Naphill Village Hall & Playing Fields Council Chairman's Report

The village hall committee met on Monday 9 January. Among items discussed were the playground where the swing fames have been condemned. One quote to replace them was £10,000 to £12,000. We decided to review our options including obtaining a grant or perhaps sponsorship from a local company.

We agreed to install new doors at the entrance from the car park at a cost of over £4000, it has taken over 3 years to obtain quotes for this project. It was also agreed that a new hot water unit would be purchased to replace the existing one that has stopped working, hopefully this will be under £1000. Chris Keats has drawn up a new contract for grass cutting and hedge trimming and this will be passed out to various contractors for quotes.

The new heating system was also discussed and although the new boilers are working well there are still some problems with the original pipework. The plumber that we used has been contacted and has come up with a couple of solutions but with such a system it is going to be difficult to rectify the problem.

It was also noted that dog fouling on the crick is on the increase. The football players have to clear this up before they can play! With children playing on the crick the fouling is a health and safety risk. If this problem is not alleviated then the village hall council will have to consider banning dogs from the crick. Please remember that the crick is not a public area and the committee can take steps to ensure that it is a pleasant area for all who use it!

Fundraising events were discussed and the Music Night will be on Friday 9 June and Classics on Sunday 11 June. A village Fete day could be held on Saturday 10 June but at the moment there are not enough helpers to make the event viable. The village hall does struggle to find volunteers for the events that it organises. It would be great if more people gave a small amount of time to help organise these events, even a couple of hours a month would be a help. There are many ways to help, from making phone calls to typing up minutes and supporting the fundraising committees. If you would like to consider helping please get in touch with me. You can email me, chairman@naphillvillagehall.org.uk. Please do not let these events fade away through lack of community support.

The King's coronation is on Saturday 6 May. It has been suggested that a fireworks display is organised in the evening. More ideas as to how the community might celebrate this momentous occasion are welcome! We appreciate that many people will be watching the televised ceremony which will be finished in the early afternoon so planned activities will need to be later in the day. We do not have many coronations so let's make the most of this one!

Bradenham Parish Council

The Council met for the first time this year on Monday January 9th 2023. Cllr. Robert Carington attended and was able to update the Parish Council on some Buckinghamshire matters.

The Bledlow re-cycling centre will open on January 16th. Full details of opening times are available on www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/bledlow-hrc

The site will open Friday to Tuesday inclusive. Oxfordshire residents will be charged to use the centre. Bucks residents will need to show proof of residency.

The contractors' error in white lining Bradenham Woods lane has not been rectified despite two sets of remedial work being carried out. The contractor's contract has now finished without the remedial work

being completed satisfactorily. Cllr Carington will take this up with the unitary authority. High tension cabling for the new data centre at the old Molins site has started to be laid along Bradenham Woods Lane. The budget for 2022/23 was agreed, using come of our reserves in 23/24. The precept for 2023/24 was set with an increase of 2% on 22/23.

The Council is organising a small working party to plan for the village coronation celebrations. The church and the cricket club will be involved.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on March 13th at 7pm. 回版版画

Council Report from Coucillor Simon Kearey received 20 January 2023

We wish everyone in the parish a very happy New Year.

One of our most important activities in the first months of 2023 is a tendering process for the maintenance of hedges, verges and grounds. Hughenden Parish is a bit unusual in that the Parish Council owns about twenty plots of meadow, woodland and amenity land. The Council hasn't thoroughly reviewed how it wants to manage and maintain the land for many years. We are now taking the first steps to take a fresh look in the light of the local and global ecological and climate challenges we face. A small first step was to support the planting of wildflowers by the Hughenden Valley Climate Action Group at the road junction at the Harrow Pub. This will involve mowing the verge there on fewer occasions each year.

We are reletting the maintenance contracts for verge, hedge and grounds maintenance for just one year. During that time, we intend to develop a Site Management Plan for the larger plots of land, in consultation with residents. For example, we might wish to encourage grazing rather than mowing on meadows, but this might have implications for dogwalkers that need to be discussed. We intend the Site Management Plans to form the basis of future maintenance contracts.

In our updates last year, we encouraged local organisations to apply for small grants if they needed support to provide services of benefit to parishioners. Grant applications dried up during the Pandemic years, but we are pleased to see the number of grant requests increasing. In recent months we have provided grants to residents associations to produce gazettes and newsletters, and to Bryants Bottom Community Trust to help maintain the Village Green. We have also provided two benches on the amenity field at Primrose Hill.

We are sorry that our Clerk, Emily Ranahan, left us in December and we are currently recruiting a Clerk. The position of the Parish Clerk, the parish's executive officer, is vital to the smooth running of the parish. Please check the job advert here if you think this important position in the local community might be of interest to you. We also have a few vacancies for Councillor positions in Hughenden Valley, Widmer End and Naphill & Walters Ash. If you think you could contribute to the local community by serving as a Parish Councillor, please contact clerk@hughendenpc.gov.uk for an application form. We are pleased to have three new Councillors on board, Usha Prashar

representing Naphill & Walters Ash, Marc Byrom representing Hughenden Valley and Jaye Hawkins representing Great Kingshill.

In January, the Parish Council agreed to adopt the streetlights in Widmer End. There has been considerable uncertainty as to the ultimate ownership and responsibility for the lights, and this has caused residents of Windmill Estate much anxiety. After an exhaustive effort to get to the source of the ownership of the lights, the Council decided that the Parish was the most likely owner, and that the right course of action was for us to adopt the lights, ending uncertainty for the residents. A Working Group including Councillors and representatives of Widmer End Residents Association and Windmill Estate Maintenance Company are now working on ways to improve the efficiency of the lighting.

The Council has also initiated a project to renovate the playgrounds at Great Kingshill and Templewood. A consultant has been appointed to guide us through the process. The first phase will be to consult with residents and equipment suppliers and establish a scope for the Council to consider.

Don't fall for romance fraud this Valentine's Day!

Romance frauds happen when the victim thinks they've met the perfect partner through an online dating website or app, but the other person is using a fake profile to form a relationship with them. They're using the site to gain the victim's trust and then ask them for money or enough personal information to steal their identity.

Spotting Romance Fraud:

Generally, the scam starts with an initial contact by the scammer. Their profile picture is very attractive. It's common for scammers to use stolen photographs of beautiful people. You can check whether someone's profile picture is associated with anyone else by accessing the website in Google Chrome, right-clicking on the picture and then clicking 'Search Google for image'.

The scammer asks you a lot of questions about yourself. This is because the more information they know about you, the easier you will be to manipulate.

The discussion is friendly at first but turns romantic very quickly.

Eventually, the scammer asks you to lend them money. They use any number of reasons: they need help to pay for the flight or other transport to meet you, medical care, or they have a great business or investment opportunity that could benefit both of your futures.

Protecting Yourself From Romance Fraud:

Just because there are some mean, dishonest people out there doesn't mean you have to stop using dating sites altogether. If you're using social media sites like Facebook, don't accept friend requests from people you don't know.

Don't give away too many personal details about yourself online. Revealing your full name, date of birth and home address could lead to your identity being stolen.

NEVER send or receive money or give away your bank details to someone you've only met online. If anyone asks for your financial details stop communicating with them immediately and report them to the dating site.

Use reputable dating sites. Fraudsters will want you to quickly switch to using text messages, social media or telephone so there is no evidence on the dating site of them asking you for money, so keep communicating through the dating site messaging service.

Friends of Naphill Common

I hope everyone had an enjoyable Christmas and New Year and that the coughs and sneezes going around didn't interfere with the festivities too much. Writing this in mid-January, it already seems quite a long time ago!

The refurbishment of our five information boards at the entrances to the Common has been a slow but steady process that has now completed successfully. Tim Bird, the specialist from Merlin Signs in Hatters Lane, has done a wonderful job, and they are all looking pristine. We need to keep an eye on the supports, one of which has already been found to have rotted and been replaced, as reported previously.

The cost of the project was £1,356 and Buckinghamshire Council have subsidised half of this amount, for which we are very grateful.

At this time of year, our garden birds (but not, as explained in previous columns, our beautiful red kites, which will find plenty to scavenge without our help) need food and water on a regular basis. Birds need water, not only to drink, but also to clean their feathers, so make sure that any water bowls are ice free during cold weather. In severe weather, feed twice daily if you can: in the morning and in

the early afternoon. Birds require high-energy (high-fat) foods during the cold winter weather to maintain their fat reserves to survive the frosty nights. Use only good-quality food and scraps.

Always adjust the quantity given to the demand, and never allow uneaten foods to accumulate around the feeders. Once you establish a feeding routine, try not to change it as the birds will become used to it and time their visits to your garden accordingly. Good hygiene is vital in all seasons, or feeding may do more harm than good. Keep your garden birds healthy by cleaning feeders, bird tables and bird baths, to keep the birds that use them, fit, healthy and disease free.

Meanwhile, our working parties continue in full swing and take place on most Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Because they are dependent on the weather, it's best to check our web site for details (where our walking and other activities are also listed):

As we write, the school is very excited and is looking forward to celebrating Chinese New Year next week!





Why do dogs sniff?

It can be really inconvenient when you're in a hurry, or the weather is particularly bad and all your dog wants to do is stop and sniff at every opportunity on a walk.

Have you ever considered why your dog sniffs at every opportunity? Dogs are able to understand and appreciate smells they encounter in ways that we can barely comprehend. Letting our dogs sniff and explore not only allows them to gather information, a bit like reading the local village gazette, but it can be relaxing and mentally stimulating as well.

There are many factors that can cause stress in our dogs, from changes in household routines, which over the past couple of years, many of our dogs will have experienced, to a visit to the vet or pet groomer. Taking your dog on different types of walks, including dog-led walks can be a great way to reduce stress and help build your dog's resilience. Dogled walks are where you let your dog take the lead on where you go and they set the pace. It can be beneficial for us too, to take a few minutes at a more leisurely pace!

- Time give yourself time to go on a dog-led walk whenever you can
- Safe Space ensure that wherever you are, you and your dog are in a safe space, away from dangers and hazards.
- Treats take your dog's favourite treats or toys to ensure that if they are off the lead, you can recall them when you need to
- Long line/lead if your dog is easily distracted and therefore their recall isn't consistent, consider a long line or lead, so that you can still enjoy a dog-led walk, without the worry of them losing you
- Stimulation- it is always satisfying to bring home a tired and happy dog from physical exercise, but your

- dog needs to use its nose-brain connection for mental stimulation too which can be through dog-led exercise, as well as tricks and dog classes
- All dogs/breeds/ages all dogs can benefit from dogled exercise, including those that are unable to walk far, due to age or medical conditions. In addition, high energy/high anxiety dogs can really benefit to bring their stress levels down

What are you waiting for – grab your dog and lead and enjoy some dog-led adventures. Remember – there is no such thing as bad weather, just inappropriate clothing!

Home Thoughts from "Home" Abroad

Having moved house last November, we have relocated again! Not permanently, but temporarily – to Gibraltar. Retiring from paid ministry in the Church of England, my partner (Hugh) has taken up a voluntary position as a locum port chaplain with the Mediterranean Mission to Seafarers. This involves living in Gibraltar in two month 'shifts', alternating with another port chaplain. I now find myself living as a native in a culture that is new to me – or rather, newish.

Gibraltar is a curious, cosmopolitan amalgam of 200 or so years of trying-not-to-be-Spanish-anymore combined with Moorish, British, military and seafaring cultures (to name but a few). Parts of it could not be more British, the historic naval dockyards being almost identical to those in Portsmouth and Devonport. Limestone cliffs and rocky shorelines could easily be those of Plymouth Hoe (I fooled my Plymothian brother with a photograph of said cliffs!). Eateries abound selling traditional British fare; we have M&S, John Lewis and many other British shops. Equally, we have Moroccan, Indian, Japanese, Spanish, Mexican, Thai, Kosher, Halal and Irish hostelries that cater for almost any culinary whim or cultural necessity. It's abroad, but also home.

We live in a flat next to the cruise ship terminal, and never know from one day to the next who our neighbours will be. Sometimes it may be a huge container ship or another form of cargo carrier, but we also see ferries, cruise liners, super yachts and the occasional marine research vessel. The port tugs, pilot boats, tenders, dredgers and the like give some form of stability to the transient populations that live and work here. In addition, we have a great view of the aviation traffic as commercial or military aircraft come and go along the famous runway which opens and

closes to allow for the everyday passage of commuters to-ing and fro-ing from Spain (or the supermarket).

Having already downsized once, we have downsized again. The flat is of a good size by Gibraltar standards, but for years it has been a bit of a bachelor pad, quite Spartan and equipped with a motley assortment of incomplete dinner services, pots, pans and some 'interesting' gadgets. We had only the vaguest of idea of what we would find but furnished with the promise of a fully serviced two bedroom flat, some photographs and a crudely drawn floor plan, we agreed to give this project a try as we believed God was calling us to a new adventure in ministry.



Local Tales - Update on "Hanging Man" article - November 2022

One of the problems of writing the 'Local Tales' is that I am reliant on my memory and the precision of the villagers at the time of the incident so please don't expect 100% accuracy. This problem emerged after my piece entitled 'The Hanging Man' in the



short ceremony marking the crash of the Lancaster at Bellingdon, one of the audience gathered at the site, mentioned that the rear gunner parachuted out in a field near to Bellingdon and Ashridge. If that is correct, he is not the man at Vivaldi. So our mystery remains.

Perhaps you will forgive my errors as I would have

November 2022 edition of the NWA Gazette. You may recall that the story concerned a parachutist who had landed in a tree at the edge of the wood in Stocking Lane just beside the house 'Vivaldi' which all those years ago was occupied by the Mead family. Fortunately, Nick Cliffe of North Dean has been able to correct some of my errors. Nick is a aircraft enthusiast and has access to information about aircraft crashes that I did not know existed. He tells me that the parachutist was probably not from the Mosquito that crashed in the field next to Piggotts Hill. The Mosquito had a crew of only two men and both were killed in the crash.

Perhaps you will forgive my errors as I would have been only six at the time and the two girls who first saw the man hanging in the tree outside their bedroom window would have been either six or seven.

There are at least two other possibilities of aircraft that crashed nearby. A Hurricane came down in woods at Lacey Green in 1940, but the pilot bailed out over Amersham. (Sadly he was killed in Greece in the following year.) It is much more likely that the Hanging man was the rear gunner in a Lancaster bomber. This was a Pathfinder aircraft returning from a raid on Chemnitz in Saxony. Pathfinder aircraft did not carry bombs. Instead they carried flares which could be dropped over the target to show where following bombers could drop their bombs. It seems that a remaining flare ignited inside the aircraft as it was returning to its base in

Local Tales - Loopy Thompson

Until his death a few years back, everyone in the village would have known Loopy Thompson. He lived in a brick and flint house on the Main Road roughly opposite the Black Lion pub. Not many would have called him 'Loopy' to his face and to us children he was always 'Mr Thompson'. None-the-less he was known to all as 'loopy', yet he was certainly not seriously crazy - just a little eccentric and very likeable.

I believe Loopy spent his working life in a furniture factory, but he had become the village barber. He cut the hair of boys and men in a little wooden shed on the lawn at the side of his house. I seem to remember that he charged 6d for boys and 9d for adults (2½p and 3¾p). He had a few stock jokes: he would ask us boys if we wanted our hair cut for courting or fighting, or he would say that he had two styles to choose from: a Parisian Topknot or a Piccadilly Fringe. To both we had to reply by asking 'What's the difference Mr Thompson?' and he would then say 'There baint none' – which was considered hilariously funny.

His shed was about 6' square. The walls were lined not with wallpaper but with sandpaper, with the back of the sheets outwards. There was a Windsor chair in the middle for the customer and a chairs in each corner where men would sit and smoke while waiting their turn. In winter, with the door shut, you left feeling and smelling like a kipper. He was a great talker and this could be very inconvenient if the customer had an appointment to keep – perhaps he wanted to get to the Camp Pictures before the film started.


Loopy kept a (loaded) 12-bore shotgun in the shed and if he suspected that there were pigeons attacking his cabbages, he would nip out and have a shot at them while his customer sat half trimmed waiting for the bang. On the ceiling of the shed was another gun wired into place. I could see that this was a rusty old muzzle-loading shotgun of considerable antiquity. It had a bore about 3/4inch (2 cm) diameter. One day while having

my hair cut, I said to Loopy "That is a remarkable old gun, what age is it?" His response was to say: "you can have it." So I left carrying what was probably an early 19th or late 18th century shotgun.

A friend of mine gave me a leather shot horn and a copper powder horn and I went to Georges the iron monger in Wycombe and bought some gun powder and some shot, plus a little tin of percussion caps. (They were allowed to sell such things in those days.) The gun was equipped with a ram-rod and had a little nipple on the top of the barrel for a percussion cap, so it was fairly clear how to use it. My main concern was that it might not be safe to fire it. Holding an ancient rusty gun next to your face and pulling the trigger seemed a rather silly thing to do. So, to test it I tied a rope around the trunk of a tree and hung the gun from that. I had poured a measure of powder down the barrel followed with a wad of newspaper, then some shot followed by another wad; all rammed down tight by the rod provided. I tied a length of string to the trigger, stood back and fired. Apart from the loud bang, the result was not as I had expected. I had not tied the rope tightly enough and the gun whizzed backwards round the tree spraying out the shot. I was lucky not be injured and learned a lesson about how stupid I was. None-the-less the gun had not burst so I had also learnt that it was usable.

During the War and for some decades after our family, like many others in the village, relied on rabbits, pigeons and even the occasional pheasant to supplement the meagre meat ration. Snares, ferrets, nets and shotguns were familiar to most young lads. But as I aged I became less fond of the idea of killing wild animals even for food. I eventually I disposed of the old gun and, as its safety was doubtful, I felt that I ought not to pass it to anyone else, so I threw it in a pond.



Toddle In Group nurturing curious minds

Cold crisp days and hibernation

Brrrr, it has certainly been a chilly few weeks. The children have all been coming in to Nursery wrapped up in hats, scarves, gloves and thick coats so we can keep exploring outside. Today, the children are going on a frosty welly walk across the field. We are tuning in to the sounds of Winter. How do you get a pothole fixed and other highway issues?

The weather cycle of alternating heat, wet, cold causes damage to our roads which becomes very evident in winter months. The quickest way to get this situation resolved is to report it on https://fixmystreet.buckscc. gov.uk. The advantage of doing it this way is you can see if other residents have reported the pothole and should you have the misfortune to suffer damage to your vehicle at a later date you have evidence that you or another resident has reported the problem.

Yet again the daily lives of residents of Naphill and Walters Ash are being disrupted by roadworks due to end 2nd March. This time it's G2 Energy India Ltd putting a high voltage grid connection to Saunderton. NAWARA will be discussing how utilities, etc, communicate planned traffic disruption with residents at our next meeting and investigate whether there is a way to improve communications.

Public rights of way-What are they?

The one thing I noticed when I moved to this area was the numerous bridle/footpath signs and it's a really pleasure to be able to walk unhindered in the beautiful countryside but I wasn't a 100% sure what the difference was or whether a right of way is the same as a footpath. To avoid confusion, you can walk on all public rights of way but some public rights of way are also open to horse riders, cyclists or motorists. You can use:

- footpaths for walking, running, mobility scooters or powered wheelchairs
- bridleways for walking, horse riding, bicycles, mobility scooters or powered wheelchairs
- restricted byways for any transport without a motor and mobility scooters or powered wheelchairs
- byways open to all traffic for any kind of transport, including cars (but they're mainly used by walkers, cyclists and horse riders)

A clause in the 2000 The Countryside and Rights of Way Act stated that any pre-1949 rights of way must be recorded on the definitive maps by the 1st January 2026 or the right would be extinguished if not properly recorded. This was an enormous task requiring evidence that the right of way had been used for "at least" 20 years without hinderance. Thankfully last year interested parties finally got agreement that this requirement would be rescinded. However, if you are interested in whether your favourite walk is on the definitive map you can find the information at https://prow.buckscc.gov.uk/ standardmap.aspx or if you want to find out how to get a footpath on the definitive map https://www.oss.org.uk or contact NAWARA. We hold membership of the Open Space Society on behalf of residents.

Planning Applications

This December was very unusual in that there were no planning applications for NAWARA to discuss, not sure if it's a first! If you want a quick link to local planning applications you will find it on our website.



A long standing record was broken in week ending 18-12-2022, with 32 species of birds recorded in the garden that week, beating the previous total of 29 set in the second week of January 2009. Three species I would have expected, Jay, Pheasant and Green Woodpecker failed to appear but this was amply compensated by sightings of a pair of Blackcaps, a Goldcrest and Grey Wagtail.

To those of us who garden, the summer of 2022 will be remembered as one where it was difficult to keep a garden looking it's best and allotments producing as well as we would like. So spare a thought for an area of a country which has not seen any meaningful rain in three years.

My late wife and I were lucky to be able to visit many countries in Africa over a period of 45 years, first visiting Kenya in 1972 and again in 1979 where we unexpectedly met a friend in the lounge of our hotel in Nairobi. he promptly invited us to the launch of the David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust. Later David and his wife Daphne came over to our table, not I

hasten to add, because of us but to see our friend David Shepherd. David, at this time, was head of the Kenyan Wildlife Service, charged with stopping the ivory trade, which was rife at this time. Daphne, after some years of experimenting and heartbreak, had finally come up with a milk formula that a baby Elephant could digest. Up until this time, any orphan under one year old had only a slim chance of survival. Since this time 344 orphans have been successfully raised and reintegrated into the wild with a further 137 currently in care.

In view of the drought, 32 boreholes have been drilled over the past three years. This entails puddling the red Tsavo soil to a depth of 30 – 100 centimetres and 15 metres across. These are solar powered by day with wind turbines by night to provide a water source for all wildlife, 24 hours a day.

Sadly, both David and Daphne have passed away but their legacy lives on through their daughter Angela.









A Litte About the David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust

Born from one family's passion for Kenya and its wilderness, the Sheldrick Wildlife Trust was established 45 years ago and is best known for its Orphans' Project, the first and most successful elephant orphan rescue and rehabilitation program in the world. The Sheldrick Wildlife Trust is a pioneering conservation organisation, dedicated to the protection of wildlife and the preservation of habitats in East Africa.



Growing Your Own

The Office for National Statistics has reported that, compared with one year earlier, food prices increased by 16.6% in November. All the more reason to grow your own. Nuff said.

I am about to start my first season without my allotment, so I need to make the vegetable plot in my garden as productive as possible. It is also an opportunity to cease growing some of the crops which were more difficult, or less popular in the kitchen. Also, for reasons of lack of land, I will not be growing crops which demand a lot of space, such as potatoes and my beloved asparagus. So, what shall I grow, what are my favourites which taste good and will give a good crop from a small space?

My "Top of the Pops" will probably surprise you. It is poirée, which I have grown here for 49 years. It is a leaf vegetable, difficult for supermarkets to sell since the leaves are difficult to handle and they go limp too quickly. However, straight from the garden they are great. The stems are about 2.5 feet high, and although the outer green leaves can be eaten as a superior form of spinach, it is the broad white stems which are the best bits. The stems can be 3 inches wide and should be washed, cut into chunks, and boiled with a little lemon juice to stop them going brown whilst being cooked. The slightly lemon flavour adds to the gastronomic experience. They go equally well with meat and fish. One has a crop in the autumn, then the frost knocks them down, then in spring up they come again and they are among the first vegetables to crop. Yes, two crops per year! It is the only vegetable I know which produces two crops per year, and the second crop is obtained at the height of the "hungry gap" in late spring when there are few other vegetables to crop. Muntjac deer, connoisseurs of allotment produce, put them at the top of their wish list and will go to great lengths to steal the crop. They will tear away any fleece or plastic netting put over as protection. They will jump any enclosure fence when they realise the precious crop is inside. However, I found that steel chicken wire simply draped over the crop stops them every time.

The seeds are very easy to grow and the plants are robust. For many years I obtained my seeds from France, but about 15 years ago the seedsmen in the UK cottoned on to this fabulous vegetable and started selling them as "silver chard". So you do not need to go to France to stock up on wine with the excuse that you are just going to obtain some poirée seeds, you simply have to visit your local garden centre! Not as much fun as going to France, but there you go.

Tips for Taking Good Pet Photographs

Following the Christmas competition in the Gazette for most festive pet, several people have asked for some tips of how to take good pictures of your pets. Now I should say go and get professional pictures taken as they will have good backgrounds and understand how to choose the right light and get the best positions for the camera. However, this is not always possible or within everyone's budgets so let explore some tips of how you can do this at home with your camera .

- 1. Find a space which is clear of anything in the background and has access to good windowlight. You will need to be able to get far enough away from your pet so that you can get complete shots of them as well as close ups
- 2. Put something your pet likes on the floor a rug, jumper or blanket so they are comfortable and happy that this is their space
- 3. Make sure there is plenty of light falling on your chosen area if you are going to use a flash please don't point it directly in the dog's eyes, point it to the ceiling and use the bounced light
- 4. Get your pet to sit on your chosen area using a soft voice and get them to sit or rest where you want them. Have treats on hand to help bribe them if necessary
- 5. Once in place talk to them to reassure them and then focus on their eyes as this will come across in the photos
- 6. Get down to your pet's level rather than taking them from above as this is much more flattering for them.
- 7. Shoot your pictures as portrait and landscape and full and close up as this will give a better set of images
- 8. Add their favourite toy or human and make it fun but try not to get them too excited as this make the picture taking process far harder Hopefully this will give you some great pictures.

Stocking Lane Marina News and Update

Regular readers may recall my previous musings as to how we are set to be converted from residents of a Chiltern Hill top village to the inhabitants of a wooded promontory sticking out in the Wycombe Sea.

The winter has seen the Stocking Lane Marina briefly back in water a couple of times and the experts in the recently established Naphill Oceanographical Research Institute are carrying out studies to determine whether these have just been exceptionally strong tidal surges.

I feel that it is important to bring Naphill and Walters Ash residents up to date with what is happening.

As you know, one of the cornerstones of our new life as a seaside community will be income from the Stocking Lane Marina and from the berthing of cruise ships in the Hughenden Valley inlet. We will open up negotiations with Hughenden Valley residents as to how to best accommodate the cruise ships. The organizing committee did some Green Sea thinking about the effect on those who live in Hughenden Valley.

We realized that residents of the valley would not be happy to have cruise ships mooring over their homes. To start with we just thought that would be a severe case of NOMBYism (Not Over My Back Yard) but then we put ourselves in their shoes. Just imagine how you would feel if you had fired up the Barbie and cracked open a beer on a nice summer's day to suddenly have a cruise ship moor over your head blocking out the sunlight or even worse have a ship's anchor crashing through your conservatory.

So, we decided that cruise ships will only be able to moor over open farmland. This will limit the mooring in the Hughenden Valley Inlet so we will have to moor some of the cruise ships in the Bradenham Straits between the Aylesbury and Wycombe Seas.

This brain storming exercise was not without a side benefit. We realized there was going to be a potential obstruction to navigation in the inhabited part of Hughenden Valley anyway. As the water levels rise, Hughenden Residents would first need to waterproof their homes and then would have to achieve a reliable source of fresh air. It is felt that many will progressively raise their chimneys to form snorkels but these would cause a serious obstacle to navigation as well as putting the residents at risk as any collision could cause an inrush of water down their chimney.

Discussions will need to be held about a district breathing system with a communal air inlet and outlet. Delivery companies are interested, as post and parcels could be distributed from one point. We are unsure, though, whether to permit Naphill and Walters Ash eating and take away establishments to waft cooking smells into the system to entice fresh business.

We are also looking at business opportunities. We know that some local businesses have stocked up on fishing nets, buckets and spades to cater for the inrush of holidaymakers but we realise that there will be opportunities for local tradesmen as well.

For builders, there will be work waterproofing the Hughenden houses and the raising of chimneys. Gas engineers will have business converting BBQs to operate underwater. Another, particular challenge is how to convert lawnmowers firstly to operate underwater and also then how they will need to be modified to be able to trim seagrass and seaweed.

There is still a lot to be done but many opportunities to be had.


