The prolonged period of dry weather has been a treat for some and a growing pain for gardeners. With a large area of the Common churned up like a ploughed field the lack of rain has been something of a blessing. Now that most, if not all, of the footpaths and bridleways have been marked out by Wessex Woodland Management's bulldozer we have to wait to see how the vegetation recovers.

This is important. The Common was designated as a Site of Special Sientific Interest Grade 1 partly because its soil and vegetation had not been disturbed by ploughing at least since the Iron Age. The ancient earthwork near Dew Pond is thought to be the remains of a farming community who probably ploughed and grazed the land, perhaps 2000 years ago. It seems that it became open grassland dotted with trees — mainly oaks and beech. It evolved slowly while being grazed by cattle and sheep.

Marian Miller has unearthed a delightful description written in 1863 by someone who walked up from West Wycombe: 'Who, in the midst of corn-fields, chalk, flints, and hollow beech-woods, would expect to come on so lovely and wild a spot, on one side of the estate, as Naphill Common? Heather, juniper bushes, and fine oak trees thickly interspersed, and sweet greensward, give the Common all the appearance of an ancient chase; and at every turn the wanderer almost expects to see the antlers of a deer, or if in summer, the graceful doe and fawn grazing in the dewy glades.' Once grazing stopped in about the 1920s the changes accelerated: gorse, juniper and bracken began to overtake the grasses and they in turn gave way to bushes and trees.

The recent felling has changed the soil surface in some areas but has also let in more light. The hope

is that the seeds left in the soil and the surrounding vegetation will heal the wounds. The third phase of felling, planned to start this autumn, will not help. The Friends of Naphill Common has an enormous task ahead to return the Common to a condition where it deserves its SSSI designation.

Meanwhile our activities continue. Both adults and children are welcome to join John Tyler and his Minibeast Safari on Wednesday 8th August, starting from the Village hall at 2 pm. You are also welcome to join with the Bucks Fungus Group who will visit the Common on 21st October. Details to follow. Our guided walks are open to all. The short walks generally involve the Common and they are between 2-3 miles, led by Chris Miller starting at 10.30am from the Village Hall on the first Wednesday of each month. The longer walks are led by Ron Collins and are about 5 miles, generally some distance from Naphill. Join Ron on the third Monday of each month; meeting at the Village Hall at 9.25am for a prompt start at 9:30am. Members and non-members are equally welcome (but as there is sometimes a need to make changes it would be wise to consult our website, posters or the two leaders to confirm the details).

The final reckoning shows that our silent auction at the Naphill Festival raised no less than £2,357, thanks to many generous donations. We will donate £1,250 of this to the Village Hall, leaving £1,107 for FONC to spend wisely. Any suggestions?

Chiltern Hills Arboriculture

So, with the hot weather upon us, it feels important to keep our grass and plants well hydrated (hosepipe bans not withstanding).

The best time of day to water is late evening once the sun has gone down and the air is cooler. Watering through the heat of the day will just result in surface evaporation, the hydration not reaching the roots of your plants and lawns, and the whole effort being wasted.

Having said that, it is important not to over water. If you grow tomato plants, and your ripe fruits are showing signs of cracking in their skins, this is a sign of over watering, or inconsistent watering. Plants like the "little and often" approach. Over watering or "binge" watering can result in root rot, yellow leaves, and leaf roll (top most leaves turning inwards and upwards, leaving leaves firm, rigid, or crumbly). This condition tends to happen overnight, but does not necessarily mean the death of your harvest.

Down on the allotments, hose pipes are not an option. I tend to look at watering the veg, using cans, as an aerobic exercise alternative to gym membership. It's like lifting weights and using the treadmill at the same time.

If your lawn turns brown, and appears to die off during July and August, worry not. I remember back to the days of my youth. The 'baking' summer of 1976. Temperatures hit record highs, for record durations. On top of this we had the hosepipe ban. Our back garden looked like the outback of Northern Queensland, Australia by early September..... and still the grass was lush and green the following spring.

My advice. Enjoy the weather while it lasts. The rain will be back soon enough.

Growing Your Own

If you were to ask me, of my 45 years of growing fruit and vegetables in my garden and on my allotment, which was the most difficult year I would have replied without hesitation, 2018. If you recall, we had fairly incessant rain from January to early May, accompanied by very cold conditions. I normally sow carrot seed at the end of March, but by the end of April the soil was still sodden and cold. I knew that if I sowed small seeds they would lie there and rot without germinating.

Then, after a week of May, we had an abrupt change of climate to sunny, warm and dry. I sowed two rows of carrots and other small seeds, then had the opposite problem. They germinated but were immediately in danger of being frazzled by the intense sun and complete lack of rain. So I had to water just to keep them alive!! I never have to do that!! Usually my soil contains lots of water-retentive material and occasional rain helps a lot. At the time of writing I have heard that this hot dry period will go on through July and August and into September, albeit with the odd short period of


rain from time to time. Also, in the south-east of the UK, in June we had 5% of the normal rainfall and it might have been the driest June on record!! That shows how difficult a period it has been when trying to grow your own.

At the time of writing I am ever more grateful for 45 years of applying copious quantities of farmyard manure to my allotment and garden. In addition to valuable trace elements, it has added vast quantities of humus and fibre, which has made my soil very moisture-retentive. The soil level of my allotment has risen 6 to 9 inches compared to the paths both sides. In the past I had an annual load of 4.5 tons of farmyard manure but these days, seeing as my allotment soil is so rich, I have half of a 1.25-ton load, and apply it just where I think I need it most.

Even though I have such wonderful soil, that soil cannot cope with very hot dry conditions where the top couple of inches dries out like dust. I sow seeds by firstly creating a groove with my ridging tool, filling the groove with water, sowing the seeds, then putting dry soil on top and tamping down. If I then have to water for reasons given above I am causing roots to prefer to grow upwards where the water is, rather than down into the permanently-damp soil underneath. I know that watering is all wrong but I have to do it otherwise the seeds would be frazzled. What a dilemma!

Chairmans Report

On Monday July 2nd. The village hall committee meeting was held. Various items were discussed, among them funding for the new playground equipment. I reported that I had attended Hughenden Parish council finance committee meeting as we had applied for a grant to help us buy some more playground equipment that had been condemned and removed, after some discussion the village hall was given a grant of £5000 but with a couple of provisions, that we match fund the amount and organise events to raise £5000. Also, to provide an invoice for the equipment by 31st. March 2019. Some ideas were put forward for fundraising but it would be good if some of the mums and dads whose children use the playground would become involved, so if you have some ideas and can help, please email me at the village hall website.

The roof was also discussed and although the new flat roof was completed and is watertight there is still a small leak from either the veranda or kitchen roofs where they join over Bon Ami. The problem of finding the source of the leak is this great weather we are having at the moment, it has not rained since Napfest and trying to find the leak with a hosepipe does not identify it. So, we await the rain!

A safeguarding policy was approved for the village hall after some minor amendments and we are moving forward with the new health and safety policy. To apply for some of the grants that may be available, the village hall needs to include a dissolution clause in the constitution of the village hall, this clause has to be approved by the committee and then adopted at the AGM when the public can attend. As the constitution says that the trustees only hold the village hall and playing fields in trust for the people of the village of Naphill the clause will identify what happens in the event of the village hall not being able to continue to operate.

The village hall buildings and contents insurance was renewed at the beginning of June and the amounts were increased on both buildings and contents to reflect present day values and this resulted in an extra premium, so the total was £3,400.

The decision was taken to renew the software licence for the village hall booking system and this cost £180.

Some trustees have expressed concern at the level of responsibility that is implicit in being a trustee and one possible solution is for the village hall to have a smaller management committee of trustees to meet monthly for decision making then a larger meeting for all stakeholders that would take place quarterly. All villagers are welcome to express their views on this.

As Napfest was more of an event than usual, the financial result has not been finalised to date as there are still some bills to pay and monies to come in but we seem to have had a bumper year. A brilliant outcome from Linda Clark and the Napfest committee with loads of help from the RAF.

T: And I'm in the back corner doing sound. That was also quite hard because we had to make the sound effects come in at the right time.


O: Everyone had to learn their lines, dance moves and song lyrics and it was hard work, especially in the heat. I have always enjoyed acting and felt really proud performing.

Reflections on two summer fetes

The festival of Eid, marking the end of the fasting month of Ramadan, is one of the most important of the Muslim year. Eid is looked forward to and celebrated by our local Muslim communities in Aylesbury and High Wycombe along with their fellow-believers around the world.

In the last few years, the Aylesbury mosque has made a big effort to invite people from all religious traditions and communities in the town to join in their celebrations. A little while ago, I was delighted to join friends from the mosque and beyond in cutting the cake for the Eid Fayre, an event that's rapidly becoming an annual feature of the Aylesbury events calendar.

What I really like is how the Eid Fayre blends two great celebratory traditions: Eid, with its significance to Muslims, and the English love of summer fetes and fayres. I actually went to both the Eid Fayre and the Speen village fete on the same day (and just caught the end of the Risborough festival too!) and was struck by the similarities. 
