





Bradenham Parish Council

The flooding of Rectory Lane every time it rains is a permanent agenda item. We have had confirmation from the National Trust that work has been instructed on improving the existing grips and creating several new grips on the bridleway leading up Bradenham Hill. A ditch for overflow water has been dug in the field parallel to Rectory Lane and it is hoped that this work will reduce the flooding problem. It is, however, acknowledged that due to the steep incline of the hill and the nature of the track, this problem can never be completely alleviated. The parish council will again contact the National Trust about the dreadful state of the track to ask them to do something about this.

Problems are still reported with overgrown hedges along footpaths and pavements, please cut back your hedges to allow safe passage.

The parish council looked at its income and expenditure for mainly grass cutting, which under devolved services, it took over from Buckinghamshire County Council in the 30mph area (excluding New road) in 2015. The amounts of cuts are of course weather dependent, but we have noted that we are now spending in excess of

the income we receive from Buckinghamshire Council on grass cutting. We will have to raise the additional funds through our annual precept, or carry out less cuts.

We have been investigating a quieter road surface for the A4010 where this runs through the parish. Road noise has become ever more prominent in recent years. The National Trust is working alongside the RAF to clear the overgrown vegetation in the woods behind the RAF site. The National Trust are coordinating tree safety work throughout the estate and have told us they are going to plant 11,000 trees, including in areas which have been affected by Ash Dieback which has caused the loss of so many trees on the estate.

The parish council is also going to investigate a new website. More news on this project in the New Year.

Our next meeting will be Monday 10th January 2022.

A Message from Rob Butler MP

As 2021 draws to a close, many of us will be reflecting on a particularly difficult year. Covid has loomed large in our lives, despite the great success of the vaccine programme. Sadly, many people have died from the virus or suffered serious illness, and I extend my condolences to all who have lost loved ones.

In Parliament, we have all been devastated by the killing of our colleague Sir David Amess. His death was all the more shocking because it happened while he was meeting local people in his constituency. MPs of all parties are subject to threats and abuse on an almost daily basis. This cannot be right, and I hope David's tragic death will prompt us all to be kinder to each other in our public discourse, irrespective of our political views.

On a more positive note, the Chilterns AONB is particularly beautiful at this time of year – the autumnal canopy of trees with flashes of yellow, brown and auburn create a vivid picture and a

stunning backdrop for anyone out walking and enjoying the fresh air. I am always surprised and disappointed that people drop their litter in such a lovely area, so I was delighted to join a litter pick in Naphill recently.

Our natural environment is a precious resource, and we must do everything to conserve and protect it. Recently, the Environment Act has become law. Friends of Naphill Common

News

As mentioned in last month's article, the information board at the entrance to the Common from Downley Road (close to Pickup's Pond) has been removed to a local workshop, where it can be restored to original condition. The remaining four boards at the other access points will follow in due course.

You may have noticed red dots appearing on trees in the woods around Naphill – Stocking Wood and the adjoining woods have many such examples, and no doubt they are elsewhere as well. They are marking ash trees that, sadly, must be felled because of the spread of ash dieback disease. The expectation is that 95% of these trees are likely to succumb to the disease and, once it sets in, the longer they are left the more hazardous they become. As a result, most ash trees (particularly if they are near a boundary or footpath) are being felled as a precaution.

The Common itself has relatively few ash trees, but there is a stand close to Daisy Pond, near the border with Downley Common, that will be felled in due course.

The Common

Speaking of tree felling, the third phase of thinning of the Common – deferred from last year – has now commenced, and will cover an area from the end of Chapel Lane down to the bottom of the Common, shown in dark grey on the map. The red dashed lines are new rides that will be created by widening existing footpaths and bridleways.

Significant trees have been identified (by the Friends of Naphill Common) for exclusion from the thinning, and the County Archaeologist has been consulted to ensure the bank and ditch marking a Romano-British Farmstead are not affected. As before, the trees will be stacked near the end of Forge Road before being taken away for making into planks (and some of the smaller trees for firewood). As with the previous two phases of thinning, the work will remove much of the holly thickets that are filling the gaps between the trees and crowding out other species.

Managed woodlands need periodic thinning. Even after the work has been completed, tree density will be higher than that recommended by Natural England, who (as the Common is designated as a Site of Special Scientific Interest) must give permission for this work, as also have Forestry England (part of the Forestry Commission). West Wycombe Estate have been extremely co-operative in allowing us to identify significant and veteran trees, which will be left alone.


Activities

Our guided walks are again taking place, with longer walks (around two hours, finishing with optional lunch at a local hostelry when possible) being led by Ron Collins and Neil McMinn, and usually held on the third Monday of each month, starting at 9:25am prompt from the Village Hall. Shorter walks (around an hour, finishing with optional coffee and cakes at the Bon Ami) are led by Chris Miller and are generally on the first Wednesday of each month, starting at 10:30am from the Village Hall. The walks are free, and all are welcome.

Our working parties are also in full swing and take place on most Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Because they are dependent on the weather, it's best to check our web site for details (where our walking and other activities are also listed):

The final month of the year is with us. Christmas shopping lists are being ticked off and at the Vicarage, I am preparing the Christmas catering. The formula is simple. Each guest has to tell me in advance their favourite snack, starter, main course, pudding, breakfast, cheese and beverage. With six of us over the festive period this year, catering will be easy as I will simply work through the lists my guests have given me. It's a formula I've successfully used for many years – well, more or less successfully. It didn't quite work last year. We had hoped for a 'normal' Christmas, but with the pandemic at its height and the restrictions that came into place, we had an almost virtual Christmas. I say almost virtual because we had one house guest – our daughter Kim.

As the news got grimmer, Kim's situation in London worsened and she faced spending Christmas alone in her flat with no heating, water or sanitation. Ongoing issues of leaks and damp had come to a head and now needed dealing with urgently. Clearly this was a totally unacceptable state of affairs, so I drove to London to 'rescue' her and bring her home for the duration of the work. It was a hard decision to make – at the time, staying overnight in someone else's house was forbidden except for emergencies or personal safety. I figured that having no sanitation for up to 3 weeks was definitely a safety issue.

The big day came. No joyful carol singing, no services of lessons and carols, midnight communion with the bread and wine consumed only by the priest......an even sadder Christmas than was probably endured during Puritan rule. In a forlorn hope that we might

still be able to have some form of family celebration, even if it were an al fresco Scandi-style lunch, I had stocked up my cupboards, but most of the festive delights remained unopened. 'Oh well' I thought 'I'll save them for Easter…' (...and that's another story!).

But there were good things too. We were able to have a Zoom family Christmas, which meant we could at least see each other and talk to each other through the wonders of technology. We even opened our presents in each other's company over Zoom. We were able to join together with our extended family in Switzerland and Malaysia (at a time agreeable to all time zones). It was certainly different. We made the most of it and rescued what could be salvaged of the celebration.

At the moment, things are looking a lot more hopeful for this year's celebrations – but maybe Christmas will still need to be rescued. After nearly two years of curtailed events, many will be tempted to pull out all the stops to make up for last year. Everything will be bigger, better, brighter, more; an antidote to last year's muted events, making it easy to forget that Christmas begins with Christ – and God's rescue mission to the world.

Naphill Neighbours



Our speaker this week was Nicola Bishop, the Community Fundraising Officer for the Thames Valley Air Ambulance which operates from RAF Benson. I had looked forward to learning about the TVAA and the talk and video did not disappoint. I confess I am addicted to the TV programmes about the emergency helicopter service which operates throughout the country. One cannot help but be impressed by the skills and expertise of the doctors and paramedics who fly in to rescue the injured and the sick of all ages.

The teamwork of the crews is exemplary and their compassion for those they help is very reassuring. The TVAA serves Oxfordshire, Berks and Bucks, flying the severely injured and ill, principally to the John Radcliffe hospital, a major trauma centre. In effect, the teams are bringing A & E out to the patient, administering strong painkillers, setting bones, performing CPR, providing transfusions, etc. by the road side. Some statistics about the TVAA service:

- Each call out costs 3750 pounds
- There are 30 highly qualified doctors, 24 critical care paramedics and 6 emergency dispatch assistants, working shifts as well as functioning in hospitals.
- 5 very skilled pilots (they have to be able to land in some very tight spaces)
- 2570 call outs between Oct.2019 and September 2020

TVAA was formed in 1999, in ramshackle buildings, moving to RAF Benson in 2007.

The funds raised by Classics on the Crick goes to TVAA. All their income comes from fundraising and donations. No government funding is involved.

TVAA is an invaluable service which prides itself on giving patients the best chance when the worst happens.

As we approach and reach the Christmas period, we at St Michael's and All Angels wish our community a happy, safe and blessed Christmas and New Year.





Growing Your Own

What is the connection between my allotment at Walter's Ash and the destruction of the Amazonian rainforest? In Brazil they remove trees and use the land for planting crops. And the most useful crop is soyabeans. In the UK we cannot grow soyabeans, so we import soyabeans and soyabean husks from Brazil to feed to cattle, sheep, chickens etc. Soyabeans are the principal feed for our animals and birds. In the case of cattle, their poo, or some of it, ends up on my allotment to be incorporated into the soil to provide the nutrients that my crops need. So I am contributing to Global Warming by using cattle poo from soyabeans. Trees in the Amazonian rainforest absorb carbon from the atmosphere, so helping with Global Warming. They also give out precious oxygen which we can breathe. The trees are good for us, and chopping them down to enable the production of soyabeans is terrible. But if I refuse to take delivery of my annual dose of farmyard manure it will end up being ploughed into farmers' fields. What a quandary! Should I continue to make my soil ever more productive, or should I let that valuable manure be used to manure farmers' fields?

With soil, one must put back the nutrients which one takes out with crops. It is as simple as that. Otherwise, the soil will become more and more impoverished and the trace elements our bodies need and our crops need, will be deficient. The last time I heard the

figures, 34% of farmland in the EU was described as "poor", in that the soils lacked nutrients and humus because of inadequate manuring. I am sure that the figure will be much more than 34% today, with the intensification of agriculture. As farming becomes ever more productive, with machines able to do the work ever more efficiently and chemicals being used more and more to improve productivity, the soil must suffer more and more. And so our supermarket food becomes ever more deficient in vital nutrients, which is very bad for our health. We can combat this by growing more of what we eat ourselves. In our gardens and on our allotments it is possible to grow all the fresh vegetables we need every month of the year, eating seasonally. As for fruit, we can eat our own fresh fruit for probably 6 months of the year and rely on stored fruit for much of the other 6 months, but I would agree that one might have to resort to supermarket fruit in desperation in the winter. However, if you grow most of your own food you can ensure that your family will obtain all the nutrients their bodies need, provided the soil is replenished with nutrients from manure every year and that, by avoiding pesticides, herbicides, and fungicides etc we can help the billions of species of soil microorganisms to thrive and keep our soil healthy.

Effects of Climate Change



As birds gear up to breed, a new challenge is looming on the horizon. The increase in midsummer heat. It is easy to imagine that dealing with heat is just a problem faced by birds in hot climates but this is not true. For birds living in or near deserts, in conditions where air temperatures frequently exceed 40°C, dealing with heat is indeed an everyday problem. But "hot" is a relative term. For birds living at high altitudes or latitudes with bodies that have evolved to cope with average temperatures near zero, even temperatures in the low teens can cause thermal distress.

In Britain, birds such as Dotterel, Skuas, Snow Bunting and Ptarmigan are at the southern reaches of their breeding range. All are ground nesting birds who can leave nests to find shelter if it gets too warm. Great

Skuas are forced to leave their nests unattended and seek water to cool off at temperatures above 14°C and as with the other species this leaves chicks and eggs open to predation.

In hotter climates, birds have evolved many adaptations for dealing with heat, where the difference between the hottest and coolest places in the landscape can be well over 20°C. This has happened over many thousands of years but those in the northern tundra and snow edges may not have the time to do so.

With around 11 million pairs the Wren is now our most common bird. They have seen the largest increase since monitoring began, with over six million more pairs compared to 50 years ago.

Cranes bred for the first time since 1585 at the Otmoor R.S.P.B. reserve near Oxford. They have now been seen with other immature birds at the Gallows Bridge Farm B.B.O.W.T reserve on the A41 between Aylesbury and Bicester. These reserves are both part of the Upper Ray Living Landscape Scheme, currently covering 42 square kilometres.


As the colder, darker weather continues, it is tempting to stay in the warm rather than exercise. However, it is important for us all to maintain our physical and mental wellbeing.


It's Panto time - Oh yes it is!



Often at this time of year as adults we can be battling with frozen windscreens, slippery roads, burst pipes, and other inconveniences that the very cold weather can often bring. For a child, frozen cobwebs, ice, snow and early morning mist entices them to feel like they are in a magical faraway land. The Nursery continues this frozen theme inside with immersive wintry hideouts, ice experiments, and wintry walks. Our children are able to find awe and wonder in all that they see, and an enthusiastic adult is all we need to elevate the moment, and create a lovely experience. A wintry walk, baking gingerbread, and creating crafts to send to loved ones are where the real spirit of Christmas lies.

Not everybody celebrates Christmas, and that diversity is also embraced in our Nursery. 



Report from the Clerk to the Hughenden Parish Council

Hughenden Parish Council is moving into the winter maintenance programme and you will notice our contractors working on bus shelters along with the disappearing and reappearing of benches and village signs as they are temporarily removed for refurbishment.

We continue to encourage and remind homeowners of their obligation to both sides of their hedges when bordering highways and pavements and to ensure that these are cut back to the boundary line, not just the edge of the visible pavement. Also that where they hang over the pavement, there must be a minimum clearance height of 2.2 meters. If in doubt that the hedge belongs to the property, land registry records can help. Do be aware that in some instances previous home owners have erected fences within the hedge boundary, however those abandoned hedges still remain the responsibility of the property owner.

Councillors are now engaged in the budget cycle where they review expenditure for this year and plan expenditure for the next three years. We remain under extreme pressure with only 7 councillors out of a potential 15. Should you be interested in becoming a councillor we would be delighted to hear from you, or come along to one of our meetings. Full Council meets on the second Tuesday of the month and the Planning Committee meets on the third Monday of the month. These are our most frequently attended meetings. Agendas to our meetings are published the week before and are available on our website www. hughenden-pc.gov.uk or by contacting the office.



Electric Cars

The debate rages about whether these are a good thing but I see opportunities for the village to make money.

The first will be rescuing cars where their batteries have run out. There are going to be lots of instances when optimistic drivers are nursing their cars home. They will be desperate to increase their battery range, perhaps choosing to freeze in the winter as they daren't use the heater or choosing to boil in the summer to avoid using the aircon.

Their efforts will be doomed at the last hurdle as, on the climb up the final hill into Naphill, the battery charge will reduce to nothing and they will grind to a halt. Coombe Lane will be almost permanently blocked with exhausted vehicles.

This is where we come in. A village rescue vehicle. The stranded cars won't need towing. Just a big battery or a generator in the back of the rescue truck and a spool of electric cable, like a giant electrical, expanding dog lead.

Connect up to the stricken vehicle, bringing it back to life and then the rejuvenated car can follow the rescue vehicle up to the village like a faithful dog on a walk while the retracting spool of cable prevents snagged wires.

This is a quick win for the village coffers, the other idea is a bit longer term.

The problem with any vehicle is range between refueling. With fossil fuels it is quite easy. We stop for a few minutes, fill up, buy a bar of chocolate while paying and we are on the way again.

For electric cars it is not so easy but we can learn a lesson from the great age of steam.

Steam railway engines could carry enough coal for a long journey but not enough water.

So, they installed water troughs to let the engines top up without stopping.

At this point I suspect that many regular readers are expecting me to make a silly suggestion that we install troughs through the village and fill them with electricity. I am not that daft. I know how these things work.

Main Road is not level so the electricity would flood out of the trough at the junction with Hunts Hill Lane and also at Clappins Lane. Also, I reckon that some unscrupulous residents would sneak out under cover of darkness with plastic buckets to top up their home electricity supply.

My suggestion is to look, instead, at trolley buses.

If we put up overhead cables through the village then electric cars could extend a pantograph to connect with the wire. They then use the electricity to power their run through the village while re-charging their battery at the same time. We charge (!) them royally for the pleasure.

An added benefit would be that when the flood waters rise and we become a seaside village then we can rescue the trams off the Blackpool seafront and run them along the promenade as far as the Pink and Lily. There it would be possible for visitors to take a passenger ferry over to the Hampden Arms.



As this is the Christmas edition of the Gazette I thought it would be fun to look at some of the peculiar seasonal traditions and folklore from around various parts of the world.

I expect that most of us have indulged in the usual treats of mince pies and mulled wine after trimming the tree, stuffing the turkey and putting out "refreshments" for Santa and his reindeer. Of course, we all know this is primarily to reassure the kids that "he really does exist.... but he knows if you are not tucked up in bed sound asleep... and he won't come if you are not".

But you don't have to go too far to find some very bizarre ideas of what constitutes festive behaviour and belief.

You don't leave your broom out on Christmas Eve in Norway. Centuries ago it was a common belief that the witches and evil spirts would come out and steal them. To this day it is quite normal to hide your brooms away to keep them safe. They are bonkers, I know. But they do give us a very nice tree for Trafalgar Square every year, so I think we should do the decent thing and look the other way.

France has Hans Trapp, the French Satan worshipper who lives in the forest but comes out just before Christmas, dressed as a scarecrow, to scare children (not crows, oddly) into being good.

One of the strangest traditions appears in Catalonia, northern Spain. Tio de Nadal is a hollow log, about a foot long. It is brought into the house on December 8th, the date that marks the Feast of Immaculate Conception. Tio is then fed every night and is kept warm with a blanket. The children are told to "look after Tio and keep him warm" so that he will "defecate" presents for them. On Christmas day Tio is beaten with sticks which the children have warmed up in the kitchen. Of course, while the kids are in the kitchen the adults take the opportunity to hide the presents under Tios' blanket. While this tradition maybe a bit weird I suppose it's a saving grace that Tio doesn't want to terrorise you or eat you.

I experienced my own personal favourite alternative cultural Christmas tradition about 10327 miles away. A barbecue on the Gold Coast in Queensland, Australia. Steaks, prawns and beer on the beach, and a picture that always makes me sing the Clash track "Bank Robber"..... using the line "Santa was a life saver... and he never drowned nobody....". After all, nothing says "Christmas" quite like a barefoot bloke on a beach wearing red shorts and a Santa hat.


