The Christmas Fayre was held the weekend that the Christmas tree lights were switched on. The illuminated tree is a great reminder of how a group of people work together to bring a little bit of light relief to the community.

The village hall committee meeting was held on the 3rd. January and due to the covid situation it was held over Zoom with 15 members taking part. At the meeting we have commissioned a climbing survey of the ash tree near the footpath through to Downley Road and also a survey of all the trees on the crick. We received a donation from the lunch club as the club has finished due to the ongoing situation with covid. The donation was thankfully received from Pauline Pool and her helpers who have done a great job running the lunch club. The tennis club lease is in negotiation and appears to be more complex than

Village Hall Christmas Tree Lights 2021


Our spectacular tree lights never fail to bring joy! They are loved by everyone and also considered to be the best in the area.

Bradenham Parish Council

Happy New Year!

The Parish Council has sadly learned of the death of Ivor Herbert. Ivor had been Bradenham Parish Council Chairman for more than 40 years. He had been materially involved in the establishment of the "constructors road" in the 1980's, which diverted a large number of trucks away from Bradenham Wood Lane. He had also been involved with the establishment of the pavement in Bradenham. The Chairman gave thanks for Ivor's many years of service.

The National Trust have done great work on Bradenham Hill with repairing and digging out water runoffs, creating new ones and fencing them all. They have also filled in some of the very deep ruts on the track. The Parish Council is very pleased with the work that has been done and has thanked the National Trust. A trench was also dug in the field parallel to Rectory Lane to take the overflow. It is already noticeable that this work has reduced the flooding problem although it is agreed that due to the steep incline of the hill and the nature of the track the problem can never be completely alleviated. The next step is to have the many potholes on Rectory Lane patched. We are working on getting that done in the spring.

Parking on Bradenham Woods Lane is causing serious traffic issues. With many more visitors to the village it often ends up with a stream of cars waiting to pass the parked cars, as there are no passing places. The council is going to ask Transport for Buckinghamshire (TfB) for some advice. The small

unofficial carpark by the pond is always full. TfB have put down some hardcore by the edge of this carpark to ease exit and entry. The official carpark in Bradenham is actually up the hill just past the cricket club. Any good ideas on parking are always welcome.

The parish council have set it's budget and precept (parish council tax) for 2022/23. We have had to increase our precept by 4%. We will need to eat into our reserves next year to balance the books. One of our biggest expenses is grass cutting, the money we get from Buckinghamshire Council does not cover the cost. Having our dog bins emptied weekly is a considerable expense, since lock down we have had to increase the frequency of dog bin emptying.

We plan to celebrate the Queens Jubilee, we need to maintain our assets and have some new projects on the horizon. We have an aim to have a neutral budget in two years' time.

We have been investigating a quieter road surface for the A4010 through the parish. Road noise has become much more prominent in recent years.

Friends of Naphill Common

Annual General Meeting

The FoNC AGM will take place on Friday 4th February at 7:30pm in the Village Hall. After our regular business has been conducted, there will be a short talk by John Shaw of the Chiltern Rangers, who work with communities to provide practical habitat management in the Chilterns and manage 13 nature reserves for Buckinghamshire Council in the Wycombe area.

News

As mentioned in last month's article, the information board at the entrance to the Common from Downley Road has been restored superbly, by Tim Bird of Merlin Signs, who also produced the replacement sign for the Village Hall. Tim has now removed to his workshop the sign at the end of Hunts Hill Lane and it will return, fully refurbished, in due course.

The work to remove ash trees affected by the ash dieback fungus, as well as currently healthy trees along public and permissive footpaths has begun in Stocking Wood (off Stocking Lane). Ash trees that are sufficiently far from footpaths (further than the height of the tree, so they can pose no danger to walkers) are being retained and it's hoped that, in time, they will naturally regenerate the wood.

As noted in previous articles, the Common itself has relatively few ash trees, but there is a stand close to Daisy Pond, near the border with Downley Common, that will be felled in due course.

The Common

The third phase of felling is now well under way, with trunks being stacked near the end of Forge Road. The larger specimens will be made into planks, and smaller trunks cut up for firewood. More trees than hoped for are going for firewood, as many have suffered from 'windblow', the natural effect of strong winds on standing timber, which introduces weaknesses along the trunk, rendering them unsuitable for use as planks.

The wet weather has made the Common very muddy (as usual), exacerbating the effects of the heavy vehicles used in the felling work, and producing large ruts. As in previous years, these will eventually fade, but meanwhile wellies are advisable. Care is being taken not to intrude onto the archæological site of the Roman-British Farmstead near Dew Pond.

To make it easier and less messy to load the logs at the end of Forge Road, a temporary hard standing has been created. This will be removed once the felling has been completed.

Activities

Our working parties are in full swing and take place on most Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Because they are dependent on the weather, it's best to check our web site for details (where our walking and other activities are also listed):



A Message from Bradenham Vicarage

Good omens/bad omens?

Between lockdowns my husband and I fulfilled our dream of owning a boat. Covid was the spur we needed to embark on the venture (pardon the pun), so 'Schöne Maid' came into our lives. We had a great time on the Thames, but it was always our intention to take her down to the sea, which we did just before Christmas.

Being at a loose end over New Year, we decided to have a couple of days away and explore this new location with the 'Maid'. New Year's Day dawned bright and fair. The winds and sea state forecasts looked good, the tides were right; we had all we needed for our maiden voyage out into the Solent.

We had fun. Even the 'Maid' seemed to be enjoying the trip, joyfully ringing her bell as the waves playfully buffeted us. All too soon it was time to turn back. As we negotiated our return, without warning one of our engines cut out. All attempts to restart it failed, but this was not too much of a problem since we had two engines, so we limped back to our mooring.

The current, tide and winds that should have been our friends now conspired against us. Our manoeuvrability severely compromised, no matter how hard we tried, we could not get back to our pontoon. We were not in any danger, but we really needed to moor.

Always helping someone in difficulty is the unwritten rule of the sea and the owner of a neighbouring boat came to our aid. Using his tender, he helped us to moor on an empty mooring, close to our actual berth. The harbourmaster came out and escorted us to our proper place. We felt such idiots, but the harbourmaster did not judge and pointed out that this sort of thing happened to the best of mariners.

We now had to sort out the engine, so we called out 'Sea Start' – the AA of coastal waters. The engineer quickly established the problem – diesel bug. We thought we had taken all the precautions against this nasty gloop that can grow in diesel, but they hadn't been enough. The problem was solved, both engines started again and ran sweetly. The 'Maid' was ready for her next adventure.

Many people would have seen this as a really bad omen – first time out on the first day of the year beset with problems; how does this bode for the rest of 2022? We took the view it was a blessing things happened how they did. We could have been much further out in busier waters, necessitating an RNLI rescue. The problem could have occurred across both engines, leaving us drifting helplessly towards commercial shipping lanes. We learnt a huge amount that day - about our limits in a new environment, about diesel bug and experiencing first-hand the rules of the sea. We also made some new friends.

St Paul in his letter to the Thessalonians encourages us to give thanks in all things. This can be hard at times, but being thankful, seeing the good in whatever befalls and embracing a positive attitude is an ancient lesson that is more relevant today than it has ever been.

Goodbye from Padre Chrissy

Ironing out the wax!

An added duty in my role as Padre is that I occasionally am found rummaging in the recycling for brown paper and preparing the iron...getting rid of wax from the linen or the carpets at church is SO satisfying!!!! It's like some kind of magic to see the wax transfer from the fabric and onto the brown paper. It's made me think about what marks we leave on other people (not by ironing them or dripping hot wax on them!)...but how do our actions or words leave a mark on others in a way which creates part of their story.

In church recently we've been looking at a letter a guy called James wrote, to a bunch of new Christians. He writes about how powerful our words are. To build people up, and to likewise, knock people down. Think of it like this, instead of wax being ironed out of the church carpet and a mark being left not being great, but still telling a story...instead, think of wax being used in the process of dying fabric to make beautiful patterns and the potential the fabric has as a piece of art or clothing. Our words can leave a mark which tell a story, but are not best placed, or, our words can be a part of forming a beautiful part of the person's life.

This is my final article in the Gazette as I am off on deployment. So, this theme of what impression, or mark, we leave on people is something on the forefront of my mind. As I have said farewells to people and reflected on what I have done while here it's challenging to ponder on whether the mark I leave is like wax on a carpet, not ideally placed, or a mark which creates in a positive way, part of the story of individuals and a community.

In the letter James wrote, he challenges us to strive to speak good things. To choose whether what we produce is going to be salt water or fresh water...are what we going to speak be something that enables people to stand tall, or want to hide, bringing life, or bringing hurt?

Look out for Andi Chapman, the incoming Chaplain, and to all who have got this far through my articles, God bless and I pray you have words of freshwater spoken over you to continue building up your beautiful stories.







Re-Forestation And Re-Wilding

At a time when the terms re-forestation and re-wilding are in vogue it seems incongruous that companies can destroy ancient woodland. People cut down trees because they block a view or drop fruit. With local residents or councils, protests seemingly a waste of time and resources spent on them. So, I wonder how many of the millions of trees now being planted will reach maturity, or will they be cut down in thirty or forty years time in the name of progress and development.

There is a misconception that Britain up until the middle ages was covered in forest or wildwood. But while there were far more trees than now, they did not provide continuous cover. In fact, much of the ancient landscape was everchanging, governed not by forest but by water.

It is hard to imagine but up until the end of the 15th century, if you were to travel from London to York, Bristol to Southampton or Plymouth or Birmingham to Lancaster the journey would have been very difficult and very, very wet. Vast tracts of bog with a connecting network of lowland wetland with reedbeds, sedges, fens and watercourses which twisted, split and spread bearing little resemblance to our conception of what a river should be.

This complex mosaic was home to now extinct Aurochs (an ancestor of our domestic cattle), exotics such as Black Storks, Pelicans, Elk, Wolves and Bears. Species now rare like Eels, Corncrake, Bittern and Black Terns would have thrived in vast numbers, while Beavers opened the canopy continually driving a cycle of succession from wet woodland to pools and open water, followed by water meadow, scrub, then back to woodland. We now have just fragments of these wetlands, the Cheshire Mosslands, Cambridgeshire Fens, Somerset Levels and the Humberhead Levels. recently, wetland creation and expansion projects like the Great Fen, Wallasea Island and the Avalon-Steart Marshes mean we are seeing more Bitterns And Marsh Harriers and the return of Night Herons, Spoonbills, Great Cattle and Little Egrets, also Common Cranes.

If the vision of vast areas of re-wilding is to become more than just that, human communities are crucial to that vision. But with a rapid increase in population (a subject not given a mention at COP26), education and a radical change in planning laws will be required to prevent the scenario with which I started.

The dogs often become family 'pets' but have to remain outside in kennels with runs so they do not become too domesticated. Most dogs are German Shepherd dogs which start training at 10 months old. It was an enlightening and entertaining talk.

Hopefully 2022 will be a better year for everyone and we have lots of plans for making it enjoyable and fun. There will be dates for your diaries in the next gazette.



Growing Your Own

I have written before about the absence of insects which formerly used to spatter the front of my car. However, my joy in no longer having to remove the mess was tempered by the realisation that most crops are pollinated by these same insects and without pollination, many of my crops might fail. In 2021 the situation became worse. I did not see a single wasp (a great pollinator). Although wasps are not usually regarded as our friends, especially by those allergic to wasp stings, they were, until 2021, able to carry out valuable pollination. Wasps rarely sting, but will defend themselves if attacked. They are a nuisance in summer when they want to share our lunch outdoors, but I wave them away which seems to work. So, have the farmers finally won their battle against the insects, destroying them with relentless doses of toxic insecticides, etc? Of course, in doing so, the farmers are depriving themselves of pollinating insects and have to hire beehives and place them among their crops to ensure crops are pollinated.

Some of our vegetables do not need pollination before we take the crop. For example all the brassicas, the onion family and root crops, including asparagus and potatoes. However, all the bean species, tomatoes, peppers, aubergines and the members of the marrow and pumpkin families need to be pollinated. All varieties of fruit need to be pollinated, with the exception of rhubarb*. I


hand pollinate the peppers and the first trusses of tomatoes in my greenhouse since my greenhouse is an aphid-free zone. (I grow a few oxalis triangularis "purple shamrock" and marigolds in the greenhouse and never have greenfly, whitefly, blackfly etc.) In 2021 I was ever more grateful for the honey bees which pollinated my crops. I think my crops could have been much reduced had the bees not decided to search my garden and allotment for pollen. But where do they come from? Although most species of honey bee can travel up to 4 miles for food, that is about the limit and most species do not travel more than a mile. So where is the apiarist who has hives for the bees which do such a good job in our area?

I have mentioned before that about half our food is imported. The whole picture is worse than that. Farmers in this country rely on the artificial fertilisers, nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium to fertilise their land. However, we import 60% of those fertilisers, so, if we could no longer import food and fertilisers, we would have only about 25% of the food we need. It is vital that the sea lanes are kept open! Grow your own!

Happy New Year to you all! At this time of year, many set out with the best intentions of improving health and wellbeing, and becoming more physically active, but it isn't always obvious where to start. What I would recommend is going right back to basics, and start with an assessment of your posture.

You can do this yourself at home with a mirror or alternatively try engaging the observational skills of a willing family member or friend. Why not help each other?

Most, if not all, of us are aware that we don't sit or stand properly much of the time, and fear that we have little or no core strength, however the prospect of hours of sit ups, to improve the situation, seems even more daunting that the potential impacts of doing nothing about it.

The good news is that you can assess, and start to improve these areas yourself, and even better, there are more fun and functionally useful ways to improve core stability and strength, than doing endless sit ups - (my clients will attest to this).

Step 1 - Achieve Neutral posture and practice coming in to it whenever you are standing. The more you do it, the more natural It will become.

Stand tall and check the following:

- Place feet hip width apart
- Ensure the knees are soft (neither bent nor locked out)
- Hips and lower back are in neutral To find your neutral, place the hands on the hips and gently rock the hips backwards and forwards, work through your full range of movement.
 Neutral will be in the centre of the movement.
 In this position, your hip bones and pubic bone should be vertically level with each other. You will notice that there is a natural curve in the lower back.
- The tummy should be gently pulled in (imagine pulling your belly button towards the spine)
- The shoulders should be away from the ears and shoulder blades pulled back and down and arms down by your side
- The neck should be long, the chin parallel to the floor and eyes fixed on the horizon.

In this position there is minimal stress on the joints and spine.

Step 2 - Back to basics core activation

Whilst standing tall in your neutral posture, imagine you have a corset around your middle which runs from below the ribs to your hips, place your hands on the sides of your body just above the hip bones. Now imagine tightening the corset all the way around your middle and hold for a couple of seconds and release. You should feel the core muscles all around your middle activating. Don't worry if you don't feel this all the way round at first, but do keep practicing and it will come.

The muscles you are activating here are the core stabiliser muscles which provide support and protection of the spine and lower back as we move. Correct use and balance of these muscles between the front and back of the body provides protection against injury and helps reduce the risk of lower back pain. They are (or should be) the first muscles to activate before any movement.

Red & Grey

Around 25 years ago an eclectic mix of High Wycombe based people sat at a jam session wondering whether they were good enough to play to an audience and if so, what on earth to call their band. The four of them, a policeman, an architect, a probation officer and an employee relations manager had little in common beyond a love of rock music. Looking around the room, one of the men noticed that he and his male band mates were all beginning to go grey, whereas their lady singer had a shock of red hair. At this point the band name was born and because all of the members had 'day jobs' and were playing music for fun rather than income, they decided to devote their musical efforts to supporting charities. They adopted Cancer Research U.K. as their principal charity but resolved to play free for any charitable causes.

In the years since their formation, Red & Grey have undergone several line-up changes but have remained true to their cause, having donated around £12,000 to C.R.U.K. and played for other charities such as M.S. They've played all over Bucks and Oxfordshire and as far away as Wales and even on one occasion in Germany.

"We'd never ask a fee from a charity ", said Robin (Drummer and original member), "All we look for is a meal and a couple of drinks and we're happy to support a good cause. When we do paying gigs such as pub evenings, we donate 75 percent of our fee to charity, just retaining a small amount for band expenses such as our Public Liability Insurance".

Simon, (Rhythm Guitar and the other original member) comments: "We've never lost our enjoyment of playing live and we now have our strongest line-up ever".

Having played Napfest twice and Hazlemere Fete on several occasions, the band's biggest gig was at Silverstone Racing Circuit, playing to several hundred people in a huge marquee. "We went down so well that the crowd wouldn't let us go. We actually ran out of songs and had to repeat one!" said Kevin (Bass Guitarist).

As part of their ongoing desire to play music and raise funds for deserving causes, Red & Grey are planning a benefit concert for C.R.U.K. at Hughenden Valley Village Hall on Sat. 26th Feb 2022. If past events are anything to go by, this should be a great evening to dance to, sing along with, or just listen to some of your favourite songs, whilst helping raise money for C.R.U.K.






