



We were once again unable to print two editions of the Gazette due to the pandemic and the money saved has been added to the reserve fund.

The existing advertising rates were held for another year due to the impact of the pandemic on local businesses. Plans to move the existing black and white adverts to colour were not in the end implemented as we felt it unfair to make this change in the current environment as it impacted our long-time advertising supporters. However, the printers now charge for full colour whether we use it or not so all new advertisers are only offered colour as an option.

It has been easy to budget for the last few years as printing costs have remained constant, however our printers have now provided a warning that due to unprecedented raw material price increases, prices may be subject to change at any time prior to order. The February edition saw a 4% increase in printing costs and March was another 10% on top of that 4%. The subscription of £3 per annum has been held for many years but as a result of these unprecedented price rises, we will have to increase it to £5 this year. We anticipate collecting it in June.

Unlike some other local publications, the Gazette is still run entirely by volunteers from the local community without personal financial gain of any kind. It would not be possible without the support of our advertisers so please always consider them when looking for local services. We continue to be very grateful to all our contributors, both individuals

and representatives of local organisations, who take the time to send in their articles each month. We have a large distribution team organised by lan Hall who ensure that your copy reaches you safely and we couldn't do it without them. The Gazette support team of Peter Davis our webmaster, Paul Goby and I do our best to keep things running smoothly in the background. The biggest thank you to Sonia Goby our Editor who gives up more of her spare time than is reasonable to bring you the magazine each month.

Naphill Village Hall & Playing Fields Council Chairman's Report

On the7th. March the Village Hall Committee had the monthly meeting. There were 17 members present. Many things were discussed, including progress on the tennis club lease and Bon Ami lease. We are awaiting a valuation by a certified estate agent before we can move forward. After filling in forms for the inland revenue Judy has received confirmation that our gift aid donation has now been paid to the village hall.

With the onset of spring we discussed the fundraising events. The firework committee will organise a beacon on the crick on June 2nd. More details next month.

On the Sunday 5th. June the crick will be available to hold picnics, if anyone would like to organise the afternoon you can contact me via the village hall website.

The fete will be held on Saturday 11th. June and will be combined with the R.A.F. families day and the RAF will be funding the rides. Classics on the crick will be on Sunday 12th. June. The Fireworks will be on Saturday 5th. November.

In January Cadent replaced the gas main in Downley Road and the gas was turned off to the village hall. When the gas was reconnected the boiler supplying Bon Ami and the mens club was found to be not working. Further inspection revealed that the boiler was broken and is beyond economic repair. I have told Cadent that as the boiler was working when the gas was turned off, they owe the village hall a replacement boiler, discussions are ongoing. Unfortunately as the village hall is a commercial customer as far as the gas suppliers are concerned our gas bill is going up sixfold, so we will adjust the hiring rates accordingly. The cost of the electric has also doubled so it appears that we will be paying around £15000 a year for gas and electric!

The AGM of the village hall will be held on 4th. April at 8.00. Any person who resides in Naphill or Walters Ash will be welcome to attend.





Hughenden Parish Council - Chairman's Report

Hughenden Parish Council has been unable to operate normally for some time due to several resignations leaving us with only two councillors (out of an intended 15). This meant that the Council was inquorate, i.e., unable to make decisions. We have also been operating with only one officer who has recently resigned. We recognise that this period of challenge may have impacted Hughenden Parish.

The good news is that Hughenden Parish Council became quorate on 8 March 2022. The parish council held its first meeting on 14 March 2022 and the council now has ten councillors three of whom represent Naphill & Walters Ash Ward. These new councillors bring considerable experience and energy, and we are determined to rebuild the parish council. There is significant challenge ahead including legacy issues to understand and resolve. The parish council will focus on critical issues first, but we hope to deliver positive change which will benefit both parishioners and local environment.

In the short term we intend to get fully up to speed with outstanding and current work and to ensure that payments are processed, relationships rebuilt, and help and support provided across Hughenden Parish. Until new staff are appointed, Cllr Jill Armshaw, who formerly served as Deputy Clerk, will temporarily act as Proper Officer keeping an eye on administration and Cllr Stan Jones will temporarily act as Responsible Finance Officer. The rest of the council will roll up their sleeves and get things done.

A Message from Rob Butler MP

As I write this in March, my thoughts are with the people of Ukraine as they face an outrageous attack on their sovereignty. Putin's invasion appals every one of us, and I know that we all stand with Ukraine at this extremely difficult time.

I know that many people want to assist the thousands of innocent people being attacked by Putin's evil regime. Unfortunately, it is not possible for many goods to reach Ukraine, either because they cannot be processed at some of the borders en route, or they may not be suitable for the people in need or there could be difficulties getting access to the towns and villages where help is required most urgently. For that reason, the best way to help is through the Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC) Appeal, as they can ensure that donated money is used to buy exactly what is needed most and get it to the right place at the right time.

The Government has also announced the Home for Ukraine programme which will allow individuals, charities, community groups and businesses to bring people escaping the war to safety, even if they have no ties to the UK. Hosts will receive £350 a month for housing Ukrainian refugees, with people able to nominate a Ukrainian family to stay with them for at

least six months. You can find details regarding the scheme at homesforukraine.campaign.gov.uk.

Since my last contribution to the Naphill and Walter's Ash Gazette, we have continued to make tremendous progress in curbing coronavirus. The success of the vaccination rollout has allowed us to move considerably closer towards normality. The Government's decision to lift all remaining legal restrictions is extremely welcome, and reflects the huge efforts of scientists, NHS staff and volunteers who have contributed to the vaccination programme. Our progress would not have been possible without the sacrifices made by local residents over an extremely difficult two years. We must now adapt to live with Covid, taking care of the most vulnerable, but also returning as far as possible to the freedoms we cherish.

In Westminster, I am continuing to raise local people's concerns with individual ministers and on the floor of the House of Commons to support local people and businesses in Naphill, Walters Ash and the rest of the Aylesbury constituency.

At the last meeting of Naphill Neighbours we had a very interesting young man from the Discover Bucks Museum tell us about the origins of the Liberty store in London.

Arthur Liberty was born in Chesham. In the 1860's he started working in a shop in Regents Street. He was a very artistic, bohemian type of man and particularly interested in the Japanese silks and prints on display at the Kensington Exhibition in 1862 and this was how the Regents Street store (entrance round the corner - due to planning restrictions of the day) started out.

The black and white timbers of the building came from a warship that was being dismantled and the figurehead of this ship resides in the garden of the Liberty house in the Lee, Great Missenden.

Our main outing this year is a return trip to Savill Gardens for a few hours visiting the gardens and spending time in the lovely shop and restaurant. In the afternoon we board our coach again and travel the short distance to French Brothers boatyard at Runnymede for a two hour cruise on the Thames during which we will have a Cream Tea. We first

made this trip in the summer of 2018 and thoroughly enjoyed it and after two years of not being able to go anywhere, we thought it would be great to relive the experience. The date for your diaries is Thursday, 21st July and the price is £50, the cost of fuel has pushed it up quite a bit, and we are asking a £10 deposit to secure your place. Friends of Naphill Common

Felling

The felling operation will be complete by the end of March but the extraction of timber from within the wood and clearing the piles of logs at the end of Forge Road will continue into April. Although the recent wet weather has rendered the condition of the affected footpaths and bridleways atrocious, making some of them almost impassable, once the ground has dried sufficiently the Estate will arrange for the rides to be reinstated (as was done in previous phases of the felling). If the weather is kind this might be achieved by the end of May.

Once fledglings have left their nests in late summer, the Estate will bring in a 'mulcher' – a caterpillar-tracked bulldozer with a flail instead of a blade at the front – with the aim of mulching some of the heaps of 'lop and top' (though some will be retained for habitat) and partially clearing more of the holly thickets that choke the Common. As in previous phases of felling, the opportunity will be taken to create new glades and scalloped edges to paths and bridleways, but their precise locations have yet to be determined.

It's hoped that the end result will be a more open Common with much improved sight lines (previously blocked by holly) and a greater variety of wildflowers. The work of felling is part of a five-year programme drawn up by Wessex Woodland Management, which has been fully approved by Natural England and the Forestry Commission, and so will continue in future years, though it's expected to be at a reduced scale.

The felling will also remove any ash trees that could constitute a danger to walkers on footpaths when (as seems sadly inevitable) they contract the dieback disease that is ravaging our ash populations. There are not great numbers of ash trees on the Common, but similar work has recently been completed in Stocking Wood (the wood to the left of Stocking Lane

as it descends to North Dean) and has left some areas which were formerly dense ash plantations looking quite bare. The National Trust have also felled ash trees in the small area of the Common that belongs to the Bradenham Estate, which includes the Clumps.

The Common

There has been a great deal of amphibian activity in the last few weeks, with large numbers of frogs to be seen (and heard), particularly on Daisy and Willow Pond, though all the ponds have spawn to be found. The exception is Pickup's Pond (at the end of Downley Road), where the regular presence of 10-12 mallard must act as a deterrent to any amphibians, which would provide a tasty treat! It's to be hoped that they haven't chased away the Great Crested Newts that have been found in Pickup's in previous years.

Our programme of refurbishment of our noticeboards at the five entrances to the Common is making steady progress. The ones on Downley Road and Hunts Hill Lane have now been restored, and the remaining three will be similarly treated in their turn. Half the cost of this work is being covered by a grant from Buckinghamshire Council, for which we are very grateful.



This photograph was taken in Free & Moxham's brick yard in Walters Ash. The date is uncertain but probably around 1903. Some of the hats suggest a reference to the Boer war which ended in 1902. We know the names of several of those shown here but, unfortunately not all. If anyone can help, please do. The unknowns are marked as [?], but those we know are:-

Back Row: [?]; Bob Monger (foreman); [?];

Donkey; [?]; Charlie Brown.

Middle Row: Possibly Len Brown; [?]; [?];

JohnHussey; Will Hussey; Dog.

Front Row: Tom Hussey.

Free & Moxham's yard has long gone, so too has the kiln. All that remains are some clay pits, one of which became a deep pond, much enjoyed by us children using makeshift rafts. The names, Monger, Brown and Hussey remain in Naphill, Walters Ash and the villages around. We would welcome news about what happened to all of them.

The only man in the photo we know about is (our grandfather) John Hussey. He was born in about 1878, went to Naphill school and left aged 10 or 11. Around 1900 he married a local girl, Lily Chilton and they produced eight children. John eventually became a road foreman and in 1917, while leading

a party of men to a new working site, he was killed by the steam roller trundling along behind him. He was buried in the graveyard of the Mission Hall in Naphill. Shamefully, his grave is now under the foundations of 122/124 Main Road (Emma Grace House). Lily lived into her nineties.

Their eldest son Bert Hussey (our father), born 1903, had left Naphill School at 13 and had just got work as gardener's boy at Bradenham Manor – a job he enjoyed, partly because of all the servant girls. Sadly, he had suddenly become the chief wage earner for the family and so had to get a job in a Wycombe furniture factory. He once claimed to have shaped more cabriole legs than any other man alive.

Growing Your Own

Inflation is in the air. The global price of natural gas has multiplied by a factor of 10 in the past year, which is bad news for farmers relying on nitrogen fertiliser made from gas. Among the prices of other commodities, one that caught my eye was the global price of wheat which had gone up by 45% in 10 days. Could we grow wheat on our allotments or in our gardens? Yes, we could. The soil in Naphill and Walter's Ash is excellent for growing wheat and other cereals – many gardeners grow sweetcorn, which is a variety of maize.

But there would be a few practical difficulties. The patch of wheat would take up most of your garden or allotment, so there would be little space for other crops. There would be a need for a scythe at harvest time (you could perhaps borrow mine). You could dig out that old flail you found in your great-grandad's shed, for separating the ears of wheat from the stalks. Then you could winnow, which consists of throwing the ears of wheat in the air when there is a bit of wind about so that the ears fall onto a sheet and the chaff blows away. Then it is off to the local windmill to have your wheat ground to release the precious flour, to be carefully stored at home for your breadmaking. Whew! After reading all that you may be content to let farmers grow the wheat in massive fields where modern combine harvesters can do the harvesting far more efficiently.

When the Inclosure Commissioners were allocating unregistered common land in Naphill and Walter's Ash in August 1862, the value of a piece of land was

measured by the amount of wheat, barley and oats which could be grown on it. The Commissioners had to work out the soil's nutrient and humus content. I doubt if they used the method of the actor Yves Montand in the film "Jean de Florette" where he puts soil in his mouth and chews it for a while before declaring that it was good growing soil, but the Commissioners must have had some method. The Commissioners were re-allocating "common land" which was used by villagers to grow their fruit and vegetables and to graze their animals. The villagers were thus deprived of the use of "their" common land so, in compensation, the Commissioners awarded 2 acres in Naphill (field 55) and 2 acres in Walter's Ash (field 129) to the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor in trust as "Allotments for the Labouring Poor". The charity thus created has since been renamed "Hughenden Community Support Trust". Fields 55 and 129 were previously owned by Benjamin Disraeli (yes, him) and in compensation for his loss he was awarded Rent Charges of £2.50 per annum for the Naphill allotments and £2 per annum for the Walter's Ash allotments. Sadly for him there was no indexation of the Rent Charges. £2 in 1862 is now worth about 2 pence!

A shocking recent report by the B.T.O in conjunction with two European conservation organisations estimates that Europe has lost 900 million birds over the last 30 years. This research has used data from the Breeding Bird Survey along with other databases from across Europe. This has allowed a reconstruction of past soundscapes at more than 200,000 locations over this period. Sadly, the results reveal that spring birdsong has deteriorated all over Europe. This reflects both a worrying decline in overall bird abundance in many areas but also in species richness.

As well as providing another way to illustrate changes in bird populations, this study highlights a phenomenon sometimes described as Environmental Generational Amnesia, where younger people who have never experienced great abundance in the natural world just do not know what has been lost.

During the Covid lockdowns, many people shared their appreciation of birdsong at a time when it was not drowned out by human activity and commented how it helped their health and wellbeing. This is all the more reason to monitor our avian friends and try to prevent further degradation from taking place.

Easter - Ukrainian Style

Unless you live on Mars you are probably aware that there is a fair bit of disruption going on in Ukraine at the moment. This Eastern European country that sits on the North shores of the Black Sea will almost certainly be taking a break from the normal Easter celebrations, the ones we take for granted. While our children are out on egg hunts and gorging themselves on chocolate bunnies, I thought it would be poignant to take a look at what a "traditional" Ukrainian Easter would look like.

The first difference is the date. Ukrainian Christians follow the Orthodox Church, which bases its religious observation on the Julian calendar. In the west Christian/Catholic observance is based on the Gregorian calendar. As such this means in 2022 our Easter Sunday is on April 17th, while in Ukraine it will be April 24th.

In Ukraine it's customary not to sleep on the night before Easter, so as such the Saturday is deemed a day of rest in preparation for the all night service. Orthodox worshippers go to church that evening and take Easter Cake, eggs, meat, wine and horilka with them to start the celebrations after the service. Horilka is a "moonshine" style vodka, distilled from grain and flavoured with chili peppers so as to be spicey. This drink would be blessed with holy water by the priest.

The word for Easter in Ukrainian is Velykden which translates as "Great Day". Like Christmas, it is a time for family gathering and a celebratory feast. The meal begins with Easter Cake. This is made from a heavy dough typically containing dried fruits and nuts, and topped with icing and glazed candy. The main course would be boiled chicken or pork served with potatoes, carrots, peas, onions, hard boiled eggs, pickles and mayo.

As in the west, eggs are a large part of Easter celebrations. There are pysanka. These are eggs decorated with ornamentation and folk patterns that have special meanings. Red symbolises the sun. Yellow stands for wealth and fertility. Green is the symbol of Spring and plant life. Krashenka are eggs that have been dyed red using food colouring. They symbolise the blood of Jesus, shed for the sins of the people. After the meal children play bytky or "egg tapping". It's a bit like conkers. The object of the



game is to smash your hard boiled egg (shell still on) into your opponents egg, breaking their shell while keeping your shell intact. The winner being the last player with an undamaged shell.

Enjoy your Easter. Eat too much chocolate. Hunt for eggs with your kids in your garden. Celebrate over food with your family. But remember the line in the 1985 Sting song "Russians"

"We share the same biology. Regardless of ideology. Believe me when I say to you.... I hope the Russians love their children too...."

More Church News

Last month I wrote about how things in the Church are getting'nearly back to normal. This month is an opportunity to look back on the last year, consequent upon the Annual Vestry Meeting and Annual Parochial Church Meeting, both held on the 13th March. These meetings together effectively form the AGM of the Church, with regulatory requirements for election of certain officers, reports from different groups and committees and financial statements of accounts.

In particular, this allows for a reflection on the past year (or specifically the year to December 2021). However, we were also brought up to date with our financial situation, and decisions about the donations the Church makes to mission causes, including a substantial donation to the Disasters Emergency Committee for its work in Ukraine.

For much of the 2021, public services in Church were suspended, but we were able to deliver live-streamed services quite early in the year, replacing some recorded services which we introduced at the beginning of Covid. Initially these were broadcast without a congregation, but as regulations and advice changed, the congregation has been able to return. When we were unable to meet in Church, 'communal coffee' took place after services on Zoom. A Zoom service was trialled on Sunday evenings, and later, after the relaxation of regulations, a new Tuesday service of Holy Communion was begun, followed occasionally by a soup lunch.

Outside of formal services, the social activities were able to resume with members of the congregation hosting 2 parish barbeques (both with swimming opportunities). The Church held a Nature Quest in the Churchyard, a Bank holiday weekend flower festival, a bat walk around the park (followed by hot dogs, for the now hungry walkers) a Harvest celebration (also with hot dogs) and the presentation of a one-man play by Jeff Rosla about Disraeli. Not least of the activities in which the whole community could be involved is the Hughenden Community Singers which meets regularly in the Church on Monday evenings.

Being reminded of what has been achieved this year, as well as the reinstatement of most of our regular activities alongside the huge effort in obtaining funds and coordinating the rebuilding of the church tower, was quite heartening after the difficult two years of the pandemic.

Short, medium and long route options will be provided. The medium and long routes will take you from church around parts of the boundary to the picnic spot, and after lunch walk back down to church. Alternatively, shorter routes can be taken from the picnic spot. You could even take the easiest option of a 20yard walk to the picnic spot, or a short wheelchair or buggy ride.

For this event, we unite the various villages and outposts of our parish, and take time to pray as we walk: for those who live within the parish (on our one side) and for the rest of the world (on our other side). At the end of the walk, we'll spend maybe ten minutes to rededicate ourselves, our community and our church, to the Lord whose life, death and resurrection we have just celebrated at Easter.



From Bradenham Vicarage - Resurrections

This time last year we had just reflected on the first anniversary of the Covid pandemic. A year on, can it finally be that we are actually out of the woods? Having endured two 'lockdown Easters', my plans for this Easter are starting to morph into a mega family celebration that will involve chocolate, Easter egg hunts, more chocolate, an inflatable hot tub, even more chocolate, cocktails and at least two of us having to sleep on the sofas, closely followed by copious quantities of black coffee and AlkaSeltzer! For us, this will be the Easter of all Easters, making up for two years of muted celebrations.

But what are we celebrating? This year we are surely celebrating a return to normality, and that indeed was the hope of the first ever celebration of Easter. Jesus, a popular but radical preacher and healer from a region called Galilee was arrested then put to death on trumped up charges. His followers were left desolate. Their leader had promised so much with his exciting talk of new beginnings, a radical new way of relating to God and his vision of a world where justice, freedom and peace were a given. Jesus had given them a hope that things could be different, that things could change. They had even come to believe that he was the Son of God come to earth. The terrible events that had ended his life put paid to those hopes and especially the notion that Jesus was actually divine. Dejectedly, they returned to their old, humdrum way of life. But three days later Jesus was raised back to life by the power of God, actual living proof that he really was the Son of God. Jesus was alive! Now his followers could return to the former life they had enjoyed with their leader – the good times were back!

But things weren't the same; they certainly didn't pan out how Jesus' followers had expected. With Jesus' resurrection, things had changed. Now they had to put into practice what they had learned from him and teach those lessons to others.

This Easter, as we have done for nearly 2000 Easters, we will remember The Resurrection as a single, world changing event, which indeed it was. Yet there are other resurrections too. We are currently witnessing the rebuilding of our lives from the devastation of the pandemic. The good times are returning, but things have changed. We have learned lessons about how we treat the world God has entrusted us with and how we treat each other. We have learned lessons about what is truly important and other lessons about what is actually needful. We have learned how fragile our dependency on the world actually is. Now we have to put into practice those lessons.

Jesus Resurrection enabled the power of God to be released in a new way throughout the world as his followers lived out what they had learned. As we live out what we have learned, may our 'resurrection' from the pandemic enable the growth of a fairer, more just society that lives in harmony with each other, our planet and God.

May you know the true meaning of Resurrection this Easter.



With Spring in the air at Lindengate, new life is appearing across our 6 acre gardens on a daily basis. Our team, volunteers and programme participants have been busy weeding & planting across the whole site, in preparation for the Summer months.

Since opening, we have worked on significant projects with the Butterfly Conservation, Wildlife Trusts & RSPB growing Devils Bit Scabious, the sole food source of the Marsh Fritillary Butterfly, earning us extensive media coverage, but also recognition through our achievement of multiple National and Regional Awards for conservation initiatives.

Camomile PT Personal Training and Nutrition

Spending hours a day at a desk? Try these 5 stretches to improve your posture, movement and well-being! Exercise advice to help from Camomile Personal Training

Exercise 1 - Deep core engagement

- With this one, you are aiming to create a strong cylinder of support from your diaphragm to your pelvic floor, activating all the deep core muscles around your middle.
- Sit upright with shoulders back and down, take a deep breath into the belly, and then with the hands around your waist. Engage the pelvic floor and imagine you are tightening a corset around your middle. Practice until you can feel the muscles all around the middle engaging. Breathe out really slowly, whilst keeping the engagement then release.
- WHEN: Practice whenever you feel yourself slouching and after you sit down. Aim to maintain a good upright sitting position at all times.

Exercise 2 - Neck rolls and mobility

- Sit or stand upright, with the shoulders back and gaze straight ahead – Look to the right as far as you can without forcing, and notice how far round you can turn the neck. Find a point of reference at the furthest point. Repeat for the left-hand side. Notice any differences.
- Now reach one arm up into the air and the other down towards your side (if standing, also point the toe of this side behind you whilst it rests on the floor, and create as much length from toe to the up arm as you can) keep the shoulders down. Take 2-3 nice deep breaths in this position and repeat on the other side.
- Repeat the first step and notice any improvements in your comfortable range of neck rotation.
- WHEN: Aim to do this at the start of the day and at lunch time.

Exercise 3 – Shoulder shrugs – Repeat 5 times each time you finish a meeting

- Whilst sitting or standing, engage your cylinder of core muscles lightly, and breathe in whilst you shrug your shoulders up towards the ears, then breathe out allowing them to drop away from the ears and back to neutral.
- WHEN: After you finish each meeting or work task.

Exercise 4 – Engaging the correct muscles to stand up – Repeat every time you stand up

- Sit towards the front of the seat, create right angles with knees place feet hip width apart.
- Sit upright, lean forwards slightly push through the heels and squeeze the bottom muscles to come up to standing, inhale before you move, and breathe out as you stand.
- Remember to do this every time you stand up from a chair.
- WHEN: Every time you stand up throughout the day. For an extra challenge Repeat 3-5 times in a row morning and afternoon.

Exercise 5 - Chest opener

- Each time you stand up, place your palms on each side of your back, just above the hips, from here, pull your elbows back and open up the chest into a slight back bend, and drop the head back as far as is comfortable for the neck. Hold here for 2-3 breaths repeat if you feel you need to.
- WHEN: Every hour make sure to stand and do this.

As we are all amateur (the word means "for the love of it") there are many times when a full cast is not available for rehearsal which means someone reading in. However the real task is to learn your lines as true acting can't happen with your script in your hand.

Costumes need to be bright and cheerful as Panto is lighthearted and very visual. This year we hired costumes for, Dorothy, Lion, Scarecrow, Tin man and Palace guard, from a specialist in Banbury where there is an Aladdins cave of costumes for many different shows! The others are made or bought (to be used again). Scenery and props have to be made and painted. Don't forget all the technical planning for lights, sound and special effects.

Having live music adds another dimension to rehearsals and the show, especially as many of us have no musical background other than singing in the shower!

So does having youngsters acting with us, as we have to licence their presence with Buckinghamshire council and they have to be chaperoned by a registered chaperone.

As the weeks count down we move from a weekly rehearsal to twice, three and the week before every night

Then after much sweat and tears (?) performance week arrives and the nerves jangle for the dress rehearsal. There is a common thought in the theatre, " bad dress, great first night" it doesn't always go like that.

Finally we are there, in the spotlights, with an audience roaring us on and joining in. Oh yes they are! Then, after all the hard work and the "buzz", the final curtain. All over.....until next year"

COVID precautions will be followed throughout the opening season (as per National Guidance).






