



The meeting of the village hall committee was held on Monday 1st May, there were 11 members present. The first item on the agenda was to elect a chairman and vice chairman, I was elected chairman and Linda Clark was elected vice chairman. No new members were coopted and Judy Whitehouse stood down as a co-opted committee member. Judy was thanked for her time on the committee and she will be missed as a valued committee member. I would like to thank Liza Fordham for her attendance at the meeting to take the minutes and Liza has worked with Peter Williams to produce the meeting minutes.

The lease for Bon Ami has been finalised and is now ready to be signed. The solicitors cost is £3000. The lease is for 3 years but it can be extended.

The commercial management report to the committee highlighted the problems that we have with hall bookings that use glitter, we strongly object to the glitter as it takes a long time to clean the hall and because of this the cost for cleaning is sometimes more than we receive for the hire of the hall. Most lets at the weekend are met on arrival and shown where the chairs and tables should be

stacked and encouraged to take photos to remind them where they should be when they leave the hall.

The maintenance of the hall is ongoing. We have a new contractor for grass and hedge cutting and he has already cut the grass. The playground swing repair, our contractor has the timber and will be erecting the new cross beams shortly. The bark in the playground has been raked and is in position around the slides and swings. It was also noted that the developer in Clappins Lane, Dandara had agreed as part of the planning permission to fund local areas like the playground and Hughenden Parish Council has received £10000 from them. We are making enquiries as to how we can benefit from this money. The best kept village competition will be judged in the near future and the residents committee are asking that the village is kept smart for the judging.

Friends of Naphill Common

Forthcoming Events - On Sunday 20th August starting at 3pm from the Village Hall, we will once again be running our popular 'Minibeast Safari' led by local naturalist John Tyler. Suitable for children from age 8 to 80, we will be seeking out and identifying small insects and other fauna that frequent the Common. And on Saturday 23rd September at 7pm also starting from the Village Hall, we will have our annual bat walk, led by Julie Hopton. Both these events are free to all, but are weather dependent, so it's best to check on Facebook or the activities page of our web site before setting out.

Nature on the Common - At the start of May, FoNC's monthly short walk (normally on the first Wednesday of each month, but please note the June walk has been brought forward to 31st May, to fit in with the Chilterns Walking Festival) took us to Bradenham Woods, to admire their fine display of Cowslips and Bluebells. Though there are some patches of Bluebells around the edge of Naphill Common, there aren't many on the Common itself. Bluebells are used as an indicator of ancient (over 400 years old) woodland, but the Common was grazed until the 1930s and so was heathland with only a few veteran trees. The dense woodland we see today has mostly grown up in the last century, since grazing ceased.

Wood pigeons are a common sight in our woods and fields and at our bird feeders, they are among the most numerous of our larger birds (too numerous, some farmers and gardeners might say)! I've heard people claim that you never see young pigeons, but squabs (as the chicks

are called) don't leave the nest until they are almost as large as the adults, the main difference is that they lack the white neck patches and are generally duller in colour - wood pigeons have iridescent patches of metallic colour on the neck which the squabs lack. Squabs are fed with pigeon 'milk' - crushed seeds and grains from the adult's crop, regurgitated in a similar manner to that used by some seabirds to feed their chicks. Often to be seen with wood pigeons, but frequently overlooked is the Stock Dove. Like a squab, it lacks the white neck patches, but is otherwise as brightly coloured as the wood pigeon, while only about 34 the size. Similar in size is the Collared Dove, which is mostly grey-brown, shading to pinkish-grey and with a distinctive black collar around the back of the neck (absent in juveniles). It was unknown in the UK until the 1950s, but is now widespread. Meanwhile, the somewhat similar native Turtle Dove has become rarer – the most likely spot to find one locally is on Otmoor near Oxford.

Local Tales – The lost deposit.

Beware! I cannot guaranty the truth of this tale. It is "second hand", having been told to me by someone, but someone I believe I can trust.

As some oldies may recall, there is a traditional mild animosity between Naphill and Downley, which may explain why there is no direct road between us and our nearest village. However, there has always been some mixing. Cricket and football matches, the Le de Spencer's Arms, and a shared group of allotment gardens long since redundant. The remains of the gardens still exist. If you go to where Cookshall lane joins the Common you will see an area of derelict gardens on the right-hand side when looking down the lane. I don't believe any of the plots are still being worked, but many years back they could be hired by people from both Naphill and Downley.

One spring day, in the 1950's, so the story goes, a Downley man was walking along the edge of the common from Downley, carrying a fork and spade: he was going to dig his plot. From some distance he noticed a Naple man stood in the gardens. He was looking round in a manner that suggested he wanted to see that there was no one about. The Downley man guessed that he had been "taken short" and wanted to relieve himself without an audience.

Sure enough, the Naple man walked over to the side of the gardens, took his trousers down and squatted with his back to the hedge. The Downley man saw his chance. He crept quietly up to the hedge and slid his spade silently through the gappy hedge until it was under the squatting Naphillite. When the job was done, he slid his spade back out with it's precious load. You can imagine the Naple man's surprise and puzzlement when he turned to inspect his deposit. He scanned the grass, looked in his trousers and on his boots, but there was nothing there! It was bewildering and must have mystified him to the end of his days. The Downley man could not trust himself to keep a straight face so, I am told, he cleaned his spade and walked quietly back home.

Of course, this tale may not be true and, since the Downley man comes out on top I hope that it isn't. The hedge between the allotments and the Common is quite thick now, but this tale is around seventy years old and holly grows fast enough to hide its part in the story.

I thank the many residents who have contacted me on various issues of concern, I am always happy to help where I can. I thank you all for your ongoing community support.



Growing Your Own - Promise of Summer Fruit

The photo shows spring blossom in my garden which means – future fruit! I have given up my allotment, so given up my extensive collection of mature fruit trees and bushes, but I still have several in the garden. Apart from a productive strawberry bed I have three mature espalier Braeburn apples against a sunny wall, and the same wall accommodates a fig, a conventional peach and a flat peach grown as fans. A house wall has a mature espalier apricot which gives about 40 full-sized fruit per year. I have a cherry which gives a few fruit which is covered with netting to deter the birds. During last winter I transplanted six tayberries which had layered on my allotment and they are still alive, so I am crossing my fingers that they will make it. The drought of 2022 was so severe that it killed a promising pear tree. I used to grow Victoria plums but twice they were killed off by "silver leaf curl" which is an airborne virus which enters the tree via an exposed broken branch. I have a very productive lemon bush which spends the colder months in a large pot in the conservatory and is then wheeled out to a very sunny spot in the garden. It requires a lot of TLC in the conservatory, which includes pollination by hand since the flowers open in the colder months and flood the house with a most magical scent.

Most modern fruit consist of a rooting stock grafted to a fruiting stock. The reason for that is to reduce

the vigour of the fruiting stock. One has either wood or fruit with fruit trees. However, there is always a drawback and it seems to me that grafted fruit trees have a life of only about 30 years. I am onto my third "Black Hamburg" grapevine in the greenhouse, and, referring to the photo, I had four step-over espalier "Arthur Turner" cooking apples then progressively three died after about 30 years. I replaced them and the new ones are now producing a decent crop whilst the left-hand tree is still going strong.

A quick word on figs, which will grow into massive trees unless their roots are constrained. I used to have a very productive "Brown Turkey" fig growing against a log-lap fence. I then had the wooden fence replaced with a brick-and-flint wall, which meant, sadly, that the fig had to go. I had put that fig into a brick-walled pit about 3 feet deep with plenty of rubble in the bottom to constrain growth. I then built another such pit in the garden against a brick-and-flint wall in full sun and transplanted a couple of shoots which came from the roots of a good fig on the allotment. The new figs, trained as fans, are now really getting going – it usually takes three years for fruit trees and bushes to start producing decent crops.



loving it and it's doing wonders for our mental health as well as our fitness.



Summer Days Out – Part Two

Last month I wrote a piece about College Lake Nature Reserve. A great place for a day out during the summer holidays... IF the sun is shining.

Given the weather over the coronation weekend we all know that our great British weather really can't be relied upon. So I looked for an alternative "rain proof" attraction for the extra Bank Holiday we were all granted. Something that could be enjoyed on the wettest of days.

The Royal Air Force Museum is located in Colindale, North West London. It's just short of an hours drive from Naphill. Plenty of parking on site, and entrance to the museum is free of charge.

It proved to be a bit of a gem. The exhibits are spread across six hangars. The first hangar starts by documenting the end of the First World War in 1918, the end of the Royal Flying Corps, and the creation of the Royal Air Force. There are some fantastic early planes that are barely more than kites with engines, created to test the bravery of the early flying pioneers.

As you pass through the other hangars you can see all manner of planes from other conflicts over the last hundred years, from the polished aluminium planes of the nineteen fifties to the Harrier Jump Jets and Euro Fighters from colaborative projects. There is extensive information on every plane and vehicle. A couple of highlights for me were standing beneath a Lancaster Bomber and a Vulcan Bomber. These planes are nothing short of awesome. Their size and scale are incredible.

Also on site there are play areas for smaller children, and an excellent restaurant to keep everyone fed and watered.

It's a great day out. Something for everyone, and affordable.

From the Vicarage

Every year, as the Church prepares to celebrate its birthday – on the Day of Pentecost, my thoughts naturally turn to Jerusalem, and the time I have been privileged to spend, on Pilgrimage, in that most holy of cities.

As I walked through the narrow streets of the walled city, marvelling at the huge variety of different nationalities and faiths which somehow manage to co-exist in one place, albeit not always peacefully, one cannot help but be moved by so many historic reminders of its rich and often tragic past.

Precious churches, many of which are centuries old, and have been visited by countless pilgrims, in search of spiritual enlightenment, home to Christians from Armenia, Abyssinia, Austria, France, Ethiopia, Franciscans, the Greek Coptic Church.... I could go on.

Jerusalem is naturally a focal point of Christian worship for many different denominations across the world.

Pentecost means fiftieth, and is a Jewish festival which is celebrated 50 days after the Passover – and so it naturally falls seven weeks after Easter Sunday – this year on 28th May.

After Christ rose from the grave, and prepared for his ascension, he instructed his disciples to go and wait in Jerusalem for the comforter, who he was going to send. There was a great sense of expectation amongst the disciples, and the growing group of believers. But what did it all mean?

At Pentecost, Jews from all over the known world had gathered to celebrate the festival of Pentecost, but this was overshadowed by a powerful outpouring of the Holy Spirit, which understandably caused quite a commotion in the City, and caused many people to flood out into the streets to find out what was going on.

We read that there was a sound like a rushing wind, tongues of fire rested on the Apostles, and they were given the supernatural ability to share the Good News of Jesus Christ in foreign languages which they didn't know – but which were the native tongues of many who were gathered on that day.

What began as a Jewish celebration gave birth to the Christian church as thousands responded to the message preached by Peter, invited Christ into their lives and went home, to lands near and far, as the Gospel was planted in countless new locations.

The Apostle Paul and other Apostles would then spend the rest of their lives visiting such places and building on the miraculous events of this remarkable day, planting and building up churches in Ephesus, Corinth, Philippi and even Rome itself.

Let us give thanks to God for the first Christian Day of Pentecost, and all those which have followed since. The Church has survived and even thrived for almost 2,000 years since that day, thanks to a faithful God who calls each of us by name, as his precious children, and longs for us to be in relationship with him and share in the blessings of the kingdom of heaven.

Saturday morning saw a quarter peal of bells as part of a nationwide 'Ring for the King' just before the service in Westminster Abbey.

On the Sunday a special combined service celebrated the new monarch commencing with Helen inviting the congregation to comment on their favourite or most poignant moments from the previous day's proceedings. Answers included: the anointing, behind the screens; the moment when Prince William pledged his loyalty to his father with a kiss; the moment of crowning. The service was followed by an opportunity to toast Their Majesties' healths in bucks fizz, accompanied by some beautifully decorated coronation cakes.

By the time you read this, our Nature Quest will have been held on 20th May. This precedes the national 'Churches Count on Nature' from 3rd-11th July, which is an endeavour to create a national database of flora and fauna in English churchyards. Churchyards together comprise a huge resource of largely undisturbed ecosystems throughout the country.

In many ways (such as phasing out our use of plastic in the church) we are seeking to improve our own eco-awareness, and as part of our effort to increase biodiversity we have recently installed swift boxes on our newly refurbished bell tower, and other bird and bat boxes in the church yard.

Retraining after Stroke – it is never too late to start

Every year in the UK, there are in excess of 150k new strokes, two thirds of whom leave hospital with at least one disability.

I have been studying "Functional Rehabilitation and Exercise training after Stroke" with a fantastic charity set up by Dr Tom Balchin, who had a stroke himself in his early 20's and learned quickly, that the retraining effort required to restore use of lower and upper limbs was significantly more than was available from the NHS, who were/are excellent during the acute phase of illness, but often lack resources to provide sufficient retraining support thereafter.

Tom established the charity, Action for Rehabilitation from Neurological Injury (ARNI) in 2001 to research and develop safe and effective training methods. He now trains exercise professionals and therapists throughout the country in these methods, to enable him to help more stroke survivors regain as much ability as possible. I am delighted to share with you that I am now qualified to offer exercise training to stroke survivors in this area who are referred to me by the charity.

The good news is, that the brain is much more retrainable than used to be believed, however it can take many repetitions of tasks and exercises to establish these changes. The technical term for this is neuroplasticity, and research has found that the brain is able to change both its structure and the connections within it, to take over from areas damaged by the stroke thus enabling regaining of lost function. It may help to imagine that the brains connections are like a road network and when a road becomes blocked (by the stroke for instance) then retraining effectively reroutes or creates new routes to avoid the blockage. Research has also found that cardiovascular exercise boosts the brain's ability to learn new things, so this is something that is relevant to everyone, but also is a very important part of retraining after stroke. It really is never too late to start.

The ARNI training approach for exercise specifically, covers four main areas, these are:

- · Cardiovascular training
- Strength training
- Task Specific training relearning skills needed to complete day to day tasks e.g walking, dressing, preparing meals for example
- Physical coping strategies learning new ways to do tasks by working around lost abilities. these can be short term or longer term depending on rehabilitation progress.

The charity also provide speech and language therapy where required. The aim is to help stroke survivors to have the best quality of life possible for them and their loved ones.

How resilient is your community? Are you aged between 18 and 35?

Let's begin by defining 'community resilience'. For Hughenden Street Association (HSA) this is captured in our Vision Statement:

For community life in Hughenden Parish to become better connected, supportive/supported, stronger and friendlier so that all residents are involved in it to the level they desire. This means working to create safer and connected communities encouraging residents to identify the needs of their neighbours to help them engage in the community. The Association has a key role to play in helping develop links to existing facilities whilst also working to support community groups to reach out to as many residents as possible.

What this means in practice is something that HSA keeps under constant review. At the moment, the Association provides a weekly e-newsletter, has a Facebook page, hosts monthly pub lunches with regular speakers on key topics especially scams, well-being and safety matters, access to useful information sources including the Bucks Directory and a point of contact via our Ward Leaders. Most recently the Association has launched its Afternoon Social in partnership with the Bon Ami Café in Naphill which is proving to be popular. Also, the good partnership with residents' associations and other local groups including St Michael's & All Angels, Great Kingshill Village Hub and the Hughenden Valley Climate Group help to promote our common agenda of making our communities more resilient.

The Association works collaboratively with Buckinghamshire Council via the Northwest Chilterns Community Board, participating in several of its working groups including the Community Resilience Working Group, where there was a very useful discussion on the priorities for 2023/24. It was concluded that we need to explore what the younger adult residents of Hughenden see as their priorities and what groups including the Association can do to support their delivery. This could be acting as an advocate at the Community Board or working with other interested community groups to deliver specific projects. This is where we need advice from this group of residents.

Recognising that we need to begin by defining 'younger residents': the Association is interested in hearing from young adults to mid-30s. At a gestimate using Local Insight data (2018) provided by Buckinghamshire Council this will be around 13% of the Hughenden population i.e., 1,000+ residents across the four wards of Great Kingshill, Hughenden Valley & Bryant's Bottom,

Naphill & Walter's Ash, and Widmer End. Members of the Community Resilience Working Group will be convening over the next few weeks, and we would be delighted to have direct input from this key group of residents.

If you would like to be part of the conversation, then do get in touch. All you will be committing to is sharing your views as this is an essential starting point. You may belong to a group working with the residents we are keen talk to, and it would be good to work together, thereby minimising any potential duplication of activities as well as creating new projects drawing on the collective resources available. Not from the Vicarage

My family loves its tea, in particular, some of the better known speciality teas such as Earl Grey and Lapsang Suchong. Aficionados of tea will know there is currently a problem with one of the said teas. Lapsang Suchong has all but disappeared from the shelves of grocers, supermarkets and specialist tea shops. Apparently this is due to a range of issues affecting the source of the tea in China. A Wine Giant Essay on Rosé Drinking Window



In preparation for the UK's painfully short rosé drinking window, I thought now would be the time to share some thoughts on this wonderful thing. It is impossible to get inside the mindset of a British rosé drinker without considering the fact that the UK spends most of the year being cold and wet (without the geography and climate needed to give us ski resorts to make it fun). After months of travelling to and from work/school in damp darkness, spring pops into view and there is a week in April when temperatures soar to 19°C and we all turn the heating off, dust off our shorts and thank the Lord the bleakness has passed. 'I'll get some rosé in – Summer is here!', you foolishly shout. Obviously, the following week you wake up to frost on the car windscreen, sleety snow in the air and you kick yourself for being so pointlessly optimistic (whilst still defiantly wearing the shorts).

By the time June ends, there will have been some unbelievably beautiful weather. Combine that with the luscious green British countryside and you have a brief glimpse of heaven. Obviously, then the rest of the summer limps along with drizzle and cloud at a tepid 17°C (apart from the three days in August where it reaches the mid-30s and we all complain about it being too warm, the rest of Europe laugh at us and society nearly collapses in a sweat induced panic).

It is for this reason that rosé is more than just a drink to us Brits. It is a symbol. A symbol of fleeting paradise, of the season of holidays, of escaping the usual bleakness of reality. When a Brit opens or orders rosé it is not because they necessarily want the specific grape variety or because it pairs well with the dish in front of them. No, it is a statement. It is us hollering to the world around, 'I am relaxed. I am content. I am no longer stressed and miserable! I am on holiday and I will be happy!'

All of the above is why I cannot think of rosé in the same way I would a red or white. A Brit's fondness of any particular rosé is not really dependent on how good the wine was but on how good the wider picture was. This is why 100% of us would state with absolute certainty that a £6 bottle of supermarket 'meh-ness' is far superior than a Château d'Esclans Garrus, if the former were drunk with friends at a hot Bank Holiday Monday BBQ and the latter in a restaurant in February.

So, to your text book Brit, a good rosé is not to be compared to a white or red. It is an art of its own that plays by different rules. A successful rosé is not to be defined by depth and length. Structure and weight can sod off. Rosé should entice and enhance your imagination. It should transport you to a far-off place, somewhere you've been or want to go. It creates an emotional awakening that celebrates those few moments of genuine summer joy that us Brits cherish and cling to throughout the miserable winter. Like the summer itself, a fine Rosé should be fleeting and refreshing - dancing on the tongue and energising your palate. It is not hefty and haughty. It does not carry around the baggage of expectation or pomp and ceremony. Like a teenager's summer fling it should be inexpensive and without great investment, yet be something the heart and palate longs for in months to come, as they spend the Autumn term telling their mates how fit this girl from Tenerife was.

So which rosé was more than just a wine to me? Which liquid summer fling trumped the beauty of the 'Orange Kappa Coat Girl' who took my attention away from watching Lilian Thuram's stonking double in the 1998 World Cup semi-final? Which rosé has more majesty than the stunningly beautiful Italian goddess to whom merely talking to in the Maltese sea was worth nearly drowning for back in 2004? Alpha Zeta Rosato Veronese (from The Wine Society).

This is a wine I shall always remember. The wine that saw me through the first Covid lockdown and gave solace after a long day of stressful remote teaching and attempts to educate my own 'Little Angels'. Just a few sips and the pains of working out how to stop the Year 8s kicking each other out of the Teams call were a distant memory. There may be better rosés out there, but none with greater symbolism.

N.B it is also worth pointing out that there is a lot more to rosé than the pale pink of Provence that is so in voque right now. I urge you all to try a few different styles from Lloyd's Wines in Hughenden. In particular, the Rosapasso Biscardo is a wonderful example of Italian rosé, whilst the Llumi Rosat by Cellar Alimara is quite possibly the best rosé you can find on these shores.


