#### Naphill Village Hall & Playing Fields Council Chairman's Report

The February meeting of the Village Hall Committee was held on the 7th and there were 18 members present. Among things discussed were a party that had been held on a Sunday, from which children had gone into Bon Ami, unlocked their door and went out into the car park. We have now attached security tags to the door to deter this happening again. It also appears that the cleaner's cupboard doors were forced open although nothing appears to be missing.

The tennis club lease was discussed and the committee voted on two proposals relevant to granting the tennis club a new lease. These were that the land they occupy was indeed part of the committee's charitable aim and therefore would continue to be used as a tennis facility. In view of that decision the committee also agreed that a specialist third party organisation is better placed to manage the facility rather than the village hall committee. The committee has this in place and we can now negotiate a lease so that the tennis facility can be used for that purpose.

Paul Riglar, the treasurer has spent a huge amount of time researching what has been done in the past and


what is needed to meet the village hall commitments to our charitable status. Paul has read through the last 30 years of the village hall minutes and also tried to comprehend the charity commissions rules on granting of leases. We have contacted a solicitor and had some free advice from them but it is not a straightforward process. Paul and I will now be able to talk to the tennis club and move forward on discussions for a new lease. The Bon Ami lease was also discussed and several questions were asked of the committee so that this can progress further.

The activities on the crick this year include the Fete on Saturday 11 June, a bonfire/beacon on Thursday 2 June and on Sunday 5 June a big picnic to which people are invited to bring their own picnic. All for the Queens Platinum Jubilee.

There will be Music on the crick on Saturday 10 September and the Fireworks on Saturday 5 November. Let's hope that we can get back to near normal this year.



The team hope you all enjoyed the lights, which we left on until Candlemas, 2nd February, to cheer everyone up in these difficult times of the COVID pandemic. Special congratulations to Mike Leggett who did the climbing of the tree for the 30th year – a tremendous achievement. He had to climb the tree on three occasions: 23rd November to put up the sphere and connector box at the top of the tree; 28th November to attach the garlands to the connector box and 5th February to take down everything.



Driving the cherry picker was Daniel Smith and he was assisted on high by Stephen Fountain of Lacey Green. Since the tree is about 70 feet high that was quite a task, and very cold even with good weather because of the wind-chill factor. Up a tall ladder attaching/detaching the ends of the garlands to the lower branches were Kevin Oxnard, Neil McMinn and Andy Debrou. Other members of the team on the ground were, Ron Collins, Gary Putnam of Lacey Green, Peter Davis, John Harris, Paul Hewitt, Glenn Gavin and myself. The team's electrician, Ross Greenlee, checked out the garlands, sphere and connector box before we put them up, and tested and repaired the garlands with the help of Paul Hewitt after we had taken them down. I checked 1,048 bulbs afterwards and stored them in the loft of my garage ready for next time.



We must give special thanks to Paul Johnson of Upward Powered Access who supplied the cherry picker free of charge. And a special thank-you to you, the public, who responded so generously to Cathryn Carter's appeal for donations. At the time of writing the total is £903.00, a really splendid amount to help pay for damaged equipment which needs replacing, the electricity and insurance. And thanks to Marlene Mason who provided the essential fresh mince pies, tea and coffee for the team when the work was finished.

# Update re Hughenden Parish Council – Information collated by the editor and verified as correct by the Acting Clerk to the Council, Helen Hogan, Councillor Simon Kearey and Councillor Linda Derrick

On 1 February 2022, Hughenden Parish Council became inquorate. The parish council acknowledges that this is a cause for concern across the parish. This situation has never happened before to Hughenden Parish Council as far as anyone knows and it is unusual for a parish council to become inquorate but not unknown.

The Council should have 15 councillors and it has a quorum of 5. Over the last few weeks, a number of councillors have resigned and now only 2 remain. These are Cllrs Linda Derrick and Simon Kearey. Neither represent Naphill and Walters Ash which therefore has no councillors to represent it on the Council. At the time of going to press, the Council is inquorate, so it is unable to meet and take decisions and all its committees and working groups are suspended.

In these situations, Buckinghamshire Council (BC) has powers under S91 of the Local Government Act to appoint sufficient councillors to make the Council quorate. In line with its procedures, BC is in the process of appointing David Carroll, Steve Broadbent, and Clive Harriss, who are BC councillors for the Bucks ward of Ridgeway East, to Hughenden Parish Council.

This will bring the number of councillors on HPC to 5 and HPC will be quorate. BC is arranging for the Council to meet on 8 March, further details will be announced, and members of the public will be welcome to attend this meeting.

Once the Council is quorate and can meet, it can then co-opt residents onto the Council. To date seven residents have applied to be councillors and are waiting to be co-opted. Once new councillors are co-opted, then the BC councillors can step down so as long as the as the parish council has 5 councillors.

HPC is unable release the names of the applicants at this point but a resident from this ward has applied to represent Naphill and Walters Ash on HPC. Residents will know details on 8th March.

Any resident can apply to become a councillor and even if all seven applicants are co-opted, there would still be six vacancies. Applications can be obtained from Helen Hogan, the Acting Clerk at HPC, clerk@hughenden-pc.gov.uk. Please see www.hughenden-pc.gov.uk/council-info/role-of-councillor/ for more information on about the councillor role. If anyone is thinking of applying, they might like to go to the meeting on 8 March and see what the Council is like and talk to the parish councillors – both existing and newly co-opted. This meeting would also be an opportunity for residents to see and talk to Buckinghamshire councillors who represent who represent our parish.

Every meeting of HPC has a session for public participation where anyone can comment or ask questions about anything on the agenda. The session only lasts 15 minutes and each person has a limited time to speak.

#### **Annual General Meeting**

The FoNC AGM took place on Friday 4th February at 7:30pm in the Village Hall, and was attended by nearly 40 members. After several years of service as membership secretary, Lynn McMinn has decided to stand down from the committee – we thank her for all her efforts over the years. Lynn's work will be taken on by Neil McMinn who, as treasurer, is automatically aware of membership payments by bank transfer. All the other committee members agreed to stand for re-election and were duly elected, but there is now a vacancy on the committee, so if any FoNC members would like to join us in our deliberations (we're a very friendly bunch!) please let me or any other committee member know of your interest.

After our regular business had been concluded, there was a fascinating talk, followed by a Q&A session, by John Shaw of the Chiltern Rangers, who work with communities to provide practical habitat management in the Chilterns and manage 13 nature reserves for Buckinghamshire Council in the Wycombe area. John explained how the Rangers work with local schools and colleges as well as NEETs (those Not in Education, Employment or Training) to provide work experience, while enhancing the local natural environment.

#### News

The recent warmer weather has meant that we must stop our working parties operating on the ponds within the Common, as frogs and other amphibians have been seen, and frogs are already indulging in their spring chorus (croaking) on some of the ponds. Work will start again in the autumn, but meanwhile we have plenty to do clearing holly and maintaining footpaths, and the work of spreading woodchip to alleviate some of the muddiest stretches of footpaths has resumed.

#### The Common

Although it may not always have felt like it, this winter has been a relatively dry one, but the Common is, as always at this time of the year, very muddy in parts. This is the result of the local geology, which consists of up to 5m of clay overlying more than 30m of chalk, giving rise to very similar conditions to those encountered in Flanders during the First World War, which has almost identical soil. Indeed, many practice trenches were dug in the Chilterns by troops undergoing training prior to their deployment to the French and Belgian battlefields, the remains of which may still be seen. In any case, for walking on the Common, wellies are advisable or a stout pair of waterproof boots – not your best white trainers!

## Hughenden Street Association Naphill Lunch Club Report



# News from Naphill & Hughenden Scouts, Cubs & Beavers



31st January is the date in the year when we make our annual Census return to the Scouts Association. Naphill and Hughenden Scout Group is a registered charity, as is every other scout group across the UK. There are over 7500 different scout groups across the UK and the Scouts Association acts as an umbrella organisation for these many groups. See www.scouts.org.uk to find out more about what the Scouts Association does and how it works. As a Scout group we have an Executive team that is responsible for operating the charity, and a Scout Leadership team that delivers our programs to our young people in our various sections (Scouts, Cubs and Beavers).

The purpose of the Census is that the Scouts Association would like to know how many young people are involved in scouting all over the country and how many adults there are supporting those young people. We know from the last Census that, mainly due to Covid, across the UK there was a huge slump of 117,000 youth members (nearly a quarter) and 1 in 10 of adult volunteers, around 15,000, also slipped away. Anecdotally things have improved across the country and once all the Census declarations have been assessed we will have an updated view of how things are. Here in Naphill and Hughenden we declared 91 young people in our return. As a Group we pay an annual membership fee to the Scouts Association based on the number of young people in our Group. This fee helps the Scouts Association deliver a wide range of services and support to groups across the UK including development of all the programmes (badges), volunteer training, safeguarding, DBS checking and insurance. As charities, all scout groups can also benefit financially from Gift Aid claims to help them run their activities. For us in Naphill and Hughenden, this is fairly well automated as we use a system called OSM (Online Scout Manager) where parents / guardians can tick a box if eligible and we do all the rest of the work. If you are a parent / guardian and are not sure if you have done this or if this applies to you, please speak with your section leader or contact Adrian who can assist. As far as we are concerned it is very useful money that the tax man lets us claim to assist with our activities.

Over the last month our sections have been undertaking a wide variety of activities. The Scouts had a real focus on environmental awareness and recycling. They were delighted to have a talk from Gemma Green, Waste awareness and Education manager from Bucks County Council. Thank you Gemma, for coming to see us. Naphill Beavers had a focus on aviation this month.

One of the parents, James Crawshaw, brought his radio controlled model aircraft to demonstrate, and Woodpecker (Steve), our Assistant Beaver Leader gave a talk about paragliding. Steve brought in a huge paragliding wing for the beavers to see which filled the scout hut from one side to the other. Hughenden Beavers have been celebrating Chinese New Year which included exploring dragon puppets and tasting Chinese food. Last month I wrote about the Cubs stargazing. This month they have been building on this by practising their navigation skills. The Cubs are preparing for a 10k organised hike from Chesham to Great Missenden called Explorer 10. Cubs took part in this hike last time it was allowed and are all looking forward to being to put their navigation skills into practise again.

Growing Your Own

I have been growing asparagus since 1967. Initially I purchased young plants from Le Blevenec, the most famous grower in France, and obtained their most popular variety, Asperge d'Argenteuil. They grew well in my garden and we had plenty of asparagus. After 3 years we had to move so I dug up the now enormous roots and took them with me. Luckily we moved in January when the plants were dormant; they all survived the move and gave lots of asparagus in their new location. Then, disaster. We moved again after 2 ½ years, this time to Naphill, again I transplanted them but this time in August and they all died.

Ithen tried again, purchasing new plants from several growers and trying several types of asparagus. They all failed, so for quite a few years we had no asparagus from my allotment at Walter's Ash. In desperation, in 1987, I went back to my first love and purchased asparagus seed of the variety Asperge d'Argenteuil. The plants gave their first crop 3 years later and we still pick a couple of pounds of delicious asparagus every 3 days from the end of March to the end of June. I usually bring on the crop by covering the bed with fleece from the end of February.

How does one raise asparagus plants from seed? I sowed mine in a standard seed tray in ordinary compost in the airing cupboard in February. The seed are quite large, about 2 mm in diameter, so are easy to handle and space out in the seed tray. There were about 100 in the packet and I had nearly 100% germination. As soon as the first ones had germinated I placed the seed tray on a sunny windowsill to allow them to grow on. In mid April

I planted them in the garden after hardening them off. I planted them about 3 inches apart in rows 6 inches apart and they grew vigorously. I left them there for nearly a year then planted them out on the allotment about 18 inches apart, and waited for 2 years before taking the first crop.

Asparagus grows very quickly in the season, about 3 inches per day, and even faster in very warm weather. One ceases cropping at the end of June to allow the spears to grow on to their final height of about 4 feet and the whole bed becomes a mass of fern. The plants continue to grow until the frosts of November, putting back into the roots the energy they will need the following spring to produce the next crop. Asparagus is believed to grow well in all soil types. I have grown asparagus in sandy soil and in heavy loam.

The asparagus spears should preferably be cooked immediately they are picked to retain their fantastic taste, delicate softness and freshness. Serve them on a hot plate with butter. Delicious! Restaurants just can't compete!

#### From the Vicarage

I love pancakes! Shrove Tuesday falls on 1st March, when many reach for the flour, milk, eggs or pre-made packets, to enjoy



this peculiar delicacy. Traditionally Shrove Tuesday was the day Christians finished up their rich leftovers, to lighten their larders before the season of Lent fasting, beginning the following morning and running for the 40 days up to Holy Week and Easter Sunday, this year falling on 17th April.

Many churches, including St. Michael's Hughenden, mark the beginning of Lent with a 'Service of Ashing', hence the term Ash Wednesday. During this service the congregation are invited to have a cross marked on their foreheads in (cold!) ash, accompanied with the words: 'Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Turn away from your sin and be faithful to Christ.'

The reference to 'dust' is a simple reminder that God created the world and all that is in it (you can read this and the reference to dust in the opening two chapters of Genesis, at the beginning of the Bible).

Being reminded we come from dust might not seem very cheery, but is an important reminder of our mortality. When we remember we are only human, we stop pretending to be God. When we stop pretending to be God, we stop judging others, we acknowledge we make mistakes, misread, and misunderstand. Ash Wednesday is a day to take an honest look at ourselves and say: 'I am human, I make mistakes, I'm not as good a person as I like to think, I'm sorry God, help me to change.'

Be encouraged, we may be dust, but remember we are God's dust, made in his image and deeply loved.

Did you know that 'shrove', of 'Shrove Tuesday' comes from the word 'Shriven' meaning forgiven. The Journey of Lent to Holy Week and Easter Sunday travels via Good Friday. God demonstrates the full extent of his wide, deep, high, strong, and tender love, giving Jesus to die on the cross in our place, for all our messiness.

As you enjoy pancakes, and journey the 40 days towards Holy Week, Good Friday and Easter Sunday, my hope is that you do so humbly, acknowledging you are human, knowing God's love and forgiveness.

As a father has compassion for his children, so the Lord has compassion for those who fear him. For he knows how we were made; he remembers that we are dust. Psalm 103

Traditionally the ash for 'Ash Wednesday' is made from palm crosses collected from previous Palm Sunday services, which

are then burnt. If you have a palm cross which you would like to contribute please bring to St. Michael's and leave in the bowl you will find, labelled, at the back of church.

We would love you to join us at St. Michael's for our 'Service of Ashing with Holy Communion' on Wednesday 2nd March 7.30pm





### Seventy Years On!

I think we are all looking forward to the summer, and the promise of Happy Events to celebrate our Queens Platinum Anniversary; again this winter has been a long haul of fear and negativity

I was just 12 years old when George the 6th died. Running to catch the train to school (late as usual!), my head full of my birthday party that was to take place the following Saturday. Yes, we had parties with games and wore frilly party frocks! Statues and eating Mars Bars with a knife and fork in gloves were 'de rigueur', we were very naive compared to today's generation. Although the weather was cold and wet I bounced into school without a care in the world.

I explained we had been sent home because the King had died – She said 'yes it was sad, but think of Elizabeth who has lost her Dad'- that was a sadness I could understand.

Dinner was a very sombre affair that evening, until I blurted out 'can I still have my party on Saturday?' Mum and Dad tried to look shocked at the insensitivity of their youngest child, luckily the situation was defused by my very much older grown up sister getting the giggles! After a mild rebuke from Dad, Mum said "yes of course you can have your party, the King would have wished it!".

Over the weeks the sadness dulled and the excitement of the Coronation became reality! We

rejoiced in our very young beautiful Queen – we had street parties, maypole dancing and pageants at school. Let's look forward with happiness and excitement to all our Village events and rejoice in Her Majesties 70 glorious years.

### Gordon the Bird Man

As we lose green and wild spaces, tidy up and insulate buildings, birds are losing places to nest. To compensate for this we can provide nest boxes in our gardens. By offering a nest box we are bringing wildlife to our doorstep where we can watch the birds activity through our windows. This can bring great insight into their nesting behaviour.


Nest boxes can be purchased at most garden centres or online. for boxes that will stand the test of time "Woodcrete" boxes are made of a mixture of concrete and woodchip which are excellent at keeping young chicks at a constant temperature. They are extremely long lasting but also expensive. Attractive looking boxes which can be aesthetically pleasing but impractical in design should be avoided. Thin wood gives limited protection from fluctuations in weather and temperature, while entrance holes of the wrong size may provide access to predators.

So you are looking for a box that is well made and of a size sufficient to accommodate a brood of chicks (Blue Tits can have fourteen!). Also look to see if it can be opened to enable you to clean it out once the breeding season has ended.

An alternative is to build your own. Timber of at least 15mm will ensure the box lasts longer and will provide protection from the elements. Different species require different boxes. Blue and Great Tits will use a box placed 2-3 metres off the ground with an entrance hole of 25 – 28mm, while Sparrows use a community box with a 32mm hole. For Blackbirds, Thrushes and Robins an open fronted box nestled in a shrub or other vegetation around a metre off the ground helps to hide their nest from predators.

There are various reasons why a perfectly good nest box may not be used and there are some ways to improve the chances of a box being used. If there is more than one box in the garden place them as far apart as possible, as close placement could lead to aggressive territorial behaviour in adult birds. The entrance hole should not be in a South facing position, and avoid placing a box near branches which could facilitate access by cats.

### Message from Bradenham Vicarage

#### Leeks and Lent

As March begins, hopefully we have put the worst of the winter weather behind us. I say hopefully because the 'Beast from the East' last struck on March 18th in 2018, so it does no good to be too optimistic about the commencement of spring weather.

This year, the season of Lent begins at the start of March, with Shrove Tuesday on March 1st and Ash Wednesday

on March 2nd. Natives of Wales will have an addition to the merriment of Shrove Tuesday aka Pancake Day as this year Pancake Day falls on the feast of St David, patron saint of Wales.

St David is one of those saints we actually know a fair bit about with some accuracy. His sainthood results from being a proper holyman, who was renowned as a preacher and teacher, founding a number of monasteries throughout the UK and Western Europe, including St David's Cathedral, Pembrokeshire. He is often depicted as standing on a hill with a white dove on his shoulder, the hill having miraculously risen under him as he preached a sermon (not sure how accurate that bit of the story is!). His symbol is a leek.

Like every good founder of a monastic order, St David created a rule by which the monks lived. Given that his day falls at the beginning of Lent, the Rule of St David is surprisingly relevant. His monks were to refrain from eating meat and drinking beer, eating only bread flavoured with salt and herbs and drinking only water. They were to use no draught animals for ploughing, using only manual labour to plough the fields. No personal possessions were allowed and the monks spent their evenings in prayer, reading and writing. Their whole lives were subject to this highly disciplined rule.

This year, as we turn our minds to consider some form of discipline over Lent, maybe we can look to St David as an example. Perhaps you will give up alcohol and drink only water. Maybe you will follow an increasingly popular trend and go vegan for Lent, limiting yourself to a diet of vegetables and herbs – leek soup anyone? Maybe you will avoid using a draught animal (in the 21st century aka a car) on short trips to 'plough' up and down the aisles of the supermarket. Perhaps you will actively seek to spend more time reading and less time sitting in front of the TV. How about writing? Journaling your progress through Lent or writing letters to people you don't see very often. What about spending time in prayer? If you are not sure how, take time to learn to pray.

The disciplines of St David make for a useful guide to start our observance of Lent, but they do not end there. For David's monks, the Rule was for the duration of their time as monks – for some an entire lifetime. For us, Lent is for a period of 6 weeks, its discipline preparing us for the celebrations of Easter and the cycle of death and rebirth or resurrection that punctuates our temporal and spiritual year.

May you know God's special presence and blessing at this time of year.

Your Residents Association continues to work hard on behalf of the villagers, especially in relation to the latest clutch of controversial planning applications within the greenbelt surrounding our beautiful, yet fragile Chiltern hilltop villages. We understand how hard it is for some of you to track these applications so we publish a list on the village website (naphillandwaltersash.org.uk/residents) with the planning numbers to assist you.

We continue to act as a focal point for locals to voice any concerns. We in turn react to those concerns and try to investigate as fairly as possible and advise where we can. We liaise with many other organisations including the Hughenden Street Association (we include both a founding member on our committee and the active social events organiser for our villages), the Parish Council (regrettably now inquorate, but hopefully soon to be re-instated with fresh faces), the Speed Watch Group, Clappins Field Development Group, and we also have one of the longest standing members on the Village Hall Council. We meet up in person at the village hall, or over zoom every month on the second Monday and all residents are very welcome to attend our meetings and express their views.

Earlier this year the clerk of the Parish Council asked the parish Residents Associations and local newsletter editors to encourage residents to apply to become parish councillors and so take up some of the thirteen parish council vacancies which have currently rendered Hughenden Parish Council inquorate. At this point Naphill and Walter's Ash sadly have no representative on the council. N&WA residents association were quick to respond to this appeal! We did this by contacting over 200 people in N&WA both personally and by email and we hope that there will be a positive outcome and that our parish council will soon become quorate. 


### **Please Park Considerately**


