

The two new boilers have been installed in the village hall. There was a bit of disruption during the process but all seems to be working well after an initial couple of weeks to become acquainted to the new system. This was a major undertaking for the committee and the cost is about £30,000. The new system will be far more efficient than the 1970's boiler it replaces. It appears, that because we have funds, it is nearly impossible to get grants for this expenditure and you cannot apply for a grant after the work has started. The two benches by the children's play area have been replaced. The new benches are made of recycled plastic and have cost £1590.

The committee met on the 7th. November and discussed the new boiler system and agreed the Health and Saftey document and Fire Risk assessment that will shortly be put on the website. This work was undertaken by Bartha Pitman who is also Residents' Association Chairman and we thank Bartha for doing this.

The committee was told that the lease for Bon Ami was still with the solicitors and negotiations were still ongoing with the tennis club.

The fund raising activities were discussed and the fireworks were a great success. The number of tickets were restricted due to the safety of the crowd that came

and enjoyed the event, so remember next year to buy your tickets early! There was a whole army of volunteers to whom the committee is very grateful as the event could not be run without them! Pete Dalby is stepping down as Fireworks Chairman and so there is a vacancy for someone to step up and make sure this event continues and is not only a great fundraiser for the village hall but a fantastic evening for the whole village community.

The Christmas fayre was held on Friday 2nd. December, Hopefully you all went along, purchased your Christmas gifts and enjoyed a glass of mulled wine along with a mince pie! Thank you Cathryn Carter and Moira Harris for organizing this event.

Cllr. Carl Etholen was present for part of the meeting of the Parish Council held on November 7th 2022. He informed the meeting that the Bledlow Recycling centre is expected to be open by the end of the year. The contractor and stakeholder for the Molins site will attend the North West Community Board meeting on the 6th December 2022; residents can attend and ask questions.

The Parish Council is having repair work carried out on the war memorial which is the Lychgate by St. Botolph's Church. This is the responsibility of the parish, not the church.

The Council discussed the preliminary budget for the next financial year. Decisions about this will be taken at the January meeting. The Parish finances are in good order at present.

The Council wishes to celebrate the coronation of King Charles III; this takes place on May 6th. There will be a bank holiday on Monday May 8th. The Council meeting planned for that day has been moved to May 15th. Details in due course.

The new Revenue and Benefits system is up and running on the Buckinghamshire Council website. www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk. There is new grant funding for sustainable warmth: details are on the above website. The Helping Hands initiative (County) has a team which can refer residents to food banks, free school meals, etc. See website address above.

The Parish Council wishes residents a happy Christmas and a healthy New Year.

Out with the old and in with the new!

As I sit to write, the rain is sheeting down in Biblical proportions whilst the wind howls around almost apocalyptically. It's hard to even think about Christmas; even harder this year as I moved house two weeks ago. After 33 years, my husband has retired from full time ordained ministry. This has meant us moving from the beloved, spacious Vicarage that was our home for over 10 years to a modest semi with just about enough room to swing a cat (though the cats are not so keen on that idea!).

Christmas will be very different for us this year. Gone is the two storey tree that sat in the spiral staircase giving the Vicarage hallway an air of country house welcome – the only Christmas tree in our new hallway will be on a Christmas card! Gone is the riotous gathering of family and friends sat around our huge dining table, everyone having slept in their own room over the holiday. Gone is the delight of the 'how was it for you darling?' conversations my husband and I used to have on coming back from celebrating midnight mass at our respective churches. We have been blessed with living in an amazing place, now this era has ended.

But when one thing ends, something new begins. This will be our first ever Christmas actually living in our own home. The huge downsizing we had to undergo has been freeing, letting go of masses of accumulated 'stuff' that in some ways formed a security blanket for us since we had no real roots anywhere. For the first time I have a log burning stove – and quickly discovered you can cook on it! (Check it out on line if you didn't already know this). To date, I have boiled potatoes and heated numerous kettles of water. The griddled pork belly was only partially successful – the wood burner is best used for slow cooking, but it's an adventure experimenting with this new source of heat and there is something very earthy about cooking over a wood fire.

November is not the ideal time of year to be moving, especially with the weather we have been experiencing, but it does come at a time of change in the Church's year. The old Church year ends in November and a new one begins with the first Sunday of Advent, heralding the countdown to Christmas. As one year ends, a new one begins. As one era ends, a new era begins. In the book of Revelation, the final book of the Bible, the narrative is of an old era ending and things being made new. This making new is vital for our wellbeing and is a key part of our reflections at this time as 2022 ends and 2023 begins. Out with the old and in with the new we will soon be proclaiming; 'Behold I make all things new' Jesus proclaims in Revelation 21:5.

May you have a blessed Christmas and renewing New Year.














Meet Ciaria Erin, our local, talented harpist.



AGM Notice

Our AGM will be held at the <u>Village Hall at</u>
7:30pm on Friday 27th January 2023.

Following a (short) presentation from me on the events of 2022, we will have a talk from Keith Spencer of the Wycombe Museum on "Chairmaking in the Chilterns". As ever, the evening is free and open to all, but we will be collecting £5 annual subscriptions on the day.

As I write, the Common and our Chiltern woodlands are ablaze with autumn colour, which has been the best for many years, the result of drought stress and high sugar content associated with the summer's exceptional warmth and dryness. At this time of year, deciduous trees produce a plant hormone which signals the leaves to break down and return their chlorophyll (which, of course, gives them their normal green colour) so it can be stored for reuse in next year's foliage. Once their chlorophyll has gone, the leaves drop off.

But, if you look closely at the yellow and brown leaves carpeting the floor of the woods, you will spot some that still have a green segment. This is the result of tiny insects called 'leaf miners' – constituting around 1,000 different species of moths, beetles, flies, and

sawflies – which lay their eggs on a leaf, providing both a source of food and protection for the growing larvae. In order to keep eating for longer, the leaf miners block the plant hormone, so their section of the leaf remains green.

Leaf miners can be a serious garden pest (and there's a leaf miner moth currently attacking many of our horse chestnut trees, leaving their leaves curled and brown, even in summer), but the results are only cosmetic, with no threat to the plant.



Meanwhile, our working parties continue in full swing and take place on most Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Local Tales: Pits and Dips.

Anyone walking through local woodland can't fail to notice the number of pits. Not just the small ones about the size that might hold an unwanted dining table but pits large enough to hold a house or two. The small ones were often dug so that a felled tree could be dragged across to be sawn into manageable lengths to be loaded onto a cart. Larger and deeper ones would allow sawyers to reduce logs to boards or fence posts on the spot. However, the really large pits can be, for me, quite humbling. They must have been excavated over many years by many men - and what for? Some for flints to build houses and walls or to lay for tracks and roads. Others for gravel to help bind the flints on the roads. Pits for sand or stone, chalk or clay. All dug by pick and shovel.

What is clear is that many of the woods we now stroll through for peace and quiet were once industrial areas. The dips and ridges, banks and pathways all record human activity and a purpose now largely forgotten. You may notice the way many tracks and paths follow the contours of our hills to keep a level or incline that a laden horse could manage. You can also see that the tracks often run along the side of a slope so that pits can be excavated into the hillside. This allowed the materials to be loaded into carts in the pit itself and pulled out on the level, onto the track to be taken away. When, what was sought, could only be found on flatter ground materials had to be lifted out of the excavation by bucket or by a crane made from tree branches.

These workings can be found all around us including on the Common. But of course, our main industrial area was Walters Ash where the best clay for making bricks was found. It is not known for certain when the industry first started. The Romans made bricks, but when they left, brickmaking is not mentioned by writers until the fifteenth century. Rex Leaver in his book: Naphill & Walters Ash: Looking Back at Village Life, says much about the industries beginnings here, but when I was a boy in the forties, Brown Brothers and Bristow Brothers were the two brickmakers. Some of my family including one brother were involved and I remember being persuaded to undertake perhaps the dirtiest job of all - throwing coke at a sieve to extract dust to mix with the clay and water (a process called 'pugging'). A skilled maker would take the pugged clay and might make 1,000 bricks in a day.

At that time, like many others in the village, I enjoyed playing around and on the brickfield pond. The pond was there as a source of water for the pugging but when the puggers were away we could play, even learn to swim. My elder brothers and cousin had built a raft with planks tied to empty oil drums and on it we could paddle out to sea. This was more dangerous than we realized. The pond had first been dug to extract the clay and was deep, with steep sides which meant falling in was a lot easier than climbing out. I discovered this one day when Robbie Holland, my next-door neighbour in Stocking Lane, managed to fall in. The water came up to his shoulders. With a struggle he pulled himself out. He looked at me and said that he would have to go home. We set off running through the lines of skinttled bricks drying in the sun, out of the yard and on across the fields now built over by the RAF camp, on past Knox's wood, down the fields and across Clappins Lane, up the 'sledging' field, past the Plantation, across more fields when we at last reached the field bordering Stocking Lane and we could see our houses. There, to my surprise, Robbie stopped, turned to me and said -"d'you know what?- I'm completely dry!" So, we turned round and ran back to the brickfields.

Reading my article from last November reminds me of the positive progress Hughenden Street Association continues to make across the parish. Its success is very much down to our team of local volunteers. In Naphill & Walter's Ash Susan Bickerstaffe has really helped to deliver our priorities particularly around reducing social isolation with the monthly Pub Lunch at the Black Lion. The Gazette continues to be a stalwart supporter of the Association, and we are grateful for this.

Buckinghamshire Council has provided much-needed funding for some marketing materials that we will be using in 2023 and I would like to thank Jackie Binning, North West Chilterns Community Board Co-ordinator for her support which has been incredible.

2022 has been a challenging year and it looks as though 2023 will be even more so. The Cost-of-Living Crisis will define 2023 and we will all be affected in some way. We cannot help but be moved by the plight of people living day to day worrying about putting food on the table and whether they can turn on the heating. The Association has repeatedly asked residents to support local food banks including One Can Trust. According to the Trussell Trust, an established national poverty campaigning organisation, it has delivered 1.3 million food parcels across the UK in the six months to September 2022 with half a million of these parcels being delivered to children. The data collected since 2017 makes for depressing reading. In 2017, 1,228 adults and 623 children in Buckinghamshire received food parcels from the Trust. By September 2022, the numbers have risen to 5,975 adults and 3,481 children.

The Trust comments: 'Hunger in the UK is not about food. It is about a lack of income, leaving people without enough money to afford the essentials. This could be due to problems with the benefits system (delays, inadequacy, and deductions), challenging life experiences or ill health, or lack of informal or formal support' The Trust has over 1,300 food banks and there are more than 1,100 independent food banks as well as those run by the Salvation Army, schools, and hospitals. In addition, there are also food aid providers including soup kitchens and social supermarkets. At the G20 Summit in November 2022 the Prime Minister said that it is a 'tragedy that food banks are needed' however he is grateful that they are there. For the increasing number of individuals and families food banks are a lifeline however the fundamental issues need to be addressed if the doors are ever to close.


After the service everybody gathered around the Stone and wreaths were laid by many village organisations.



Growing Your Own

I walked into the police station. A hatch opened and a uniformed police officer appeared. "I am looking for a twelve-foot worm" I said. His eyes glazed a little and he had the kind of look as if to say "another one has walked out of that place down the road". But I persevered. "The guide book says that somewhere near here is a tourist venue where giant worms are on display, some up to twelve-feet long and some with a diameter of over six inches". At that he began to recall something. He used to patrol up and down the coast road from Melbourne going east, and he recalled that there used to be a display of giant worms near the village of Bass, but he believed that it was now a second-hand shop or something. (1)

So I was frustrated, unable to see the giant worms found in the area of South-West Gippsland, near Melbourne, Australia. I would have welcomed the opportunity of having my photograph taken with a giant worm, to give this article credibility, and to jest "you should have seen the size of the blackbird which carried this one off". However, my plans came to nothing so you will just have to the take my word for it – giant worms up to twelve feet long do exist in that part of Australia. They are called "megascolides australis" and are the World's largest earthworms.

I am fascinated by worms because they do the digging for me. I spread a three-inch layer of well-rotted farmyard (ie cow) manure or compost on a third of my soil every year and grow crops in it. Over three years the worms pull the manure or compost down into the soil until it is completely mixed and I can then sow small seeds such as carrots. (In year 2 the second third of my allotment receives the manure, and so on.) The worms create vertical holes, allowing oxygen from the air to enter and be available to the bacteria etc in the soil. I therefore do not have to dig to achieve aeration of the soil. In nature nothing digs. Leaves fall, grasses die and the worms drag the debris down into the soil, thus aerating it. There is no need to dig or plough. It is wasted effort, and counterproductive because of damage to the soil ecosystem.

A very important benefit of having lots of worms is their worm-casts. The worms bring up all sorts of nutrients from deep in the soil and leave them in worm-casts which considerably enrich the top layer of soil. The nodig method leaves the worm-cast-enriched layer on the surface of the soil rather than mixing it with much deeper soil. My top layer, a mixture of soil, compost or farmyard manure and worm-casts, is a fantastic growing medium for vegetables and fruit. It is full of trace elements.

Note. (1) True story. Good gardening!

Love never fails. Video games will break, pearl necklaces will be lost, golf clubs will rust, but giving the gift of love will endure.



There are too many to name here but you know who you are, and we are very grateful for all that you do, thank you! We still desperately need more volunteers to come forward though and if we can't redress this balance, it's inevitable that we will lose these traditional events from the local calendar and the Village Hall will struggle to survive. As a community we'll then have to figure out how we can fill a £20,000 to £30,000 deficit in our Village Hall budget, answers on a postcard/DM please.

I have realised over these past 5 years that you cannot please everyone but for every complaint or disparaging comment on social media, we have received so many positive comments from the vast majority of people who have enjoyed the firework displays! During the Sunday morning clean up this year, we had our most positive feedback yet! A little boy, who had inspiringly dragged his dad out to help us pick up debris on the Crick, told us that Naphill Fireworks 2022 was the best night of his life! It makes it all so worthwhile and reminds us why we do it, we are creating positive memories for the next generation of children.

It is time for me for me to sign out now, my time as chairman has run its course. It has been a real honour to play my small part in such a fantastic local event. Whoever takes over, I would personally like to wish them the very best of luck and they can count on my full support along with the backing of an amazing committee and group of local volunteers.

The countdown to find the next chairperson and a few other roles besides, has well and truly started! If no one steps forward, if we cannot fill these roles, we are going to need more than Harry Potter magic, we very sadly, may just have seen our last ever Naphill Fireworks Spectacular.





Household budgets for many people are severely under strain due to the increasing cost of living. We are seeing the cost of everyday essentials rise faster than average incomes - leaving people with tough decisions about how to cover their bills.

Whilst the cost of living increase could lead to an increase in crime, equally worrying is the impact crime has on the victim when finances are already tighter than usual. Victims of crime can find themselves anything from a few pounds to tens of thousands of pounds out-of-pocket.

Taking simple measures, such as locking your windows, leaving indoor lights on a timer, double or deadlocking your doors, and having exterior lights on sensors, can significantly reduce your chances of being burgled.

During the winter months we tend to see an increase in burglaries; this is due to a number of factors such as the hours of darkness being used as a cover for intruders to carry out thefts; homes and businesses being stocked up with higher value items and gifts for the festive season and people travelling and socialising leaving their homes vacant.

As we rapidly approach Christmas and the subsequent sales, it's important to remain vigilant to scammers who unfortunately look to exploit the goodwill and festive spirit at this time of year.

LATEST SCAM: A number of recent cases have been reported to us of recorded phone messages being received that purport to be from banks, One such call came from Switzerland and another one was from Spain!

They refer to sizeable suspicious transactions that are to be debited to your account that same day. The messages invite you to press '1' if you approve of these transactions, or to press '2' if you don't approve them. It goes on to say that someone will speak to you if you press '2'. These messages are very similar to genuine messages from banks.

So, do take care if you encounter them and do feel free to phone your bank to ensure that you are dealing with genuine messages.

The New Year is a time to set new goals and positive lifestyle changes; what about starting 2023 by joining our Neighbourhood Watch community?



RAF High Wycombe - Christmas Message & News







RAF High Wycombe Nepalese Heritage Centre

This year RAF High Wycombe officially opened The Nepalese Heritage Centre in a blaze of colour and joy. As a meeting place for contemplation and prayer, it reflects the high regard that the RAF base hold their Nepalese community. Traditional arts and crafts were made and donated by the Nepalese families as well as other contributors to give thanks. But before the Centre could be used for prayer and meditation, a Purification Ceremony for the gifts was required.

In this traditional ceremony, a Hindu Pandit Guru or 'Pujari' (priest) is called upon to perform a cleansing of the shrine and gifts through prayer and song. The Guru, Shivachandra Niraula, from the Queens Own Gurkha Logistic Regiment (QOGLR) in Aldershot is a fourth generation Guru who

can date his family's service back to 1890. During the ceremony candles are lit on the shrine to signify bringing light into your life, and milk, rice and sauces are sprinkled over effigies of Buddhist & Hindu gods to offer thanks. The congregation pray for the three powers of physical health, wealth, and knowledge. At the close of the ceremony the shrine, which points west, was offered flowers and grasses as a final act of thanks and gratitude. With purification complete, meditation and prayer can now commence.

The invited guests were warmly welcomed by the Guru and members of the Nepalese community on base in traditional dress, before being offered sumptuous Nepalese food and lively conversation.

A Christmas Message from Padre Andi

At this time of year, I have always had a slight frustration with the telling of the Christmas Story. Ever since being a young child I was told that the Shepherds and the Wise Men came to the manger side to worship the newly born King, Jesus Christ. Even in the 1970's movie 'Life of Brian' we see the Kings being present, initially at the wrong manger, yet soon found their way to the correct stable.

In the Bible, the story is quite different. We find the Shepherds are informed about the birth of Jesus by that most astonishing being from all creation, an Angel, not just any old angel, but the Archangel Gabriel (Luke 2). These were men who were simple folk, doing an underpaid job in difficult circumstances. The Wise men arrive, after the birth of Jesus while the Holy Family were in a house (Matthew 2); they had to study many books and interpret the stars to come and see Jesus. I have often thought about the great contrast between these two groups of people and how they came to meet Jesus. As someone who is a believer in these stories, I take great peace from them. Sometimes it is in the living of a simple life that we can draw close

to the divine nature. Sometimes we can overly complicate our lives with material concerns which no longer allow us to draw close to that which is important.

It has always been my hope that I may have the simple faith of the Shepherds, to simply follow the command of the angels, rather than be the one who is caught up in study. Yet, I suspect the world with which I inhabit draws me to become more like that of the wise men; with the media input, emails and WhatsApp messages. It is my hope that this Christmas, with all the hustle and bustle of the world, that I may seek some simplicity to stop and observe the world around me, and perhaps be like the Shepherds, simply watching and being, so that in those moments I may see something miraculous. I hope this is something that you may also have time to do during this festive period.

Naphill & Walter's Ash Residents' Association - Speed Watch

One of the activities undertaken by NAWARA is coordinating the Community Speed Watch Volunteers.

Why volunteer for Speed Watch (SW)?

There is a misconception that if you live in a rural area, you are safer on the roads than in an urban area. However, fatalities are four times more likely to happen in a rural area than in an urban area. The vast majority of homes in Naphill and Walters Ash straddle the straight Main Road. Excessive speed of the passing traffic is not just a matter of road safety but also a quality of life of issue. It causes increased vibration, noise and a feeling of being unsafe when using the road recreationally.

However, let's be honest, when some of us see SW volunteers doing a session our reaction is "Wannabe police officers" or" Policing on the cheap". Can we stop you there. SW is exclusively an education scheme. Statistics based on years of collated SW data show that an educational approach to changing drivers' behaviour works in the vast majority of cases. Hands up all those who went on a speed awareness course and actually learnt something that changed their driving behaviour (I hope that's all of you!).

Community volunteers are trained to use equipment to detect traffic through the villages not complying with the legal speed limit. The data collected is transferred to TVP who communicate directly with the vehicle

owners to remind them of the speed limits. There is a visual separation between the community volunteers and the police to protect the volunteers' integrity. The automatically generated data helps police to identify persistent offenders who would in the first instance be offered a speed awareness course but those beyond educational reach who would be a target for law enforcement. CSW online also collates DVLA data automatically about Vehicle Tax, MOT and SORN status allowing police to target those road users who do not pay their fair share for road use.

If after reading this you would like to get involved with Speed Watch and can spare an hour a month, please contact John Russell on 01494 563015. Training will be given, you will need to pass a very simple TVP test and ex speed offenders welcome!

Gordon the Bird Man

What do Little Owls, Canada Geese, Gadwall and Ring Necked Parakeets all have in common? Well, they were all introduced to the U.K. and are therefore non-native species. Over the years, together with a variety of other introduced species including Egyptian Goose and Pheasant they have become part of the established fauna we might expect to see while birdwatching. the motives behind these historical introductions include releases for sport in the cases of Pheasant and Red Legged Partridge, or for more ornamental reasons such as Mandarin Duck or Canada Goose. Many historical introductions occurred at a time when the full impact of such initiatives was little understood. These days, introductions have to be conducted under license. Not all historical introductions were successful and over the years a variety of species such as Chukar and Bobwhite have failed to become established. Escapes from private collections account for some non-natives that have become more numerous recently, such as the Eagle Owl.

The British Ornithologists Union is responsible for maintaining the British List (the official list of wild birds recorded in Great Britain) and assigns non-natives to category "E", species that have been recorded as introductions, transporters or escapees from captivity and whose British breeding populations (if any) are thought not to be self-sustaining. This category now contains almost 300 species and these species that have occurred here in an unnatural state do not count towards the official British list.

Whilst some of these introduced species sit alongside our native species without causing any apparent issues, some do invariably have a negative impact. This ranges from competition for food and nest sites to interbreeding.

The official British List, as of August 2021, stands at 627 species. These are made up of 609 species in category "A", eight species in category "B" and 10 species in category "C".

Category A includes species recorded in a natural state at least once since January 1st 1950.

Category B includes species recorded in a natural state at least once between January 1st 1800 and December 31st 1949 but not subsequently.

Category "C" includes species that though introduced, now derive from the resulting self-sustaining populations (species that have occurred only as a result of introduction and species successfully re-established by Man in areas of former occurrence, e.g. Red Kite).

Category "D" is for species where there is reasonable doubt that the species occurred in a natural state.

Category "E" is for species that have been recorded as introductions, human assisted transportees or escapees from captivity whose populations are not self-sustaining.



New Years Eve Traditions

As this is the end of year edition of the Gazette I thought it would be fun to look at some of the peculiar seasonal traditions for welcoming in the New Year from around various parts of the world.



Here in the UK the evening will most likely be spent in the pub with friends and neighbours, counting down to midnight, and singing Auld Lang Syne...... Either that or sat at home watching Jools Hollands' "Hootenanny" while knocking back a few Baileys on ice.


It was always common to bring a lump of coal indoors, to signify keeping the fire burning and the house warm. A tradition that goes back to the times of the Druids when fires were deemed sacred.



The Spanish eat twelve grapes, which symbolize each strike of the clock at midnight. Called las doce uvas de la suerte, it's a ritual started in the 19th century that is believed to ward off evil and ensure a prosperous new year. But you have to be quick. All the grapes must be eaten before the clock strikes midnight.



The Danes have a rather odd tradition of smashing plates. The plates are stacked up on the front porch during the year. They are then thrown at the front doors of friends and family. They believe that the more smashed crockery you have on your doorstep, the more luck and good fortune will fall upon you during the ensuing year.



There are quite a few traditions that definitely look towards the philosophy of 'out with the old'.



In India they burn an effigy of an old man at midnight. This symbolizes the passing of grievances from the old year and allows a clear path for the new year to be born. In Ecuador they have a similar tradition using a paper filled scarecrow. Argentines shred all old documentation from the year and throw it out of their windows, like confetti. Italians take it a step further and throw out any soft furnishings, cushions, blankets, and anything that no longer brings them joy.

In Colombia they observe the tradition of aguero. Three potatoes are placed under each family members bed. One is peeled, one unpeeled, and one only partially peeled. At midnight everyone reaches for a potato with their eyes closed. Depending of which one you retrieve you can expect a year of good fortune, financial difficulties, or a mixture of both. You can probably also expect chips for dinner on New Years Day. No bad thing, as I have always found a big bowl of salty chips the cornerstone of a robust hangover cure.
