Job Description

Role: Distribution Co-Ordinator (Volunteer)

The Gazette is produced and delivered by a committed band of volunteers and this is an opportunity for a willing community-spirited resident to come forward and help continue the long-standing history of the local village magazine which has been published for over 80 years.

- 1. Take delivery of Gazette magazines from the printer every month generally on the last Friday of the month (10 months per year only)
- 2. Bag up the magazines for each volunteer distributor in accordance with their current quantity needs
- 3. Deliver the individual bags to each distributor
- 4. Arrange cover for any distributor who may occasionally be unavailable many of the other distributors will always help cover
- 5. Once a year, arrange for the distribution of the subscription collection tins to the distributors and deliver the received monies to the Gazette Treasurer
- 6. Small amount of general admin work

Each month should take up no more than 4/5 hours of your time for the Gazette sorting and distributing and also typically allow for another 2 hours per month for admin.

You will receive training from the existing distribution co-ordinator.

The community celebrations for The Queen's Platinum Jubilee weekend got underway with the lighting of the beacon on the evening of Thursday 2 June. About a hundred people came to see the event and raised a glass to Her Majesty, accompanied by a rousing rendition of the National anthem. On Sunday 5 June we had "Picnic on the Crick". Sadly, the weather was not kind but many people attended and were not deterred by the clouds

On Monday 6 June we had the village hall committee meeting. The treasurer told us that the hall insurance has increased by £1000 and was now at £4500 for the year! We also have two other insurances, one for the Christmas tree lights and a Trustee insurance to indemnify the trustees against financial problems. These two policies have also been increased by small amounts.

The village hall committee reorganisation was again discussed and it was agreed that we would have a 6 month trial period with just 8 decision making Trustees (down from 21) who will be nominated at the July meeting. The other registered Trustees will continue to attend meetings in an advisory capacity but will delegate all powers for the period of the trial. The trial will be evaluated early in 2023 and, if proved to be successful, then the correct process will be followed to draft updates to the constitution and formally seek approval of these from the community at the AGM in April 2023.

We have made a spec for the heating replacement update and 3 companies are quoting for the work. It is hoped that we will decide the way forward on this at our next meeting. The work on the rear of the hall to repair the fire damage has started and then the tarmac in that area will be replaced. The map of the village has been put back on the wall.

The weekend of 11/12 June was the annual Fete and Classics on the Crick. Always great community events and much enjoyed by us all! The Fete on Saturday was well attended and there were many different stalls and rides. The Villager of the Year cup was presented to Steve Marshall who is always willing to help at village events. The dog show was very well supported and was lots of fun. On Sunday there were an enormous number of vehicles on display at Classics on the Crick. Another hugely successful event much enjoyed by the crowd of people who attended. It is good to see the crick being used for these events and being the focal point of the village and I thank the organisers for their hard work and ongoing support for the Village Hall.

The Music Festival will be held on Saturday 10 September and the Fireworks on Saturday 5 November. A Christmas fayre will be held on Friday 2 December.



Council year 21/22

At a well attended Annual Parish Meeting with a presentation from the outgoing Chairman, Simon Kearey, those present received really interesting presentations on Neighbourhood Planning from Neil Homer, an independent Consultant and Nina Merritt from Buckinghamshire Council. All presentations should now be up on the council website.

It was pleasing to note that the council ended the year with a surplus (£40k – subject to year end audit) and plans are already in place for the new council and associated committees to work on where investment is needed in the parish.

At the Council meeting on the 9th May, Cllr Gareth Cadwallader was elected as the new Council Chair.

Gareth lives with his wife Nancy in Widmer End has a depth and breadth of experience in the commercial world.



Message from Bradenham Vicarage

How was it for you? The Jubilee I mean! Mine was 'different' and not what I had planned at all. My intentions of enjoying a sea-borne treasure hunt, embracing the festival in the centre of High Wycombe and joining in with events at Bradenham were well and truly scuppered by the appearance of a very dark second line on my lateral flow test. I had finally succumbed to Covid! Not that I would have known it as I was completely asymptomatic, only taking the test as an overabundance of caution before taking a service. All my plans swept away in an instant. My ideas needed to change.

As a teacher, I learned to be flexible – really flexible. Like the time I replaced an afternoon's planned lessons with an impromptu lesson on thunderstorms. During a spectacular afternoon of storms, some of the children were visibly upset and frightened. So I used the storms as a teaching opportunity. Grabbing every textbook I could find on weather, I ripped down a display that was due for renewal and set about creating a new display about thunderstorms. As the children found interesting facts, they wrote them out and handed their work to me to put up on the display. Fear turned to amazement as they read about storms, learning to count the seconds between flash and thunderclap to determine the distance. The almost simultaneous flash-bang of a thunderclap directly overhead added a real wow factor to the lesson. Stories of Greek gods and heroes emerged, along with legends of lightning trees and other folklore. I could have persevered with my planned lessons, trying to teach a nervous, anxious class who probably would have learned

little. Instead, I chose to embrace the situation, turning it to an advantage, so that, to coin a phrase 'and a good time was had by all'.

I could have sat and been very miserable about missing out on all the Jubilee celebrations, but instead I embraced the situation. I enjoyed a good deal of the live TV coverage, reflecting that although I was missing out on the atmosphere of being there, I was not missing out on the crowded trains and grotty loos that would accompany the event. I cobbled together a red, white and blue table setting, tried a supermarket chain's recipe for strawberries 'n' cream daiquiri (delicious) and had fun cooking a kebab supper over my fire-pit, which later served as a private, mini beacon at beacon lighting time. It wasn't what I had planned, but it is part of my story and my own unique memory of this time.

The best laid plans can be spoilt at no notice by things beyond our control. We are constantly at the mercy of whims of fate. It is a fact of being human and something Jesus often referred to in his teachings. Jesus' antidote is to remain focussed on things in the heavenly realms, which are eternal and not subject to whims of fate.



Growing Your Own - DUNG

The importance of putting back into the soil at least as much as one is taking out is generally recognised. But how much? And what type?

When I took over my allotment in 1973 one of the first things I did was to use a soil testing kit to analyse the soil content. The pH was down a bit, ie a little too acid, so for many years I applied lime everywhere – except where I was applying manure and/or growing potatoes. The potash was a little down so I applied bonfire ash wherever possible. The phosphorus content was also a little down, but I thought that manuring would gradually build up the phosphorus level. However, the BIG PROBLEM was nitrogen, which was way, way down. Obviously, previous allotment tenants had cropped and cropped without putting anything back, so the soil had become impoverished. I resolved to apply generous amounts of manure every year to gradually restore the situation. As to the type of manure, I used pig, horse and cow. I have not used chicken because chicken manure is very highly concentrated and there are warnings about it burning plants.

PIG - When I took over my allotment there was a pig farm a few hundred yards away and I was told "help yourself". Since it was conveniently close and FREE I used pig manure for a few years, transporting it in my big builder's wheelbarrow. I was, however, somewhat put off because the pig manure was fresh and the odour was not exactly that of Chanel Number 5.

HORSE - I was put off horse manure from stables because of the low ratio of dung to straw, and the fact that the straw usually was not sufficiently decomposed. I did try horse manure from mushroom farms, and had a fantastic by-product in that mushroom spawn in the compost continued to produce mushrooms. We had copious quantities of free mushrooms. However, I then realised that in the mushroom compost were small pieces of chalk, and that if I continued to use that form of compost my soil would eventually become too alkaline.

COW - After about three years using pig manure and a further three using spent mushroom compost I turned to farmyard manure (ie cow) from a local friendly farmer, and have applied that exclusively ever since. The manure is usually two to three years old. The ratio of manure to straw is very high and nearly all the straw is decomposed. Not only am I building-up the quantity of the 19 trace elements which are essential for human health, but the fibrous nature of the manure makes my soil rich in humus and water-retentive.

As to the results of applying large quantities of manure every year, all I can say is that my crops of fruit and vegetables are excellent, with many types of vegetable of large size – and delicious!

Friends of Naphill Common



It was wonderful to see so many people at the fete, following two years of 'lockdown', and the weather was great, too! Strategic positioning of our Silent Auction gazebo next to the burger and noodle bar kept us busy all afternoon and, thanks to the generosity of many individuals and businesses, as well as the hard work of our team led by Neil McMinn, we have raised more than £1,000 in support of FoNC and the Village Hall.

I think it's important for our youngsters to be introduced to nature at an early age, so I was delighted to assist our two Naphill Beaver Scout colonies in 'pond dipping', with the highlight being several water scorpions – a small (about an inch) aquatic insect, with a scorpion-like appearance – totally harmless to humans, it's a fierce predator of tiny pond creatures. I personally marvelled at the skill of the leaders in controlling 20 or so excited 6-8 year olds, something far beyond me.

As I write, the first of our wild Chiltern orchids are appearing and this seems to have been a very good

year for them. The two species most frequently found are the Common Spotted orchid (the spots are dark blotches on the leaves), which can grow to 50cm in height and produces a large spike of small, pale pink (sometimes almost white) flowers; and the Pyramidal orchid, which has a more compact spike of a much darker colour. Less common are the Bee orchid, which resembles a smaller version of the commercial orchids sold in supermarkets; and the Fragrant orchid, which is the only one of the four with a strong scent, otherwise resembling the Spotted orchid (but without the spots on the leaves). There are other species to be found – we have 57 wild orchids in the UK – but they are much rarer.

Good places to see wild orchids are in the field edges along Bradenham and Saunderton (the National Trust retain wide borders on many of their cultivated fields and also wildflower meadows); in the wildflower meadow above the Hughenden Village Hall; and in the small nature reserve on Smalldean Lane – but we usually find some in the unmown grass verge in front of our house, keep an eye open!

Meanwhile, our working parties continue in full swing and take place on most Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Because they are dependent on the weather, it's best to check our web site for details (where our walking and other activities are also listed):





Local Tales - Accents: decline and ascent

Accents interest me. I have something of a Buckinghamshire accent and was made conscious of it aged thirteen by a rather bullying mathematics teacher at the technical school. If you had any kind of accent and had the temerity to ask a question, he would answer you sarcastically, aping your accent. Annoyingly, he had no ear for an accent and would reply in exaggerated Cockney. Now, you the reader, will no doubt agree that the Cockney accent is quite different from 'Bucks'. Take the phrase 'How now brown cow'. In Cockney it would be rendered as 'ar nar braan caw' while in Bucks it would be 'ey ney breyn cey'. A much softer accent.

Old accents are being lost. There was a time when you could recognize a difference in the accent of people of different villages. Hereabouts, they all had a Buckinghamshire dialect but with a local lilt. This was still true until the end of the second world war. Then, most children attended their village school until they began work. Soon after the war, further education mixed children in various secondary schools, and this hastened the dilution of local lilts.

Again, after the war, population movement accelerated. All over the country, people moved to other regions through necessity or choice. Social, industrial and transport changes, the increase in car ownership and the coming of television, all augmented the change in the way people spoke. Our local villages expanded, and the turnover of population increased. People worked with others with different brogues. All this diluted the local accent.

There has, of course, always been change. My father Bert Hussey like me, had an accent if somewhat stronger. But even as a boy he was aware that change was afoot. The gentrified accents of teachers, vicars, doctors and

the like together with the coming of the radio, made people, particularly young people, aware that others spoke differently.

This I understood when my dad recalled an incident as a boy walking up the Main Road in Naphill. He was accompanying an old man when a hot air balloon floated low over their heads. There was hardly a breeze, and the balloon was traveling only a little faster than they were walking. The balloonist in the basket was peering at a map and shouted down to them, asking the name of the village. "Naaple" shouted back the old man. The balloonist examined his map. "Where?" He asked. "Naaple" shouted back the old man even louder. More puzzlement on the part of the balloonist.

Dad, not really wanting to correct his senior, nevertheless recognized the problem and called out "Nap-hill" and the balloonist raised his hand in thanks, ignited his burner and gently ascended away. The old man, a little disconcerted, turned to dad and remarked "Wow thas wot iy sayed".

Naphill Neighbours

Naphill Neighbours were kept busy at the village fete and we thank everybody who brought us produce to sell and of course, those who came to buy. Another great village fete day!

The Amazon has been in the news recently so our talk this month was apposite. Our speaker was Keith Spencer, who had been on a cruise on the Amazon some years previously and enlightened us on the variations of the two halves of this great river. The river is 100 million years old; it flows in to the Atlantic but flowed into the Pacific in its early days.

The river is in two distinct halves; the black and the white.

The Rio Negro, the Black River, feels warm, has few insects, and thus no birds or fish, and few people. The soil is sandy because sand from the Sahara is deposited here having been blown from east to west. It is full of potash and thus fertile.

The White River - Rio Solimites, is cold, fast flowing and full of insects. There is thus a marked contrast between the Black and the White Rivers. The White River floods annually to a height of 13 metres, as high as a house. To cope with this, houses are built on stilts, there are no bridges or railways, the shops are boats and school buses float. There are pink nosed dolphins in this river which can swim backwards, adapting to cope with the flood.

The Rotary Club year ends at the end of June, so its current President, His Honour Christopher Tyrer DL is stepping down and handing over to a new incumbent after presiding over a very busy year for both himself and the Club. During his presidency we have been able to move forward from the worst of the Covid era. Thankfully, due to careful management of our meetings, we have managed to avoid spreading the virus amongst our members.

Despite all the challenges he has overseen a very successful year. We donated over £34,000 locally and internationally and we are currently working closely with the local "Ukraine to Chiltern" charity (website under construction). An organisation set up by a group of neighbours in the Lacey Green/Loosely Row area. They are offering support to many families in the villages around Princes Risborough who are hosting Ukrainian families (115 individuals including nearly 40 children between 0 and 18 years). Additionally, they are providing subsistence to a further 98 Ukrainians who are currently delayed en-route in various countries, awaiting visas. They are also funding their eventual travel to the UK.

The majority of the refugees arrive with only the clothes they stand-up in. Consequently, the Charity has established a "New2You" shop, providing a range of clothing, shoes, underwear and school uniforms. 

With the costs of road fuel, gas & electricity, postage, and many food products escalating at the present time, please be aware that scammers are taking advantage of this situation.

Cyber criminals claiming to represent Ofgem are targeting householders offering them fake energy rebates so they can access their bank accounts and steal the contents.

Action Fraud is warning customers not to be duped by emails saying they are due a rebate on their energy and council tax bills. The watchdog has been bombarded with more than 750 complaints in just four days about the official looking emails promising hard-up households money off.

They also recommend checking email addresses as any emails to or from Ofgem always end @ofgem. gov.uk. Another key point is to check the branding of these communications because the Ofgem logo will always be present in official communications, and it should never look stretched, blurry or distorted.

In a council tax energy rebate scam, fraudsters claim to be associated with the council and explain a refund is due. They then ask for bank details in order to pay out the £150 rebate.

Action Fraud says: "Your bank, or any official organisation, won't ask you to share personal information over email or text. If you need to check that it's a genuine message, contact them directly."

Victims may also be targeted by someone claiming to be from a legal company collecting outstanding debts on behalf of the energy companies. Victims who fall for this may still be left with debts to pay to the energy companies.

There is also evidence of door-to-door scamming that impersonates the energy companies with offers of cut-price deals, so defrauding customers. If you receive any unannounced house visits, calls or texts from fraudsters claiming to be them, report the scam to Action Fraud.

If you think you've fallen for a scam or have given any personal information like your bank details, contact your bank immediately for help.

New "Firm Foundation - Move Well Fitness Classes" in the Village Hall

A few people have asked me about my classes and what they involve, so I thought it would be helpful to share a little more about what they are all about.

During the early weeks I introduce key movements that we use every day. These include squats, lunges and pulling, pushing and lifting/hingeing movements. It is really important to me that everyone uses the correct technique, using the right muscles for each job. Often, low back pain or muscle pain are caused by not using the muscles in the way they were designed, and this causes other muscles to overwork.

The focus initially is on core endurance (and stability) and posture, that underpin all movement and enable us to perform well and safely. It is important that a stable core can be maintained throughout the range of the movements. Everyone also receives exercises to practice at home, in between classes, most of which can be incorporated into normal daily activities, rather than requiring a separate exercise session, as such.

Whether you are new to fitness classes and training or whether you have done a lot in the past, it is always helpful to have someone observe and feedback, on technique and form, as we often develop bad habits over the years, and these can be made worse after injury, as we change movement patterns to compensate for, or protect, the injured area.

Keeping groups small ensures that everyone gets lots of attention and there is time to ask questions, (and do a little bit of chatting!). It also enables me to plan in exercises to address in detail, specific needs of the group, either in class, or as exercises to do at home in between classes.

Each class starts with warming up and mobilising to ensure the body is ready for the class ahead. The next section then focusses on the compound movements. These are movements that involve multiple joints and muscle groups such as squats or lifts. Following on from this we cover a range of upper and lower body exercises which vary each week. We finish with a cool down and stretch.

The group is suitable for anyone wanting to get back into exercise or build or rebuild their fitness, maybe after a period of time away from it or through injury. For each exercise, alternatives are always given so that there is something for everyone, wherever they are on their fitness journey.

In the first session I run a few simple tests to raise awareness of people's strengths and improvement areas, by rerunning these tests periodically, it is a great way for clients to track their progress.

The best results are always achieved by committing to come every week and to supplement this with practice at home. All of my lovely first group have achieved at least a 20% improvement in leg strength, and have improved core endurance and stability during the 6 weeks, which is testament to their hard work. Participants report feeling more confident and stronger in daily life, and are able to do more than before the classes, and also have really enjoyed themselves, rediscovering abilities that they might have assumed had been lost altogether! If you are interested in joining the next 6 week course, please do get in touch. Classes are currently 1pm to 2pm on Wednesdays in the Naphill Village Hall. I would be happy to add additional classes if the demand is there too!

From a National Trust Hughenden Manor Volunteer

I first volunteered with the NT when I retired 10 years ago and that was with the Countryside Team based at Smalldean. I worked with them at various sites, mainly the Bradenham Estate, but also Coombe Hill, and West Wycombe Hill. I loved being outside learning about why we were doing the tasks and meeting friends.

The work became a bit too hard for me as I got older so I asked if I could volunteer in the "house" – Hughenden. I was welcomed with open arms and decided to become a Conservation Assistant helping to open the house in the mornings and care for the heritage items. I had just started an induction when Covid came along, and the house was closed. When it was partially open, I tried as a room guide but could not communicate well enough with my poor hearing and everybody wearing masks. When the house was eventually opened, I started properly and enjoy being part of the team on Tuesdays with the other volunteers, mainly room guides and the staff.

There is always a member of the house team to help, and explain what to do and how to do it. I find it very interesting seeing the objects close up and how to care for them, learning a bit about their history and also the history of the house and the Disraeli family. When I started the first time, I went to the talks that some of the volunteers give to the public and learnt a great deal of the history of the house, Disraeli, and Hughenden's role during the 2nd WW.

My main role at the moment is helping prepare the house for opening in the morning by cleaning and tidying. Christmas was fun, decorating the 8 ft. trees and seeing the beautiful floral decorations done by other volunteers. I have done a variety of jobs since starting – waxing the beautiful wooden floors, condition checking some of the heritage items, how to treat the different surfaces such as marble, wood, lacquer and metals.

So, there is always something new to see or learn. I enjoy meeting with the other volunteers and feel part of the team with the house staff who are always so supportive and encouraging and will find tasks that you feel you are capable of.

A little help to safeguard the local bee population with two bee hotels recently donated to Naphill and Walters Ash Primary School

Warnings of a so-called "insect apocalypse" have been highlighted through research published recently by University College London, revealing that 'in some parts of the world insect numbers have slumped by almost 50%.' In attempts to help stabilise the local bee population in the area, Naphill and Walters Ash Primary School has recently received two bee hotels from housebuilder Dandara who are building a development, The Chilterns, just down the road from the school.

Alongside tackling climate change, one of the main conclusions from the research has been to ensure, going forward, a renewed focus on reserving more space for wildlife to help stem the decline. The Forest Stewardship Council approved wooden Bee and Bug Hotels donated to the pupils will provide a home for the bees, especially during late September, when most bees are looking for shelter. The hotels have been installed in a quiet part of the school grounds, creating a safe location away from predators for a variety of solitary bees such as orchard, mason and leafcutter bees. It will be used as an educational aid for the pupils, introducing them to the role bees and other insects play as native pollinators, vital for the growth and spread of plants and flowers in nature.

Simon Pendlebury, Managing Director at Dandara Northern Home Counties, comments, "As a responsible housebuilder, we are constantly working to try and find simple but effective ways to safeguard local wildlife, so are really pleased to be able to continue our work with Naphill and Walters Ash School and donate these bee hotels. Research shows that the bee populations are declining, so our hope is that the donation to the pupils will protect the local bees and reverse this trend and also stimulate discussions around the long-term conservation of these populations."

Hannah Clarke, a Year 6 Teacher at Naphill and Walters Ash School, adds, "With our bees under threat the prevention of even further losses of these pollinators is absolutely crucial. This activity is a great way of ensuring that the next generation is discussing this problem from an early age. We are glad to see Dandara encouraging this with the donation of our new bee homes and look forward to seeing in the autumn term if any bees have moved in over the summer!"

Local Farmer Leading the Way to Support Wildlife Manor Farm Recognised as a Wildlife Haven with Award of New Local Wildlife Site Status



Chilterns based farmer, Andrew Stubbings, has been turning his farm into a stronghold for nature and wildlife over the last 20 years. His entire farm has been designated a 'Local Wildlife Site' – a recognition given to the most exceptional and valuable wildlife areas in the UK. Manor Farm is now the biggest Local Wildlife Site in Buckinghamshire, with an impressive 225 hectares of land achieving designation.

This is the first time in the UK that a whole farm has been designated - it's more common for specific fields or smaller areas on farms to gain designation, so the scale of this award is unprecedented.

A tenant of the National Trust on the Bradenham Estate, Andrew first began working with his father on the process of reverting a good deal of their arable land back to chalk grassland. 20 years on, the farm has become one of the biggest and best sites for nature and wildlife in the Chilterns. What's especially impressive is that Andrew has achieved such a high level of diversity of plants, birds, butterflies and even reptiles whilst running a commercially viable working farm.

In summer 2020, the Chilterns Conservation Board and Buckinghamshire and Milton Keynes Environmental Records Centre carried out full botanical surveys across the farm. They found no less than 280 species of plant. The farm has four different species of orchids and a very large population of the rare Chiltern Gentian.

Wildlife on the farm also includes breeding Barn Owls, Common Lizards, and breeding Corn Buntings – a locally scarce and endangered farmland bird. 35 species of butterfly have been recorded on Manor Farm including Duke of Burgundy, Chalk Hill Blue, Adonis Blue, Dingy Skipper, Grizzled Skipper and the Silver-washed Fritillary.

The Great Green Bush Cricket has also been found on the farm!

The survey findings were submitted to a panel of local ecologists and other experts on the Local Wildlife Site panel who awarded the designation set against strict criteria.

Andrew Stubbings said, "I'm so proud to think that I started this with my dad 20 years ago. Before the surveys I didn't really know what I had living on the farm and have been blown away by the results. It's so great to know that I am doing my bit to help our wildlife to thrive and has given me an extra buzz as I am out and about on the tractor. To top it all this spring breeding barn owls have taken to a new box installed on the farm - just magical!"

Nick Marriner from the Chilterns Conservation Board said, "Andrew is leading the charge in supporting Nature's Recovery in the Chilterns and has shown that commercial farming and wildlife can work together. He is an inspiration and it's great that we have been able to help him along the way and hopefully inspired him to do even more."

Andrew is one of 18 farmers in the Central Chilterns farmer cluster (supported by the National Lottery Heritage Fund) all driving to do more to support wildlife on their farms too. Helping wildlife at a landscape scale is vital and farmers are leading the way in the Chilterns.'

Julia Carey from the Buckinghamshire and Milton Keynes Environmental Records Centre added "Our survey team couldn't believe the scale of what Andrew has achieved. Field after field of our surveys throwing up so many important chalk grassland and rare arable flora species. Our Panel were blown away by the wildlife recorded on the farm"
