far less disruption to locals as the alternative was to dig up Louches Lane.

Another item that was discussed at June's Council meeting was the current situation with the Weight Restrictions that are to be placed on Stocking Lane and Clappins Lane. We have been waiting for over three years now for these signs to be put in place to stop or at least discourage larger vehicles from using these narrow lanes. Cllr Williams has put together

a detailed summary of what has happened (or rather what has not happened) with the authorities involved. A number of people have already emailed their support to the Council to ensure that these restrictions are put in place. Please contact us and/ or the Parish Clerk if you would like a copy of the summary and would like to let us know your views on this matter - it will all help when we confront those responsible and hold them to account.

Finally, we would like to introduce a newcomer to our little band of NAWA Councillors, who was co-opted at our last meeting. A new resident of Woodcock, Walters Ash, we have asked Victoria to introduce herself.

I am delighted to be welcomed as a Councillor for Naphill and Walter's Ash, as a part of a well established team. Having spent my formative years growing up in Hughenden Valley, I feel incredibly lucky to still be living in this wonderful area, just up the hill! As a lead teacher in the non-selective sector, I am dedicated to the life chances of young people. I am particularly keen to support the ongoing efforts regarding free to use facilities for young people; the Templewood playground in particular. The recent NapFest demonstrated what an incredible place this is to live, with hugely supportive residents. I will look forward to meeting many more members of our community in the near future.

We are looking forward to easing her into the role (who are we kidding !!). It's great to have another person representing our ward - it worth mentioning there is room for one more still.

#### **Growing Your Own**

In July it is not too late to sow watercress seeds. Long reputed to be a "super-food", rich in calcium, iron and vitamins A, C and E it is believed to be anticarcinogenic. It used to be grown on a vast scale in chalk streams and it is still grown commercially in Dorset and Hampshire. The British are among the biggest consumers in the world and with that popularity UK production is on the increase. But you don't have to construct a Heath-Robinson system to give running water over a gravel bed in your garden. Seeds are now available for growing watercress in the absence of running water. I have been growing such watercress for many years. Initially I transplanted seedlings outdoors into garden soil but rapidly found that they would grow best in my tomato bed in the greenhouse. There they are growing in near 100% well-rotted farmyard manure - a very good source of all the 19 trace elements we need to consume every day. The watercress plants grow like weeds and are quite happy covering the soil underneath the tomato plants. One has to be quite ruthless at times in removing handfuls and putting them on the compost heap. They grow all the year round and provide a delicious salad crop which is appreciated even more in the winter months. It is effectively a perennial since, as its shoots grow across the soil they put down fresh roots every 5 inches or so which enable it to march onwards. To harvest the watercress just nip off the leading 3 inches of the shoot and that "pruning" will cause the plant to push out several completely new shoots near the wound. If left tiny white flowers appear, followed by seeds which germinate in any area cleared of watercress. Thus your first seed packet will be your last. A self-perpetuating "super-food" available for cropping all the year round and which tastes delicious. One of the best vegetables I have ever grown.

In July in the garden or on the allotment one can continue to sow succession plants such as radishes, coriander and tiny turnips, and salad plants such as lamb's lettuce, Mizuna, claytonia and Chinese "green in snow" mustard for winter crops. Early July is the best time to sow Florence fennel. This is very difficult to grow since if the weather is cold in August and September the plants will not have enough time to produce their delicious swollen bulbs, and if the weather is too hot and dry the plants will bolt. Thus Florence fennel is a gamble on the weather.

As for cropping, July is the month of abundance where one reaps the benefit of all that work earlier in the year. In particular soft fruit such as raspberries, Josta berries, Tayberries and gooseberries are available in profusion. Hooray!





We also hope that you enjoyed 'The Lost Pubs of Naphill': a walk led by Marian Miller on Tuesday 26th June.

On Wednesday 8th August the expert naturalist John Tyler will lead a 'Mini-beast Safari' on Naphill Common, staring from the Village Hall at 2pm. It is aimed at all ages, but especially children. So, anyone interested in our smaller wildlife, put on your walking shoes or boots and join us for a pleasant and informative ramble.

Our walks also continue as usual. The short walks generally involve the Common and they are between 2-3 miles, led by Chris Miller starting at 10.30am from the Village Hall on the first Wednesday of each month. The longer walks are led by Ron Collins and are about 5 miles, generally some distance from Naphill. Join Ron on the third Monday of each month; meeting at the Village Hall at 9.25am for a prompt start at 9:30am. Members and non-members are equally welcome. These are the usual arrangements, but as there is sometimes a need to make changes it would be wise to consult our website, posters or the two leaders to confirm the details.

The Common is slowly healing after the latest round of felling. We hope to see the ruts smoothed out and the grasses and other vegetation begin to recover. As well as being part of the Chilterns Area of Outstanding Beauty, our common is also a Site of Special Scientific Interest, Grade 1: which means that we, and Natural England, have a duty to protect and enhance its quality as a natural habitat. The rich mixture of ancient and young trees and a ground flora, untouched by agriculture, and the numerous ponds should mean that it is home to very wide range of plant and animal species. At present it is not doing too badly, but there is enormous scope for improvement. The Friends of Naphill Common are determined to help it on its way. Join us if you would like to be a part of the project.

#### **Chiltern Hills Arboriculture**

By the time you are reading this we should be at the end of the logging works on Naphill Common. It has taken a while, and the particularly wet winter has not helped. There has been disruption, but as arboricultural colleagues, we can appreciate that the weather is not always our friend. I sent an email to David, the MD of Wessex Woodland Management, the contractors carrying out the works, enquiring about the programme, progress and completion dates for the work. I received this reply:

Dear Mike.

The harvesting and mulching ops have all been completed. I still need to get a digger in to deal with the ruts which will happen next week.

Unfortunately the wet weather has prolonged this operation much longer than anticipated.

The timber is moving slowly but I hope it will all be gone in the next month or so.

Please accept my apologies for the inconvenience caused.

I got photos of the track before we started and will assess any damage when we finish and make good any reparations that are needed.

I have read a number of comments on the Facebook page about the logging. For clarity, the logging is an essential part of woodland maintenance. "Crowded" trees do not flourish. The longer lengths of timber go for planking, but the shorter lengths are only sent for cutting into firewood. It has not been an exercise executed for financial gain, but more for good forestry with a return to cover costs.

This is good to hear. All of us who live on the service roads behind the Black Lion and the allotments woods, or in the woods are delighted to have the inconvenience removed

#### A Point of View

There has been a lot of discussion recently on the role of the Chilterns AONB and the limited powers it has to defend against the extensive building threats which exist under the government's pledge to build more houses at any cost, even allowing some loss of Green Belt protection. A new recent initiative has been to reconsider the protected areas classification and raise it to the status of a National Park. Such an improved protection order has been achieved by

the South Downs, previously an AONB and the New Forest in Hampshire. It would make particular sense in this current period of local government re-organisation creating one planning authority for the whole of the AONB and not fragmented amongst the Local Plans of three counties and five district councils.

The Unitary Authority decision has been further frustrated by the recent change of Secretary of State for the Environment and Local Government. We have to wait now for the new minister to acquaint himself with the complicated facts of the case, especially as the four District councils have now challenged the original recommendation to create one authority for the existing county council, by suggesting that we should have two. Let's hope that the decision, originally promised for last Christmas and then Easter is not further delayed.

Naphill Common is in a sorry state and most paths are now unwalkable due to the recent wood clearance. I know that the winter weather and the excessive rain made things difficult but I had hoped that by now the paths and bridleways would have been cleared and walkable. I am sure the open appearance of the Common is a great improvement and I for one applaud it, especially as the open appearance replicates what it was like when I was boy! My concern is that without grazing it will soon revert back to a dense holly woodland.

Recently, I was privileged to join with the Lord Mayor of London on his annual inspection of the City's woodland at Burnham Beeches. It really is beautifully maintained by a herd of English white cattle. They cannot stray out of the grazing area defined by a buried wire which activates a mild shock to the animal via its collar. A really ingenious system which the cows quickly learn and is very effective in controlling them. The public are free to visit Burnham Beeches all the year round and in the summer months it is a delightful place with dogs allowed on leads. The cattle are very docile! Perhaps our Commons Committee could put the idea on their agenda for a future meeting?

# Letter from Bradenham Vicarage Starry, starry nights

July 17th heralds the start of one of the most eagerly anticipated events in my annual calendar. No, I am not talking about the school holidays. I am talking the Perseids. What on earth are the Perseids you ask? Well......they're not exactly on earth. The Perseids is an annual meteor shower that starts on 17th July and continues all the way through to the 24th August, so you have plenty of time to watch out for them.

Made of tiny space debris from the comet Swift-Tuttle, the Perseids are named after the constellation Perseus. This is because the direction, or radiant, from which the shower seems to come in the sky lies in the same direction as the constellation Perseus. which can be found in the north-eastern part of the sky. Look between the radiant, which will be in the north-east part of the sky, and the zenith (the point in the sky directly above you). While the skies are lit up several times a year by other meteor showers, the Perseids are widely sought after by astronomers and stargazers. This is because, at its peak, one can see, from a dark place, 60 to 100 meteors in an hour. This year, the peak is due around 9-13th August and viewing should be especially good on the night of 12-13th August as a new moon will ensure dark skies.

The Perseids can be seen throughout the Northern Hemisphere, so even if you are on holiday, why not plan a star party. Mosey on down to the beach and look out to sea, or go for a night time walk. If you can, take a flask of hot chocolate (or whatever is your preferred beverage) and some chocolate chip cookies or buy fish and chips and eat them on

the beach watching the sky. The BBC now often announces the main meteor showers in its weather forecasts, so listen out for when conditions may be at their best. Do remember to take safety precautions – you know the stuff – let people know where you are going, check the tides etc.

We have a long-standing romance with shooting stars. Legend has it that if you wished upon a shooting star the wish would come true. In Pinocchio, Jiminy Cricket sings:

When you wish upon a star
Makes no difference who you are
Anything your heart desires
Will come to you
If your heart is in your dream
No request is too extreme
When you wish upon a star
As dreamers do

Whenever I hear that song, it never fails to conjure up childhood memories of Saturday cinema or family Christmas TV viewing. But our romance with shooting stars goes back way further in time. It is believed to have originated in Ancient Greece, when the Greek astronomer Ptolemy, around AD 127-151, wrote that the Gods occasionally, out of curiosity, peered down at the Earth from between the spheres. When this happened stars sometimes slipped through the gap, becoming visible as shooting stars. It was thought that because the Gods were already looking at us, they would be more receptive to any wishes we made!

Our knowledge of what makes shooting stars and the fabric of the heavens has moved on from that of Ptolemy, but our fascination with space has never diminished. The Bible is full of references to the stars and the night sky or heavens. Over a thousand years before Ptolemy, in Genesis 1:1, the very first words of the Bible are 'In the beginning, God created the heavens....' There are some 190 occasions when the word 'heavens' is used in the Bible, along with over 125 reference to stars or moon. The writers of the Bible really loved their astronomy. Some of the most beautiful and uplifting references are in the Psalms. My favourite is Psalm 8:

When I consider your heavens,
the work of your fingers,
the moon and the stars,
which you have set in place,
what is mankind that you are mindful of them,
human beings that you care for them?
You have made them a little lower than the angels
and crowned them with glory and honour.

Psalm 8:3-5

The Psalmist reflects on the sheer majesty of the heavens and then looks to humanity. In the face of all that vastness and beauty, how insignificant is humanity. The answer to that thought is that humanity is just short of the angels and very significant in God's sight. The God who is capable of making the heavens personally cares for you and me, so much so that He sent his Son, Jesus, to teach us how to live in relationship with him.

So when you are out enjoying your star party or just remembering that there's something about meteors going on over the next few weeks, when you look out on the skies, think about the words of the Psalmist and be awed:

The heavens declare the glory of God;

the skies proclaim the work of his hands.

Psalm 19:1

May you know God's blessing and encounter His love at this beautiful time of year.

#### **Letter from Sir David Lidington MP**

There could not have been better weather for the Naphill fete on 9 June and it was great to see so many people at the Crick. I liked the twin themes: celebrating both the 90th anniversary of the village hall and the centenary of the Royal Air Force. Having as local MP attended many different meetings at the hall over the last 26 years, I know how important it is as a community asset - and of course the history of Naphill and Walters Ash in the 20th and 21st centuries is intimately connected with that of the RAF.

The book stall in the marquee was as well stocked as ever. It was good to catch-up on the work of local organisations like Hughenden Street Association and it was both funny and touching to see burly RAF PT instructors take such care over supervising the infants' egg and spoon races.

In local politics, we are waiting for the new Communities Secretary, James Brokenshire, to take his decision about unitary local government in Bucks. I'm in no doubt that a move to a unitary system makes sense. In my experience very few constituents understand exactly the division of responsibilities between County and District Councils (e.g. the District collects our rubbish but the County runs recycling and waste disposal).

There've been strong campaigns for both one and for two unitary authorities to replace the present County Council and four District Councils. Anyone wanting more detail on the different cases can look at the County Council and Wycombe District websites respectively.

There are arguments both ways. The Districts argue that two Councils would allow for greater local accountability. The County points out that the financial savings to council taxpayers from a single council would be significantly greater than those from two, and that links between the local NHS and council social services are managed at a County-wide level and it would be foolish to break them up. My own preference, having looked at the arguments in some detail, is for a single authority but I've also met people whose views I respect who have on balance come down in favour of two. I think it's important to have a decision as soon as possible so that council staff and local taxpayers can have some certainty about the future.

#### **Bradenham Parish Council**

We held our Annual Parish Meeting in May. The chairman thanked the National Trust and the RAF for their support during the year. Last year's work was mainly centred on maintaining the council's assets, which will continue this year. There is some evidence that the MVAS is reducing vehicles' speed. The grass cutting services which have been devolved from Buckinghamshire County Council are carried out by Princes Risborough Town Council.

Dog waste in the parish continues to be a problem and at the ordinary meeting it was decided to purchase a dog waste bin, providing National Trust permission is obtained. The removal of the recycling bins at New Road has reduced fly tipping.

The minor roads in the parish are deteriorating badly and require major work, the parish council has been working on this for years with little progress, but we keep going.

Teif Jones was elected Chairman for the 4th Year at our Annual Parish Council meeting and Paul Oborn was elected Vice Chairman.

At the ordinary meeting the council agreed to carry out a litter pick in the verge along Bradenham Woods Lane later this year. Councillor Richard Langridge will organise this. More details to follow.

The parish council did not object to planning application 18/05783/FUL, Timber Yard, erection of canopy (retrospective), but did comment that it would like to see it painted in a colour that blended in.

Buckinghamshire County Council is responsible for drain clearance and they have now done some drain clearance on New Road, which seems to help with the flooding we have had there. The drains in Bradenham are blocked frequently due to the road run off and the council is going to investigate paying themselves to have them cleared.

WDC Planning "Malpractice". Hogtrough Barn 18/05342/CLE. Certificate of Lawfulness decision. 2 senior politicians have looked at the evidence from witnesses adjacent to Hogtrough Smallholdings and Louches Lane and have independently questioned the validity of WDC Legal Planning procedures. One politician has described them as "malpractice". The most senior of the politicians is writing directly to WDC Planning expressing his concerns. Both have advised the witnesses on further measures to take.

# Battle Resumes to Save 5.6 acres of our Green Belt at Clappins Lane

Planning Inspector, Nicola Gulley MA MRTPI has been appointed by the Secretary of State to independently examine the soundness of the new Wycombe District Local Plan policies. Green Belt policies and RUR7 (the WDC policy to remove GB protection from 5.6 acres of Smith's Field off Clappins Lane to permit housing development) have been allocated specific times for examination by the Inspector. All those who sent in written responses about the Local Plan to WDC by 27th November will have received all the necessary information about the Examination from Programme Officer Ian Kemp who can be contacted on 01527 861 711 (Landline) or 0772 300 9166 (Mobile) or by email at idkemp@icloud.com.

A representative of the Residents Association Clappins Field subcommittee has been booked to attend and speak at the all-day session on Green Belt on Thursday 26th July, and at the Rural Areas session on Thursday 6th September when RUR7 among twelve RUR policies will be examined. Further updates in July Gazette.

**Unitary Authorities.** We were told that local government expenditure was so high within Bucks that the County and 4 District Councils were going to be abolished and a Single Unitary Authority, centred at Aylesbury, would be imposed on us. This would

save millions the County Council said. The 4 District Councils said, "No!" They argued that residents of Bucks would be much better served by two smaller Unitary Councils, even if less money would be saved. One smaller Unitary would be formed from merger of Wycombe, Chiltern and South Bucks District Councils and the other formed by the existing Aylesbury Vale District Council. A large part of the savings would be made by drastically reducing the number of District and County staff and a great many District and County Councillors.

From the enquiries I made it seems most people, including Councillors, were not provided with enough information by either Districts or County to say which choice, (one or two unitary councils), would serve their local area best, so could not exercise their democratic right by 25th May to inform the Secretary of State of their choice. In local discussions the observation, "It went over most people's heads" was widely expressed.

Bucks MPs have been sent copies of the request made of SoS James Brokenshire, as have the 4 District Councils. At Napfest I spoke to our MP David Lidington and requested that he contact SoS James Brokenshire personally to ask for a delayed decision, until Bucks residents are properly informed of the details of the changes.

Whether the Secretary of State will take note of such requests will become apparent in the near future.


