

At the committee meeting on the 2nd. March the forthcoming AGM was discussed and the chairman's position will be the first to be filled. This is a change from normal as the committee usually elects the chairman at the May meeting. The new chairman will then, at the AGM, conduct the meeting to fill the other seven positions on the new trustee committee.

We have now updated the CCTV system with a new control box that will now be able to be accessed remotely. The play area has had its yearly inspection and there were no major items to be dealt with, mainly some new kickboards and extra bark under the swings and slide. This will be done in the next month. With the arrival of travellers in Princes Risborough recently the car park gates have been locked to deter the travellers from descending on the car park and crick. It is great that Claire and Mark have been keeping an eye on the situation and closing them when necessary. A big thank you for doing that! There was a hiring of the hall one Friday night and there were some problems. The committee would like to remind anyone thinking of hiring the hall that we do not take bookings for parties for children over 12 and adults under 24.

The fundraising events are being organised with Napfest being the first one on 12th. 13th. and 14th. June. The marquee has been booked and stall arrangements are going well with lots of activities included. The WI is providing teas and the Mens Club is running the bar. There will be a Food and Wine festival on the crick on the 25th. July.

The Cheese and Wine event on the 21st. February was a great success with 94 people attending. A big thank you to Cathryn and her team, with Ron, Judy, Nina, and David all helping to make the evening a success, a total of £1375 was raised. The cheese came from Waitrose who gave us a generous discount and supported the evening with donations.

We are as concerned about coronavirus as all of you will be. At the moment we are discussing the possibility of using the hall for childcare if the schools are going to be shut for a long period. If you feel the hall can be used in another helpful way in this difficult time let us know and we will try to help.

### **Hughenden Parish Council**



#### **Parish Council Elections**

With the developing situation around Coronavirus, the government took the decision on Friday 13th March 2020 to postpone the elections due to be held in May 2020 for twelve months. This included Parish Council Elections and they will not now take place until May 2021.

#### What does this mean?

With the elections being postponed, the Parish Council will shortly issue Casual Vacancy Notices to recruit new councillors. Currently the Council has five councillors out of a required fifteen. In Naphill and Walters Ash Ward there is currently only one councillor out of a potential four. The Casual Vacancy Notices will cover all four wards of the parish.

#### How will this work?

The Council will publish notices advertising Casual Vacancies. This starts the process and allows ten electors of the parish to call that an election be held to fill the vacancies. There is no form of words for this request, it can simply be a letter headed with such words as "We the undersigned being electors for Hughenden Parish, call for an election to fill the vacancy". It is helpful if the ten signatures are accompanied by printed names, addresses and electoral numbers from the current electoral register. This request is sent to the Returning Officer of the Principal Authority and must be received within fourteen days of the notice being issued, computed in accordance with the election rules. The election must then be held within sixty days of the date of the notice of the Casual Vacancy.

If no request is received, then, after the expiry of the fourteen-day period, the Council shall co-opt a person to fill the vacancy as soon as is practicable.

#### Who can be a Parish Councillor?

A person is qualified to be elected and to be a councillor if they are a British, Commonwealth, Irish or (European Union citizen until December 2020) and on the relevant day (that is, the day of nomination or election) they are 18 or over. In addition, the person must meet at least one of the following criteria:

- 1. on the relevant day and thereafter they continue to be on the electoral register for the parish, or
- 2. during the whole of the twelve months before that day they have owned or tenanted land or premises in the parish, or
- 3. during the whole of the twelve months before that day their principal or only place of work has been in the parish, or
- 4. during the whole of the twelve months before that day they have resided in the parish or within three miles of it. Except for qualification (1), these qualifications then continue for the full term of office, until the next ordinary elections.

Certain people are disqualified from standing, and these include paid officers (including the Clerks) of the council, bankrupts and those subject to recent sentences of imprisonment.








### Naphill & Walter's Ash Residents Association

On 1 April 2020 the new Buckinghamshire Council unitary authority will replace the debt-ridden Bucks County Council and all five District Councils, Aylesbury Vale, Chiltern, South Bucks, and our own Wycombe District Council, after the preferred choice of two unitary authorities, north and south Bucks, was rejected by central government. We are told changes will happen gradually, so for the present we should continue our contacts with Planning and Highway Depts as before. Parish Councils will be expected to take on more local assignments if they are in a position to do so.

**Cancellation.** We regret the Biennial Meeting 30th March on Scams and Cons has to be postponed due to the risk from coronavirus.

**Drug taking**. At the NAG meeting Police reported that as illegal drug dealing was so widespread and taking place in public village car parks, as well as HPC's, they are aiming to look at public car parks in the Parish two or three times per week.

**Community Speed Watch.** More volunteers please. CSW is carried out more than once a month in other Hughenden Parish villages to control traffic speeds. With more volunteers in N & WA we could match their efforts using the first-rate Sentinel recorder. CSW requires minimum of 2 volunteers, (preferably 3 with at least one man), observing Main Road speeds for just an hour at a time. Please ring me for more information.

**Pavement Parking Stickers.** Wheelchair users often have great difficulty, or are unable to get past cars parked on pavements, forcing them to move out on to the road, which is very dangerous. There will soon be warning notices available to stick on pavement-parked cars. Wheelchair users and mothers with wide buggies please contact me to obtain these.

**Environmental Protection.** The Residents Assn. would welcome new committee members who want to collaborate in protecting the interests of local residents and safeguarding the environment of our two villages and the surrounding countryside. Meetings at the Village Hall only take a couple of hours a month (apart from August). My position as Hon. Secretary, which is best shared between two people, is open to new candidates. Do please ring for more details.

### **Friends of Naphill Naphill Common**



A very wet spring is blossoming on the Common. The popular paths are thick with mud and the ponds are larger than for many years. If we count Mannings pond as being on Naphill Common rather than Downley, there are eight ponds on our Common – in fact the recent unusually wet winter has produced at least one more small pond but it will probably disappear if/when the rain ceases.

So far there is frogspawn in six of the eight ponds; only Mannings and Lady Horse Pond have been neglected. The frogs seem to favour areas near the bank, clear of weeds. Our working parties have made more of this available. Perhaps it is a little early, but no toad spawn has yet been seen. Toads produce long strings of spawn: transparent jelly containing black eggs. Last year there was some laid amongst the floating sweetgrass on Dew Pond. Newts are busy moving into the ponds to breed. We have, if we are lucky, three species. The smallest is the Palmate Newt (Triturus helveticus), which is up to 109cms/31/2 inches long, and has no crest. It is found over most of Britain, excluding Ireland and parts of Lincolnshire. The Smooth Newt (Triturus vulgaris) reaches 11cms/4 ins long and is found all over the British Isles. In the breeding season the male develops a long crest down its back, from its neck to halfway down its tail, together with a reddish underside. Both species are found in most ponds.

The Great Crested or Warty newt (Triturus cristatus) is now declining seriously and is protected by law. It is almost 14cms/5½ inches long and the Male has a large crest along its back with a gap at the base of

the tail. It has an orange or yellow underside marked with black spots. Its tail is marked on the side by a whitish flash. A couple of our members are licensed to survey them and have found that we have them in at least two ponds. Property developers have to declare any possible damage to Great crested newts. Surveying Crested Newts is not easy: we can try to net them or set traps and release them when captured, but if none are captured that does not mean they are not in the pond. The answer is to take water samples and test for Great Crested Newt DNA.

Weather permitting our walks continue as usual. The short walks are led by Chris Miller and generally involve the Common and they are between 2-3 miles, starting at 10.30am from the Village Hall on the first Wednesday of each month. The longer walks are led by Ron Collins and are about 5 miles, generally some distance from Naphill. Join Ron on the third Monday of each month; meeting at the Village Hall at 9.25am for a prompt start at 9:30am. Members and non-members are equally welcome. Our working parties are now operating every Sunday (led by Peter Davis) and Thursday (led by Ron Collins) mornings, concentrating on footpath clearing and mowing respectively. For both the walks and working parties, these are the usual arrangements, but as there is sometimes a need to make changes it would be wise to consult our website, posters or the two walk leaders to confirm details.

#### **Growing Your Own**

Farmers put nitrogen, potassium and phosphorus on their land as the main fertilisers. These are in a form which is water-soluble so the fertilisers can be taken up by plant roots. Unfortunately that means the dissolved fertilisers run off into streams, rivers and eventually the sea. A lot of expensive fertiliser is thus wasted. Nitrogen fertiliser comes from the petrochemical industry. Potassium is mined in various parts of the world and there are ample supplies. The problem is phosphorus which is in very short supply, for example Europe has virtually none. The phosphorus comes from fish bones which fell to the bottom of the sea millions of years ago and changed into phosphate rock. Tectonic movements then brought the rock to the surface in a few parts of the world where it could be mined. It is then treated with sulphuric acid then ammonia to turn it into a compound suitable to be sold as fertiliser. The US Geological Survey of 2010 estimated that the world's reserves of phosphate rock were 16,000 million tons and consumption was 160 million tons per year, increasing every year as world population increased. The experts in this field predict that "peak phosphorus" when half the world's reserves have been used will occur in 2034, ie only 14 years from now. After that, the phosphate rock will be harder to mine since the more easily-extracted rock will have already been mined and the price will mount inexorably.

Phosphorus is in dispensable to all growing things, plants, insects, animals, humans so an absence of phosphorus means no life. We are using up the world's reserves of phosphate rock at an alarming rate and most of it ends up in the sea. If phosphate fertiliser is not applied to farmers' fields the soil will become impoverished and unable to produce adequate amounts of crops. So we have to use phosphorus sparingly since the future of the human race is at stake. I improved the amount of phosphorus in the soil of my allotment from 36 to 228 milligrams per kilogram of soil by the application of farmyard manure over many years and that is what you can do. Human manure used to be applied to land in various European countries. In this country 64% of sewage is applied to farmland, but mainly as a means of disposal since the sewage is contaminated with toxic lead, arsenic, mercury and cadmium. In Norway they are experimenting with phosphorus-rich urine being siphoned off from adapted toilets. In the USA a company has developed a process whereby bodies (very rich in phosphorus) can be composted and the process has been authorised in Washington State. If that catches on we may be able to add an "expression of wishes" to our wills directing that our compost should be applied to the petunias or the cabbages, giving a whole new meaning to "Growing Your Own".



### **Bird Song**

Birds singing in April and May is no mere avian frivolity. It's all about serious communication. The message is, I have built a relationship and a nest and I will defend it.

This is a most vulnerable time for birds, so what looks to us like skulking in the shrubbery is actually caution and can be the tell-tale signs of nesting.

So in spring before cutting hedges and pruning shrubs and trees, search through them for any indication of active nests. It is illegal to destroy or damage nests or eggs, so postpone pruning if you see any.

You may come across egg remnants on the ground, ejected after hatching, though the adult birds may well have carried these some distance from the nest, so as not to alert predators to the presence of young.







- (You may attend to collect and drop off prescriptions as usual provided that you are not self-isolating and do not have any Coronovirus symptoms at all)
- This is due to the need for us to triage every patient before booking an appointment, to ensure that nobody with Coronavirus symptoms attends the surgery.

### From a Local Emergency Service Worker

I'm sorry to write this but I am hoping that maybe if people knew what's going on for the emergency services you may take a step back and just try to be a little understanding on what it is like for us and put things into perspective. I can only do this from my view and from my sector.

This virus is scary, it scares us all. We in the emergency services cannot sit in our homes waiting for it to pass by, we need to be at work and help as many people as we possibly can. Our work force is being hit by the virus like everyone else and for myself this means I have to self-isolate at home so not to affect my wife and son.

My wife comes under the guidelines as high risk as she has had a respiratory condition for many years. When I get home the door is opened but she must leave the room while I go and wash again. We sit at different ends of the room and we now have to sleep in separate rooms. I cannot see my son either as I cannot risk passing anything onto them. We have older parents and some live many miles away so we cannot risk infecting them either.

This is now our life for the foreseeable future, I see my family briefly and make sure they are ok, regular temperature checks and so on but this is extremely hard on any relationship. I am lucky to have a very supportive wife who understands that there are no back up crews or other people who can just jump into our jobs. We need to be at work to help those out there.

Really, all I wish to say is that this is like nothing that's happened in our time. Yes, things could be done maybe better or faster but hind sight is a wonderful thing and we are where we are. Please take a big breath, this is going to be a long road and a hard road but we can make it easier by sticking together and helping each other where we can. Lockdown hasn't even started yet and things will get harder. Let's just help each other and do as the government are asking and hopefully we will all get through this. China is lifting isolations now, Italy is getting some good results now and these places have been on total lockdown for weeks. I hope everyone stays calm and safe. And just spare a minute to think of the workers who have no choice in this and are risking everything so life can get back to normal one day soon.

#### St Michaels & All Angels Bell Tower Restoration

I am writing this article just a few days after our Prime Minister told us that many of us will lose loved ones to coronavirus. In this context, you may ask "who cares about a leaking bell tower roof"?

The primary concern of the St Michael's church family is the community it serves. However, we are grateful for the privilege of worshiping in a historic building and acknowledge our responsibility to maintain it for future generations. Our challenge is to maintain a Grade II\* listed building while not detracting from our mission to enable all to follow Jesus Christ through living lives centred on him, loving our community and serving one another.

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) - the volunteers who manage the church - have agreed that we should invite bids for the restoration work, but there is a big difference between the balance of our bank account and the likely cost of the repairs. So, they have also decided to investigate if we can delay the work by erecting a temporary roof over the bell tower.

The St Michael's church family want to be there for our community. We have regular groups from toddlers to seniors, visit the housebound and run community events. Many of our church family are already working hard supporting local charities such as Wycombe Homeless Connection, One Can Trust and Lighthouse to name a few.

But the St Michael's building is also part of our shared community heritage. Church bells have been ringing out over Hughenden Park for over 500 years. How important is this to you? Do you think our plans should include saving the bells by repairing the bell tower roof?

### A Message from Hughenden Vicarage

Have you bought any Easter eggs yet this year? I don't need an excuse such as the Christian festival of Easter to eat chocolate, but we readily associate Easter eggs with this special event each year.

Perhaps you will exchange eggs with friends and family, buy eggs for your children, grandchildren, or godchildren. I wonder if you will be swayed by the promise of chocolate bliss on the outside packaging, a cute picture, or a free gift accompanying the egg.

Did you know that a child receives an average of 8.8 Easter eggs each year, in the United Kingdom – that's double the recommended calorie count for a week!

I can see recall as a young child feeling excited when staying over at my grandparents' house in the Sussex countryside, waking up Easter morning, and going on an Easter egg hunt with my sister in their garden. They found such difficult places to conceal the tempting prizes, that so often I gave up in frustration, hoping that they would feel sorry for me, and give me a clue, in order to satisfy my longing for chocolate, after I had eaten a good hearty breakfast, of course.

Easter is a time of celebration and joy for Christians as we retell the story of the last few days of the life of Jesus Christ on earth, culminating in his death on a cross on Good Friday, and his glorious resurrection on Easter Sunday. Eggs remind us of new birth, especially the new birth which Christians are able to share, by celebrating the empty tomb, which didn't contain Jesus' body on the 3rd day, because the bible tells us that he is alive and has risen!

I recently lead a group from our Church on pilgrimage to the Holy Land. We experienced a memorable 10 days together, walking through the walled city of Jerusalem, home to such an eclectic range of nationalities and faiths, the via dolorosa – the way of the cross, retracing the final few steps of Christ, bearing his cross, as he walked to his execution, on a hill, outside the city, dying for the sins of the whole world.

I found it so moving to walk in the footsteps of Christ himself, especially as we spent an unforgettable day on the shore of the Sea of Galilee. We celebrated Holy Communion on Ash Wednesday, marking the beginning of Lent, looking through the rushes, across the water to distant shores. We took a boat trip together, and marvelled afresh at stories of miraculous catches, storms being calmed, and Peter walking out towards Jesus on the water. As I gazed all around me, it found it quite easy to visualise our Lord in a boat himself, looking out across the same mountains.

However, we don't all need to journey to Israel to experience a sense of God's closeness in our lives, nor to identify with the life he chose, of self-sacrifice, limitless love, and a revolutionary message which is still counter-cultural to this day.

At the heart of the Easter message, the Son of God chose to take my place and yours at Golgotha, on the cross of shame and pain, dying in our place, so that you and I can share in the abundant life which can be found by putting our faith in him. That does not mean an end to our worries and challenges in life, however it does mean that we have a saviour who identifies with us intimately, because he lived on earth as a human being, and longs for the best for us.

So, whether or not you find yourself in Church this Easter, if you see an Easter Egg, I invite you to spend a moment to contemplate the invitation of new life which is offered to you personally through Jesus Christ.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed, hallelujah!

### Message from Padre Lacey - Luxury?

Did you give up anything for lent? Growing up as a Christian, lent meant giving up luxurys like sweets, chocolate or cakes. Many people use lent as a way of remembering Jesus' 40 days in the desert (careful not to get a typo there as that would be a very different experience!). It's also a way of preparing for Easter. Like advent is the countdown and preparation for Christmas, lent is used to prepare ourselves for remembering and celebrating the ultimate sacrifice of Jesus.

When Easter arrives, the celebration is markedly bigger because the abstention chosen can be broken and feasting commences! Last year my teenage son chose to give up all technology for lent! Credit to him, he managed it. I even thought it might last...could 40 days of 'cold turkey' break the habit, reliance and gorging on it? But, come Easter, it only took a week or so before he was back to 'pre-lent'. But, I know I'm like that too!

We are blessed to live in a society and culture where we can mostly have what we want, when we want it. This means things like treats and luxuries aren't really that any more. They become the normal. We become desensitised to amazing opportunities and resources that we have. I remember going to a Good Friday service when I was a teenager and hearing something which rocked my world.

I knew the Easter story. I had grown up learning about it. Seeing the pictures of Jesus on a cross in the children's Bibles, singing songs about it in church and hearing how important Jesus' death and resurrection was to the Christian faith. But at this particular service, my world was rocked by a graphic and physiological explanation of crucifixion. Suddenly, I was sensitised to something which had become normal to me. It was like tasting the first bite of chocolate cake having not consumed any for 40 days. The enormity of what Jesus had done for me became fresh and new to me. I could acknowledge afresh the opportunities and resources ahead of me because of His sacrifice.

What luxurys do we have in our life that we take for granted rather than celebrating...and have you explored afresh recently what Jesus' death and resurrection could mean to you?

### Find rest my soul...

'How!?' I hear you cry. 'How can we find rest or peace when the world seems to be going all a bit weird?' Our world is being shaken by an event which has triggered a sequence of events which are unprecedented, and we are experiencing something very alien to many of us. Our ability to pop out to see friends, to the shops, for a meal, go to school, travel places and do 'normal' life has been put on hold temporarily. Of course, there are the politics and medical advice involved, but, I don't know

about you, but I am feeling a slight wobble inside myself too. When all that is usually stable and firm begins to wobble and shake, inevitably we feel those effects.

On the final Sunday which we physically met as a congregation in March we looked at Psalm 62. I was reflecting on it in light of the fifth commandment, taking a Sabbath, a day of rest...and now, I think that Psalm speaks so much into what we are going through at the moment.

Here's something to do if you're limited to your house. Have a rummage, there must be a Bible somewhere... one of those small Gideon ones given to you at school, one which may have slipped into your bag from a hotel drawer, or that one which is still in it's box since Auntie June gave it to you on your baptism...or there's Bible Gateway online. Have a peak at Psalm 62. It starts:

'My soul finds rest in God alone; My salvation comes from Him. He is my rock and my salvation; He is my fortress, I shall never be shaken.'

I unashamedly believe in God and for me, during this time, I am loving the Psalms especially. They are written by this guy David who goes through quite some things in his life. And the Psalms are like a poetic, song-like journal of his praises and outright raging at God. Psalm 62, in particular, is written at a time when life around him is wobbly. He talks about being under assault and the realisation of our fragility as humans...I feel a bit like that now. But, and it's a big but, there is hope. David turns from looking at the wobbling world, and his own wobbling mind, to God who is his fortress, his firm foundation, his rock, his hope and his safety.

For you it may not be God, it might be friends who you keep in touch with in a different way, or finding routine, or motivation to do that hobby or exercise...reach out and find someone or something which is a foundation for you at this time. And if you're struggling, that's OK. There is hope because there is love. The community have created NAWA COVID support team\*, have a delve into the Psalms and have a chat to God about things and I'm here as well as the Padre\*\* but I will also be running church in a different way (for more information please do give me a ring). As we move into this time of weirdness, we will all have wobbles...but when we wobble there are people and places we can reach out to which can bring us hope and stability.

### Saint Botolph's Church, Bradenham - From the Vicarage .....Continued

In March, I wrote about start of the Christian journey towards Easter, a journey we call Lent. A time of solemn spiritual reflection and instruction – indeed, the early church prepared its baptism candidates during this time, traditionally baptising the new converts on Easter Day. Lent is a journey towards Easter and mirrors the journeys of life and of faith.

As Easter approaches, the final scenes of the first act of the Jesus drama start to play out. Sunday April 5th will be the day known to Christians as Palm Sunday. On that day we see Jesus ride into Jerusalem as a popular hero amid scenes of jubilant celebration. People throw their coats on the ground to line his path and tear branches from the surrounding palm trees to further pave his way. Things really couldn't get much better for this itinerant preacher from Galilee.

But as they say 'a week is a long time in politics'. Before the week is out, the tide of public opinion will have turned against him. By Friday, Jesus will be arrested on trumped up charges, endure a sham trial and by public opinion be sentenced to the cruellest of deaths alongside common criminals.

In our comfortable modern society, it's easy for us to think that this was the work of a barbaric mob, uneducated peasants and that we would never have acted in such a shameful way. We don't physically kill our leaders any more for falling out of public favour (usually), but death does not necessarily mean the physical death of the body. Reputations can die, as can any form of relationship. Good deeds can be wiped out at a stroke by the scandal of a perceived misdemeanour. The press is littered with stories of those who publically fall from grace. The stories of internet trolling of those who are affected by Coronavirus are shocking and upsetting. Are we really so different from those first century participants who harried Jesus to death?

The crucifixion of Jesus marks the end of the first act in the Jesus story. If this were Shakespeare, it might well be the final act, but the playwright here is God Almighty. The bunny-flower-chocolatefest we call Easter will be upon us mid month. Easter is a natural time of celebration for us as the Northern Hemisphere wakes from its winter sleep, providing us with a fantastic visual aid to the opening of act 2 in the Jesus story.

On Easter morning, Christians all over the world will celebrate the fact that the crucifixion was not the end for Jesus, but the beginning. Jesus often spoke about things needing to die before they could live. In an amazing realization of his words, after being declared dead by the authorities, Jesus returns to life. This was no recovery of a seriously injured person following a period of rest in a quiet place. As Jesus died on the cross, the authorities ensured he was dead with a spear through the heart, proper dead. The Resurrection and following events showed that he was alive, proper alive. The rest, as they say, is history – 2000 years of it. Since that first Easter morning, the message of Jesus has changed hearts and minds throughout the world.

May you know the reality of Christ's message this Easter.

#### **CORONAVIRUS**

You would have to be living on the Moon not to be aware of the situation our planet currently finds itself in. I think the phrase 'didn't see that one coming' springs to mind. These are unprecedented times, and unprecedented action is called for. To protect as many as possible, on 17 March 2020, with heavy hearts, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York wrote to Anglican churches regarding the Coronavirus:

"Public worship will have to stop for a season. Our usual pattern of Sunday services and other mid-week gatherings must be put on hold. But this does not mean that the Church of England has shut up shop."

This means that until further notice there will be no Sunday services in the **West Wycombe benefice.** 

St Paul's West Wycombe, St Paul's Bledlow Ridge, St Botolph's Bradeham and St Mary's Radnage will however be open during the day for private prayer and meditation.

If you have a wedding or other event planned, a member of the clergy will be in touch to discuss your options. The present advice is that weddings can go ahead provided the current guidelines on contact etc are strictly adhered to. This may mean that numbers will have to be limited for some ceremonies.

"But this does not mean that the Church of England has shut up shop." Whilst we have to limit contact with each other, local clergy are still on the end of a phone or email. The Church as the living body of Christ is still actively pursuing the command of its founder, Jesus – 'love your neighbour as yourself'. That command can work out in many ways, but work out it will as we all consider how we can help each other through the Coronavirus pandemic.

### **Chiltern Hills Arboriculture -** *Something for the Summer*

By the time you are reading this it will be the return of British Summer Time or Daylight Saving as they like to refer to the adjustment in various other parts of the world. A great time for gardening and allotmenteering (sic).

The promotion of BST came about due to a campaign from William Willet, a builder born in 1856. While riding his horse in Petts Wood near Chislehurst in Kent, during the early morning he noticed the number of drawn blinds after the sun was well up. So in 1907 he published a pamphlet titled "The Waste of Daylight".

In it he proposed that the clocks should be advanced by 80 minutes in four incremental steps during April and reversed the same way during September. The evenings would then remain light for longer, increasing daylight recreation time and also saving £2.5 million in lighting costs. He suggested that the clocks should be advanced by 20 minutes at a time at 2 am on successive Sundays in April and be reversed in September. Yes, it sounds very convoluted, complicated... and frankly a right royal pain in the backside.

Over many years and rationalisation and with the support of several MP's, including a young Winston Churchill, the bill was passed on 17th May 1916. The clocks moved forward in Spring, and back in the Autumn. Sadly Willet did not see the fruition of his vision Having succumbing to Flu in 1915 and passing away at the age of 58. To this day there is a sundial in Petts Wood set permanently to BST.

Anyway, in other news, on Saturday July 4th there will be Family Fun Day at The Wheel. I don't know exactly what activities Claire and Mark have planned but I do know Danny of Chiltern Hills Arboriculture will be sitting in one of their trees for 24 hours as part of his charity fundraising. Start / finish times to be confirmed. (I reckon it'll be about 'tea time'). Dan will climb up, sit there for 24 hours, sleep up there (flipping loony), and then climb down.

WHY? I hear you all ask. Well, it's all for charity. Last year Dan raised around £1300. This year we are shooting for the stars.

# **Toddle In Group**

nurturing curious minds

At the time of writing, Covid-19 is posing a real concern to many of us, and the advice is to wash your hands thoroughly and regularly for at least 20 seconds in hot soapy water.

As adults we can understand why this is so important, but this is harder for a young child to understand. A simple little activity to show children how important soap is when washing our hands is as follows:

Fill a plate/bowl with a little milk or water and ground pepper. Explain to the children that we are imagining that the pepper that we can see are all the germs that are invisible on our hands. First, ask your child to stir the water with their finger. The pepper will swirl and move, and stick to your child's finger. Now, ask your child to dip their finger into hand soap and slowly swirl their finger through the liquid, the soap repels the pepper and your child's finger will be clean. For children that struggle with hand washing, this visual explanation of why we use soap and wash our hands may help with their understanding.





There have been lots of suggestions for songs and poems to sing whilst washing our hands for 20 seconds. The one commonly used is Happy Birthday sung twice. Here at Toddle In Group we sing this song with our children, to the tune of Row, row, row your boat and welcome you to sing it too!

> Wash, wash, wash your hands Wash them every day. Top and bottom and in between To keep the germs away.

Wash, wash, wash your hands Wash the germs away. Soap and water does the trick So keep them clean all day
