



The predicted big increase in printing costs was mitigated slightly with a change to another printing company. Our thanks to Turville Printing who worked closely with the Gazette team to ensure this transition was seamless. Printing costs have increased due to the rising cost of paper and whilst steady at the moment, another increase would not be unexpected.

Apart from the monthly subscription for our software licence, any other costs of running the gazette are minimal.

Advertising rates were held at the same level to support our local businesses back from the impact of the pandemic but there was an overall small decrease in advertising revenue.

We are very grateful, as always, to Hughenden Parish Council for the annual grant they give to support the Gazette.

Subscriptions were increased to £5 this year which has enabled us to balance the books overall, returning a small surplus of just over £500.

Having left advertising rates the same for another year in recognition of the difficult trading conditions that prevail, this year we are expecting to have to use some of our contingency fund.

My thanks to everyone who keeps the gazette machine running smoothly and special thanks to Sonia Goby who is the life force behind the gazette. Sonia – a very big thank you from us all.

Please do attend to hear about the work we do to keep the village hall open. This is also your opportunity to have your say!

On 6th February the village hall committee met. The following items were discussed/reported:

- The 6 month trial of a smaller committee had been previously discussed, it was agreed that this would not be continued. We will revert back to a committee of all the current trustees. Currently there are 21 trustees. Hughenden Parish Council have yet to appoint a representative to replace Neil McDonald who recently resigned as a Parish Councillor.
- Dog fouling on the crick is an ongoing problem.
 Peter Williams has spoken to Bucks Council and they have agreed to site 2/3 more bins on the crick.
- The committee agreed that the village hall website was in need of revamping and it was noted that there were businesses advertising this in the gazette, so we will contact them to see if they can help in this matter.
- Work on the two trees which need to be cut down
 will commence at the beginning of April. When
 they have been felled the wood will be for sale so
 if you are interested in buying some of the logs
 get in touch with the committee.
- The new front doors have been delivered and will be installed by the time you read this.
- Unfortunately there is a leak from the roof in the Men's Club and one of the new ceiling tiles has been damaged, a roofer has been contacted and repairs will be carried out.
- The hot water dispenser has been replaced and I would like to thank a person in the village who has donated the money to replace the heater.

- The ceiling lights in the hall have been replaced with led light panels.
- Fundraising events were discussed and the Music Night will be on 9th June and Classics on the 11th June. A village Fete day will held on Saturday 10th June helpers have come forward.
- The King's coronation is being held on the 6th May this year. It has been suggested that a fireworks display should be organised. This was discussed and it looks as if we will be doing something on the Monday. More details to be announced.

The Village Hall AGM will be held on April 3rd and we will discuss the make up and areas of responsibility that the trustees hold. This is a meeting that is open to the public so you can attend to see and hear what the committee do to keep the village hall open and you will have a chance to voice your opinion.

Friends of Naphill Common

I'm pleased to report that our AGM went well, with an audience of around 50 to hear Keith Spencer of Wycombe Museum give an interesting talk on Chairmaking in the Chilterns. One news item is that, after three years of making it one of the most successful stalls at the Village Fete, Ron Collins and Neil McMinn have decided to step aside from running our popular Silent Auction. We'd like to continue, if we can, as it raises much needed funds, around £1,400 each year, split roughly equally between FoNC and the Village Hall. We've had one volunteer step in, but we really need at least one more to handle the work – Ron and Neil are very happy to explain what's involved and provide advice. If anyone is interested in helping, please contact me or any of the committee.

It's the dedication of the committee that makes FoNC such a success, and while they all agreed to stand again (and were re-elected unanimously!), there is no getting around the fact that every year, we're all a year older. We'd really like some 'new blood' to join us, partly to provide some new ideas and views. The work is far from onerous – just attending three or four hour-long meetings each year (at an agreeable local hostelry), so please let me know if you'd like to join us.

Although it's only February, spring is already beginning to make itself felt. The Great Tits are staking out their territories with their "TEACH-er, TEACH-er, TEACH-er" call; Song Thrushes are singing in the mornings, with their very varied song, but one that is always repeated three or four times before switching to a new refrain;

and Great Spotted Woodpeckers are drumming their beaks against trees – they drum for several seconds at a time, if you hear repeated drumming lasting less than a second or so, this could be the increasingly rare Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, a similar black and white bird, but only the size of a sparrow, rather than a blackbird.

Queen bumblebees have emerged from their winter shelter and are actively seeking small holes in which they can produce a new brood. I haven't seen any butterflies yet, but Brimstones (the original butter-fly, named for their yellow colour) are often among the first to emerge, closely followed by Red Admirals and Small Tortoiseshells. I spotted a medium-sized (1" or 25mm wingspan) white moth flying on the Common in January – this was probably the Winter Moth, which has adapted to survive freezing temperatures. If the weather continues to warm, we should soon see the ponds on the Common swarming with frogs, doing their vocal impression of a small outboard motor.

Meanwhile, our working parties continue in full swing and take place on most Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Because they are dependent on the weather, it's best to check our web site for details (where our walking and other activities are also listed):



Identity Theft

As the public continue to protect their homes and property against crime, identity theft is becoming more of a potentially serious crime. As a victim of identity fraud, you might not realise you've been targeted until a bill arrives for something you didn't buy, or you experience problems with your credit rating.

Identity theft is when a person's personal details are stolen and used to commit crime. The most common types of identity fraud involve the use of compromised credit and debit card details.

Identity thieves can steal your personal information in a number of ways: going through your post or rubbish to find bank and credit card statements or tax information; from your wallet or purse by taking a driving licence, credit or bank cards or even while you shop. In some cases, fraudsters may even 'skim' your credit card information when you make a purchase, leading to card cloning or card-not-present fraud.

Your identity details are then used to open a bank account, obtain credit cards, loans and state benefits, order goods in your name or take out a mobile phone contract. They can also obtain genuine documents, such as passports and driving licences, in your name.

Here are a few steps you can take to minimise the possibility of this happening to you:

- 1. Protect mobile devices from access using face or finger print recognition if possible.
- 2. Use complex passwords throughout.

- 3. Try to avoid using public wi-fi for certain types of transactions such as mobile banking.
- 4. Shred. Shred. Never throw any paperwork away that will identify you as an individual. This includes simple letters etc containing your name and address.
- 5. Check credit reports using Experian.
- 6. If you know of someone with an external letter box from which papers can be taken easily suggest they change it. One company in Aylesbury markets secure letter boxes www.letterbox4you.co.uk but there are others.
- 7. Don't post any pictures showing your car number plate as this could be used to illicitly obtain your address from DVLA records.
- 8. A bank will never ask for your Pin, either over the phone or via email.
- 9. You can buy Card Defenders (£3 and £4) from us to avoid your cards being skimmed.



Encouraging collaboration between community support groups

Hughenden Street Association (HSA) is celebrating its sixth birthday. Created in February 2017 with a clear agenda around helping to reduce the sense of isolation experienced by young and old alike. According to the Co-op Foundation 71% of those aged between 10 and 25 describe themselves as occasionally lonely, with 13% of pupils feeling chronically lonely. We are perhaps more familiar with the sense of isolation often felt by older people and those living with disabilities which was significantly exacerbated by the pandemic and now the Cost-of-Living Crisis.

Encouraging collaboration between different community support groups is a fundamental activity for HSA and our popular monthly pub lunches are testimony to this. The pub lunch at the Black Lion is going from strength to strength. Both the Gazette and NAWA Residents Association have promoted the event and in return HSA shares events organised by the association and other local groups in its weekly newsletter. Promoting each other's events helps spread the word. Our newest partner is the Great Kingshill Village Hub which has really taken off.


In 2023 HSA is exploring the Great Get Together project as a way of consolidating links with and between the various community groups and pupils at our local schools. Inspired by Jo Cox MP, who was sadly murdered going about her constituency work, the Great Get Together seeks to bring communities together to celebrate what unites us, to bridge divides and to tackle loneliness. Around the time of Jo's

birthday, a weekend of events take place across the UK to celebrate her message that we have more in common than that which divides us. This year's date is 23-26 June and typically people come together in parks, on streets, at allotments or in community centres to make connections with people from different backgrounds and to bring Jo's message.

Communities will be celebrating the King's Coronation in May and given the amount of organising needed for such events it might be felt that arranging something else in June might be too much. However, by signing up for the Great Get Together we can start to plan for 2024! HSA will be promoting the initiative over the coming months and if your community group or you personally would like to get involved do get in touch. We would also love to hear from our local schools. We will be inviting interested parties/individuals to join a Zoom chat to explore how we can take this idea forward within Hughenden. Local Tales - The Foldex Map

As a boy, not long after the war, I found myself wandering around Bomber Command, or as we called it then, the RAF camp. I remember that the buildings themselves and an attached area beyond was still covered over with camouflage netting, presumably to appear as rough ground from the air. Slowly, things were being returned to peace-time conditions. Buildings were being renovated and a lot was being cleared out and the contents discarded.

As I explored, I came across a small hut with the door wide open. In it was a waist-high pile of discarded paperwork of no interest to me until I noticed a folder with thick cardboard lids and titled 'Foldex Map'. I like maps, so I opened it to find a folded full-colour map of northern Europe including the British Isles. Not unlike a modern Ordinance Survey map but glazed so that you could draw your route on it. I was not going to let that be thrown away.



Although treasured, the map was seldom used until my parents bought me a bike in the early fifties and I joined a cycle club. On July 23rd 1954, the photograph shows us setting off from Desborough Avenue to tour Holland and Belgium. The map was ideal because I could record our route and rub it off afterwards. In fact, I had noticed that this had been done before when it had belonged to

the RAF. I could see the imprint of lines that showed the route of aircraft, I realised, flying to bomb Germany. The flight paths carefully avoided enemy anti-aircraft guns (also marked), to get to their targets.

Our cycle tour was an adventure and a great experience. There were no enemy guns by this time, but my brother Trevor did manage to get his cycle wheel stuck in a tram line which buckled the wheel and bent his forks backwards. It looked as if his tour was over. We had arrived in a small town with a hostel where we were to stay the night. Luckily, there was also a cycle shop. The owner had just locked up but seeing the pickle we were in, he opened up, took in the bike and told us to come back in the morning. When we returned, to our amazement, the bike looked like new. The man must have worked most of the night. When we offered to pay, he refused to take any money because we were English and our country had helped his country in the war. (This still moves me).

A few years ago, I happened to mention my Foldex Map to someone in passing. To my surprise he showed more than a little interest and said that there were few if any remaining records of actual bombing raids on Germany and could he borrow the map, to which I agreed.

A couple of years later there was an open day at Bomber Command and I had the chance to visit the underground bunker where Bomber Harries had planned bombing raids during the war. To my surprise, there on his desk lay my Foldex Map. I admitted acquiring the map and was pleased that it gave historians information about RAF raids but added in haste that they should not assume from the marks, that they included a raid on Holland and Belgium!

A Local Tale Revisited

I read with interest Trevor Hussey's article about Mr Thompson (aka 'Loopy') in last month's Gazette and would like to offer a few details about his life.

James Montague Thompson (known to the family as Jim) was the youngest of nine children born to James Thompson senior, a chair maker, and his wife, Emma (born Montague). He was born on 24/10/1881 at Laurel Cottage, Naphill Common (now Irving Cottage). After leaving school Jim began work in the chair industry working initially on the production of Windsor chairs at William Birch's chair factory in Wycombe. On 1/10/1904 at St Michael's Church in Hughenden he married the 19 year old girl who was to share his life for just over 54 years. She was Florence Ward from Walter's Ash.

During the Great War most of Wycombe's furniture industry was turned over to military production. Chairmakers' skills were particularly useful at a time when aircraft were made largely of wood. (Eventually the chair factories were obliged to devote at least 90% of production to government contracts.) Jim was probably working on the production of airframe components such as wings and fuselages at William Birch's before he signed up in 1915.

During the war Jim served as a rigger in the Royal Flying Corps in northern France and served two of the top four Great War flying aces. An article in the Gazette (July 1968) reports that he was a rigger for Captain Albert Ball, who, at the time of his death at the age of twenty on 7/5/1917, had recorded 44 aerial victories. Towards the end of the war Jim was working for Major Edward "Mick" Mannock (killed 26/7/1918 with 61 victories). Jim was responsible for setting up a bomb release mechanism on the undercarriage of the aircraft. In April 1918 he was stationed with Major Mannock at the Forest of Clairmarais near St Omer. It was while Jim was serving in the RFC that he started a secondary trade as a barber. A family story relates that he used to put the money that he received for cutting the hair of his fellow soldiers in an old tin, which he kept buried beneath a tree. One day they had to leave the area with little notice. Jim had no time to retrieve the tin and it is probably still there! He was one of the fortunate ones who survived the war and returned to civilian life in mid-1919, resuming his work in the chair making trade at William Birch's.

In the South Bucks Free Press (Friday, 9/2/1917) there is the following article about Jim:

"Second Air Mechanic A. (sic) M. Thompson RFS, son of Mr James Thompson of Spring Gardens, High Wycombe, and a nephew of Mr Simeon Thompson of Summerleys, Princes Risborough, has been promoted to First A. M. (37254,42RS). The soldier, who is well known at Naphill, joined the RFC on July 14th 1915, and prior to his enlistment worked for twelve years for Messrs Wm. Birch, Ltd, Denmark Street, High Wycombe."

Jim was a true countryman. He loved being on the Common. He liked a pint at his local, The Black Lion, on Naphill Common and conveniently he lived at Montcrest, a brick and flint cottage nearby on Main Road, which he and Florence had been living in for many years and had been able to purchase for £260 in 1938. There was a well in the back garden and a piano and a picture of Uncle Simeon in the front room. It was here that he used to cut hair in his shed and tell stories of the Great War. In order to supplement rations during Hitler's war, rather than for sport, Jim would hunt rabbits and birds on the Common. He acquired the nickname 'Loopy' from a simple loop of string that he used to snare pigeons. Often the game that he caught would be made into a pie or a stew by Florence, which would then be shared with his grandchildren from across the road.

Jim and Florence celebrated their Golden Wedding in 1954 and this was mentioned in the October edition of the Gazette that year.

Jim died on 9/3/1959, leaving Florence, a daughter, a son, four grandchildren and several great grandchildren. Harriet was born in autumn 2022 in a town in the Lincolnshire Fens. She is Jim's great, great, great, great granddaughter.

Jim was my great grandfather. Our lives overlapped briefly, but I was told a lot about him by my father and grandmother. I like to think of him as a simple and (as Trevor said) likeable and slightly eccentric man. Like many others he did an honest day's work for an honest day's pay, served his country in time of need, and did what he had to in order to feed his family when life was turned upside down by other men's wars.



On 29th January our long-standing Bell Tower Captain, David Cornwall, stood down after approximately 50 years in post. Keith made a presentation of a silver handbell, made by the Whitechapel Foundry, after David was 'rung up the aisle' by an honour guard of hand bell ringers. (see photos above)

David has rung in 4262 bell towers all over the UK and the ringing including Europe, Canada , USA, Hawaii (hence his collection of brightly coloured shirts), Australia and New Zealand!

Under his guidance the number of trained campanologists has increased after ringing recommenced after the pandemic, including a rising number of young ringers who have competed with great success in competitions.

In 2019, on the occasion of David's 80th birthday some statistics were collated, which will probably increase even further, as, although David has stood down as Captain, his ringing days continue.

- 1220 Peals rung, many with his late wife Joyce (a peal being 5040 unique changes on the bells to set methods. Each peal taking 3 hours to complete),
- 149 Peals of Minor/Doubles (6 bells) 928 Peals of Triples and Major (8 bells) 124 peals of Caters and Royal (10 bells) 19 peals of Cinques and Maximus (12 Bells).

The new Tower Captain is Andrew Ottaway, and we wish him many happy ringing years, as we wish David some time to put his feet up.



Growing Your Own

Last month I explained, now that I do not have an allotment and confine my growing to the large vegetable plot in my garden plus my large greenhouse, I need to concentrate on favourites which taste good and give a good crop. The first on the list was poirée (silver chard).

Next on the list has to be climbing French beans. The plant breeders have done wonders over the years with many vegetables and with climbing French beans they have excelled themselves. I grow "Cobra" from the UK and "Fortex" from France. These varieties are completely stringless and produce delicious bean pods which are up to a foot long. Cropping can start about 3 months after sowing and can last for a few months. One danger is to plant too many and be swamped by delicious beans. The answer is to sow progressively. I shall make two sowings, about two months apart. A row of eight 8-foot canes should suffice for each sowing, with bean plants about 10 inches apart. So, you don't need many bean seeds. The seeds keep for many years, say eight, in the packet. I have not been troubled by any pests or diseases - flank the plants with wire chicken netting if muntjac deer are a problem. A culinary tip is to add chopped garlic to the beans in the pan just before serving - delicious!

The next favourite is sweetcorn, even though they take up a lot of space. Again, the plant breeders have worked wonders and there are many extra-sweet varieties on sale. There are usually about 50 seeds in a packet and I sow them all in 3-inch pots in March and that results in about 40 good seedlings. I leave the tray of seedlings in the greenhouse until the end of May to avoid the risk of losing them all in a frost, then plant them out in a block with, say, 6 rows 12 inches apart having 7 plants about 18 inches apart in each row. Planting in a block in that way is advised to encourage pollination with the tassels at the top emitting clouds of pollen to fertilise the cobs below (every seed on the cob has to be individually fertilised). I shall plant butternut squash plants amongst the sweetcorn, letting the squash plants run about underneath the sweetcorn. Both sweetcorn (developed from maize) and the cucurbit family (including squashes) came from the Americas, where the Native Americans grew the two crops together to make better use of space, so that is what I shall do this year. Badgers have mouths full of sweet teeth and can be a big problem on the allotment, so I moved my sweetcorn patch to the garden many years ago. Similarly muntjac deer find cucurbit plants delicious, especially if there is a drought. Draping wire chicken netting over the plants stops them.

Stokenchurch Dog Rescue giving dogs a second chance

Stokenchurch Dog Rescue is a registered charity (274589). They are celebrating their Diamond Jubilee this year. They survive on volunteer labour, donations, grants, and a small income from their shop. On average they look after about 45 dogs at any one time. In January this year they re-homed 10 dogs and took in a further 14. Some dogs arrive purely as a result of their elderly owners passing away.



Shira is a mixed breed dog who has now spent 1225 days there. She arrived at 7 months old and although she has been re homed it has never worked out. She has now worked extensively with our canine behaviourist who believes that in the right environment she would make a lovely companion. She is super smart and energetic and needs to find a sofa to curl up on. She has spent virtually the whole of her life in kennels.

Marley is roughly 9 years old and is a Labrador mix. He has been at Stokenchurch for a few months now. He was incredibly overweight and definitely enjoys his food, his weight is safely dropping off having now lost 6kg. Marley is an affectionate older man and is just waiting for a life of belly rubs and slow walks.





By the time you read this, I will be back in the UK having completed my first full two month 'tour' with the Mission to Seafarers in Gibraltar. The weather has generally been kinder to us here than in the UK, though we did get 'confined to quarters' by a force 8+ gale that closed the port, airport and several roads around the Rock! It was quite simply too dangerous to go out until the gale had blown over. The flat is definitely looking less Spartan now, and the kitchen is much better equipped since we purchased a stick blender and hand held electric mixer. The former is for making delicious soups and smoothies whilst the latter is for making cakes.

Did I say cakes? It's citrus season out here so lemons and oranges are prolific. Main Street is lined with orange trees and windfall oranges can be picked up every day. I also seem to have acquired a constant supply of home grown lemons from Pepe, the manager of the Flying Angel Club. Pepe's lemons are not like the tennis ball sized affairs all supermarkets seem to offer - they are HUGE, larger than a grapefruit. This presents an amusing dilemma of what to do when the recipe calls for the rind and juice of one lemon. You've seen the meme 'When life serves you lemons, make lemonade' encouraging us to make the most of every situation; well, life has literally served me lemons in shed loads, so I have rewritten the meme. 'When life serves you lemons, make lemon drizzle cake'. (along with Limoncello, lemon sorbet, candied lemon slices & peel, lemon curd, Greek lemon soup and lemonade!)

The lemon drizzle cake has been finding its way to the port staff and it has become a regular thing to take a plate loaded with fresh baked slices of cake to the harbourmaster's offices. It's a great opportunity to build relationships with the harbour staff. They really appreciate the cake along with the opportunity it presents to have a proper tea break. The security gate staff benefit from cake too, and this has led to a little local trade emerging – lemon drizzle cake for home grown avocados. It's hard to say who has the best deal! Suffice to say that our little acts of hospitality towards the port staff have opened up relationships to the benefit of all.

It's little wonder, then, that the Bible is big on hospitality and the blessings that acts of hospitality can bring. The Old Testament contains many stories of the offering of hospitality, sometimes to complete strangers, and the positive outcomes of these encounters. In the New Testament, Jesus speaks of the most basic act of hospitality – the offering of a cup of cold water – and how if it is offered with kindness it will bless both the giver and the receiver.

So, when life serves you lemons, make lemon drizzle cake but don't forget to share it with others!

May you know God's blessings of sharing and hospitality.
