

#### **Annual General Meeting Report**

This last year as usual, has been unlike any other year. The Covid pandemic played havoc with the running of the village hall. For some of the year we had to close and when we were able to open it was under very different rules, we even could not have an attended AGM last year.

As the restrictions were eased and the village seemed eager to make the most of our newfound freedom we gradually emerged to be able to hold our fundraising events. Napfest was held in September when the COVID restrictions were relaxed and although it was a downsized event it was still a decent fundraiser. A slightly different Classics on the Crick saw the village hall run the bar for the event and the agreement was that the village hall kept all the profits which came to just over £1000. Then the fireworks event and I think, because of circumstances, people came from near and far and everything that was for sale, sold out! The profit was by far the biggest that a village hall event has ever raised. The Christmas fayre was also a success and matched previous years fundraising. As usual the Christmas tree lights were put on the tree and the money donated for them more than paid for costs. So I must thank all the volunteers for their hard work in making all of these events a success.

The running of the hall has been a continuing labour for the committee. Just to keep it functioning is a task, let alone the various extra work to sort out leases and maintenance. Paul Rigler has spent at least 100 hours researching leases and the charity commission rules. We have had input from a solicitor, free of charge, and still we are nowhere near granting leases.

There have also been other problems throughout this year. There was a criminal act which resulted in a vehicle fire that could have very nearly ended with the village hall being burnt down. There are still repercussions that have not been fully dealt with.

The ongoing quest to update and improve the hall and playing fields continues but often getting quotes for necessary work is an uphill battle. We are all volunteers and I am grateful to all the committee members who work so hard to make the village hall and playing fields available for the residents of Naphill and Walter's Ash to use and enjoy.

#### **April Committee Meeting Report**

There were 19 members of the committee present on the 4 April meeting of the village hall committee. It was a short meeting as the AGM of the village hall followed at 8.00pm.

The Bon Ami lease was discussed and it was decided that a three month grace period should be offered to Ruth and Dorothy on using the small hall as part of Bon Ami. The tennis club lease was also discussed and progress has been made in contacting a solicitor, unfortunately the terms of engagement do not come cheaply and we were told to expect a bill of £1500 to £2500 for the lease.

On other matters, 120 bags of bark have been spread over the play area. The village hall is grateful to The Timber Group for their offer of timber to replace the rails and boards around the play area. The committee are looking to replace the astro turf benches with benches that are the same as the ones in the play area. The safety inspections on the play area were discussed and it was agreed that we should continue with the present firm for the inspections at a cost of £176 per year.

The good news is that the boiler that was not working is now working and appears to be behaving itself.

The fete will be held on Saturday 11 June and will be combined with the R.A.F. families day and the RAF will be funding the rides. Classics on the Crick will be on Sunday 12 June. The Fireworks will be on Saturday 5 November.






**Bradenham Parish Council** 

At our last meeting Bradenham Parish Council discussed parking and speeding vehicles in Bradenham village. There is a problem with cars parking in the village. The increased numbers of visitors parking along Bradenham Wood Lane since lockdown, means that Bradenham Wood Lane has become a single track road with few passing places. This causes congestion at peak time with cars making dangerous manoeuvres. The small car park by the pond is frequently full. The car park by the cricket club is not signposted and the condition of the surface is not ideal. Coming down the hill from Walter's Ash the speed limit suddenly goes from unrestricted to 30 mile per hour. A variety of options, including speed reduction through the village, were discussed and it was agreed to engage a highways specialist for views, options and possibilities to improve the traffic conditions for residents and visitors.

Safety improvements on the A4010 were discussed and it was agreed to seek further advice on this matter.

The batteries in our moveable vehicle activated sign have been stolen, which is why it has been out of action for the last few months. It will no longer be safe to position it in Bradenham until we are able to buy a much taller pole. Once the technical issues have been resolved it will be placed on New Road.

We held a very successful litter pick in March and we were amazed how much litter we collected. Bags and litter picking sticks had been provided by Buckinghamshire Council and they collected all our bags and the large items that had been left in the verges. All the volunteers are thanked for doing such a great job.

We still have a vacancy on the parish council. Please contact the clerk if you are interested and would like more information on joining.

The plans for the Jubilee celebrations in the afternoon of the 5th June are taking shape. The Cricket Club and the church are both working on the plans and organisation for the afternoon. Counting on good weather, activities will take place on the green in front of the cricket club with additional activities in the church.

Our next meeting will be May 9th at 7pm in the Cricket Club on the green. We will also be holding our annual parish council meeting that evening.

#### Naphill Neighbours

This week we were treated to a most informative and interesting talk entitled "Failed to Return". Tony Eaton detailed what happened to Amy Johnson and to Leslie Howard on their ill-fated final journeys. Tony had a wealth of photos about both people and we were all engrossed.

Amy Johnson became famous when she flew solo to Australia in May 1930 taking fifteen and a half days, a record in those days. She had qualified as a flight engineer so was able to repair her plane if need be. This trip made her famous; she was awarded a CBE and ten thousand eight hundred pounds. She was regarded as Queen of the Air and made visits to India, Japan, New Zealand and Moscow. She also crossed the Atlantic on the east/west crossing, crashing 50 miles from her destination. She was invited to the White House and met President Roosevelt; she was feted everywhere she went.

During the war she was one of a team that flew new aircraft from the factory to airfields. She crashed in dense cloud in the Thames estuary. Radios were not installed in new planes until they reached their destination so Amy did not have any access to advice as she flew on in the clouds. She crashed into the

Thames, expecting to land on tarmac. Her body was never found. Amy had lived in Princes Risborough.

Leslie Howard was killed on June 1st 1943 on a flight from Lisbon to Bristol. The plane he was in was shot down by German planes over the Bay of Biscay. It was a civilian aircraft and therefore a war crime. He was a star and had worked in America for years. However, he disliked American isolationism and returned to England to make propaganda films; it is believed he was also a covert British agent. The circumstances surrounding his death remain secret to this day. It was a fascinating afternoon.

Our trip to the Saville Gardens, and on the river, is fully booked but Yvonne Cook will keep a reserve list. Ring her on 563960 if you would like to be a reserve. We shall have an afternoon tea party on August 8th; this had to be cancelled last year.


Our next regular meeting will be on May 9th, led by Edwin Rye, and involves garden flowers. Meetings commence at 2pm. Visitors and new members welcome.

Friends of Naphill Common

#### The Common

As previously reported, all the ponds on The Common had frogs and toads present, in large numbers on several of them, with plenty of spawn to be found. Newts are harder to spot, as they lay their eggs individually rather than in large clumps and don't rest on the surface. FoNC have conducted annual newt surveys for several years, using 'traps' made from large plastic bottles with the tops cut off and reversed, allowing newts (and other creatures) easy access, but retaining them for inspection and release. Last year no less than five Great Crested Newts were found in Pickup's Pond (the only pond in which they've been observed in recent years), but there were none found this year, just three Smooth Newts. Failure to capture them doesn't mean they're absent, but it's a little worrying and we'll probably try another trapping session next month.

Another way of assessing newt populations is by DNA analysis from samples of pond water. This requires laboratory analysis and is therefore too expensive for us to undertake, but previous assessments were funded by the Freshwater Habitats Trust (https://freshwaterhabitats.org.uk/) and found evidence of Great Crested Newts in both Pickup's and Daisy Ponds (we've never succeeded in trapping any of them in the latter). The limitations of this approach are somewhat opposite to those of trapping, it can prove that there were newts present, but not when or how many.

When we carried out the DNA survey, the Freshwater Habitats Trust also helped us to test the ponds for nitrate and phosphate pollution, most were pristine, with only a couple showing slight traces, which could be from agricultural runoff or other sources.

May I make a plea for dogs that have been treated against fleas and other pests to be kept out of ponds where possible (I realise how hard this can be with water-loving breeds!) The insecticide on their skins can enter the water and kill small invertebrates, which are the basis of the food chain for dragonflies and amphibians.

In other signs of spring, the warm weather has brought out significant numbers of our early butterflies, including Brimstones (the original, yellow 'butter fly'), Red Admirals, Peacocks, Commas and Small Tortoiseshells, all of which overwinter in sheltered spots as adults.

#### **Activities**



#### Local Tales - Donkey's Years

It seems impossible to believe that the Main Road through Naphill could be quiet enough to have girls stretching a skipping rope across it and boys playing marbles on its surface but that's how my father could remember it.

Then, most people who lived in the village worked in the village; either in farming or in the woods or, at the industrial end - Walters Ash - brickmaking, chalk digging and stone cutting. They could walk or cycle to their work. Some of the work was more sophisticated with Mar-coni, the inventor of the radio transmitting messages to be intercepted in a cottage oppo-site the Crick, and Armstrong the engineer experimenting with radio-controlled boats on Long Pond in the early nineteen-hundreds.

The coming of car ownership, new housing development and public transport and now home delivery and heavy lorries, has given us the road we have today. The older cottages that face the road and even recent infill, offer little or no off-road parking so that lines of cars are parked along the road or on the pavement. Together the result is a road that is of-ten congested and hostile to pedestrians - dividing the village rather than giving a place to stroll and socialize.

Not many years ago the Naphill Fete was opened each year by a procession led by a brass-band starting from Walters Ash - impossible now. Perhaps never again will hopscotch be played or hoops be rolled along its length (the metal ones made by the blacksmith at the end of Short Road, now Forge Road since the forge closed). But when those innocent pastimes were enjoyed you can be sure that there were other inconveniences, mishaps and in-terruptions appropriate to the times.

One such, my father recalls, was when the then landlord of The Oak pub (that gave its name to the Oak Row cottages), used to drive a donkey up and down the village carrying its load. The donkey was sometimes as stubborn as sometimes donkeys can be and would lay down in the road and refuse to get up. Exasperated, on one occasion, the landlord pushed his newspaper under the donkey and set light to it with his matches. The donkey got up quickly. After that, whenever the donkey decided to lay down the landlord only had to rattle his matchbox and it would stand up. If only we had such a matchbox for today's problems but not for donkeys.



#### **Growing Your Own**



Really chilling news. The United Nations have just announced that the amount of cultivable land on the planet will decrease by a third by the end of this century. This will be as a result of

global warming. The UN have also estimated that the world population will increase from about 7 billion at present to 9 billion by 2050, with possible stabilisation after 2050. Nevertheless, an increase of 2 billion mouths to feed when the cultivable land decreases by a third looks like having dire consequences for mankind. There will be inevitable pressure to share out available food – we cannot watch while people starve to death in their billions.

Food rationing in the UK looks likely to return. We import around half of our food at present. I remember food rationing during and after WW2. I remember people growing carrots in their front gardens. In the Republic of Ireland, they are already implementing a policy of "wartime tillage", giving incentives of €300 to €400 per hectare to encourage greater grain and vegetable production. It could really be time to "Grow Your Own" in your garden or on an allotment.

Our farmers rely on the three artificial fertilisers nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium, of which nitrogen is the most important and is manufactured from natural gas which accounts for 80% of the cost. The price of nitrogen fertiliser has more than trebled in the past year, such that many farmers are reducing the amount they put on their land, accepting the lower food production which will result (and, of course, exacerbating the overall food shortage). But what happened before WW2, when artificial fertilisers were not used? Farmers applied farmyard manures to return nutrients to the soil, and they left the land fallow for one year in four. Nowadays there is no leaving fields fallow – the fields work flat out every year. The lack of farmyard manure on most fields (and application of just the three nutrients nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium) leads to the soil being impoverished for the 16 other nutrients our bodies need, so our people are not getting enough of what they need from their diets – unless they grow their own.

But what about leaving fields fallow for one year in four? The farmers did not know why it worked, but they knew it did work. Modern science has since found the reason why. Nutrients need to be water-soluble in order for plants to take them up. There are

plenty of nutrients in the soil as compounds which are insoluble in water so cannot be taken up by the plants. However, soil micro-organisms slowly attack such compounds and convert a proportion to other compounds which are water-soluble. So, if the soil is left fallow for a year and the soil micro-organisms left undisturbed, Hey Presto! The water-soluble nutrient level increases and better crop yields are achieved in the following three years. That is nature's way. Let's hear it for the soil micro-organisms!

(I would agree that using artificial fertilisers gives double the crops, but if those fertilisers become unavailable or too expensive we may have to go back to relying on manure and leaving fields fallow.)

Bucks Aerials is a full member of the CAI (Confederation of Aerial Installer) A registered digital installer 2021 was an "interesting" year for many of our garden birds with different weather events resulting in smaller counts of many of our garden birds.

January to March was typical with flurries of snow which pushed species like Mistle Thrush, Fieldfare and Redwing into our gardens in above average numbers. This gave way to sustained wet weather which persisted throughout spring. Along with cold temperatures, the damp weather impacted many garden species and most breeding birds were affected. The Tit family, single brooded species that require an abundance of caterpillars to feed their large broods saw a large failure rate. Heavy rain knocks caterpillars from trees and cold weather stops their development so tits can struggle to find enough to feed growing young. The spikes we usually see in May and June following young birds fledging were often non existent in many species or delayed in others. This delay might be caused by the failure of the first breeding attempt, leading to a second attempt.

The summers weather was more typical, with some warmer than average spells. Birds that produce

multiple broods did better with some late fledglings. Multi brooding species have a longer breeding season with species like Robins, Sparrows and Wrens remaining relatively robust in numbers. It can be noted with many garden birds struggling to breed successfully this has a knock on effect on predators, notably the Sparrowhawks which raise their young to coincide with the emergence of smaller birds from nests, this ensures there is enough food for their own chicks, following the poor breeding season for so many. It seems that Sparrowhawks found it difficult to provide with the lowest count of young birds since records began. This demonstrates how reliant predators are on healthy populations to subsist and how quickly their populations struggle in the absence of abundant, reliable food.

Most garden butterflies had low average counts as a cold wet spring delayed or stopped development. Whites like Large, Small and Orange Tip peaked a lot later than usual and Browns like Meadow, Ringlet and Speckled Wood were barely recorded in June when numbers normally peak.

#### Chiltern Hills Arboriculture - May Day - Traditions Around the World



This month we will be enjoying the "May Day" bank holiday. The tradition of celebrating this date in the UK can be traced back to the Pagan festivals of the 14th Century. Typically there would be dancing and ritual by a troupe of Morris Men. There would be more dancing by children around the maypole, which was decorated with multi coloured ribbons and often thought of as a fertility symbol. Finally, the crowning of a "May Queen". Back in those days this was considered the start of Summer. In more modern times that has been superseded by the Summer Solstice or longest day of the year. In 2022 that will be June 21st.

In Germany the festival is called Walpurgisnacht (after St Walburga), or Hexennacht (Witches Night). The Pagan legend has it that witches would meet on this night to celebrate the coming of the new season. In an attempt to keep the witches and evil spirits away local people would light huge bonfires and make plenty of noise. But the church banned Pagan celebrations, so the locals "rebranded" them as St Walburgas feast day to appease the clergy and keep their holiday. The original custom is still observed in northern parts

of Germany. The rest of the country observe a more Christianised version and light fires called Osterfeuer, or "Easter fires". In southern Germany it is part of youth culture to play pranks on neighbours such as hiding their possessions or daubing graffiti.

Bulgarians celebrate Irminden. The origins of this festival is the traditional belief that all the snakes leave their burrows on March 25th, but their king and leader comes out on May 1st. In order to avoid getting bitten by the snakes everyone takes the day off work and bonfires are lit to scare the reptiles away.

Beltane or "Day of Fire" is the Celtic festival. Ancient Celts believed that the sun was taken prisoner during the winter months. To celebrate its return they would light bonfires. In Edinburgh huge fires are lit on a hill above the city. Another legend is that young women who climb Arthurs Seat at sunrise on May Day morning, and wash their faces with morning dew, will be blessed with lifelong beauty.

In the Czech Republic April 30th is Pálení čarodějnic or "Burning of the Witches". Huge bonfires are built up to 8 metres tall with witch effigies on top. As it gets close to midnight, when the fires are dying down, it is traditional to find a cherry tree and kiss a young woman under its blossom. May 1st is then celebrated as "the day of those in love".

So.... apparently lots of bonfires, witches and Paganism..... and we all thought it was just a long weekend with a barbeque thrown in for good measure....



#### From Bradenham Vicarage - Keep the faith.

So how was it for you?

Lent, I mean. Did you manage to do without chocolate/alcohol/sugar/salt and vinegar crisps for the duration? I must confess, during Holy Week, gin and tonic never looked so tempting! However, I wonder if you found the discipline of giving up something for Lent left you with unexpected benefits.

A friend of mine gave up sugar. This was way easier said than done since there is so much hidden sugar in our diets, and she was going to go the whole hog. Not just the white and brown crystals you put in your tea and coffee. Her discipline meant no ketchup, no takeaways, no pasta sauces – in fact, nothing that contained the slightest hint of sugar. (Try it sometime – read the ingredients labels on EVERYTHING you buy. You will be shocked!) She subsequently told me how well she had eaten, cooking everything from scratch to exclude sugar, and how she had dropped a whole dress size over the 6 weeks. Her Lenten fast had raised awareness of the effects sugar was having on her body. She has now resolved to continue with her new found sugar-free eating routine.

So what does happen to all that discipline and those good intentions after Easter?

Do we breathe a sigh of relief and go back to gorging on chocolate, trying to make up for 6 weeks of deprivation in one sitting? Or do we acknowledge that we have learned something from the experience and embrace the lesson?

Evidence shows that smokers who can quit smoking for 5 weeks stand a very good chance of giving up

smoking for good. It seems that it may not take as long as we think to establish routines. If you can do it for six weeks in Lent, then you have started to form a routine that can be continued.

There is not just a physical side to Lent – it is after all a Christian season of discipline and preparation. Many people use it as a time to get their spiritual lives in order – to set a new routine of prayer, reading scripture or meditation. Such practices can lead to healthier spiritual and emotional lives, again something that will give lasting benefit if continued.

Saint Paul, in his letter to the Philippians gives some great advice. 'Whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable – if anything is excellent or praiseworthy – think about such things. .....put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you.'When we take time to regularly reflect on these values and incorporate them into our lives, our lives will become more attuned to the wonders around and within us. Something which will surely benefit everyone and everything we touch.

The positive aspects of Lent do not need to end at Easter but can be a springboard into new ways of living, seeing or being that can have lifelong and lasting effects. Keep the discipline. Maybe I should be asking 'How IS it for you?'

#### Curiosity Killed the Curate (Well, not quite!)

As this edition of the Gazette goes to press, we are preparing to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. However, as I'm writing this, we're between Good Friday and Easter Sunday; A time of waiting ... but with the benefit of knowing the excitement and celebration of Sunday coming. When Jesus was crucified, the disciples didn't have that advantage and so they had to wait for the festival weekend (Passover) to be over before continuing what they thought would be the next part of their journey of grief ... but what turned out to be a completely unforeseen event (for them).

I have to admit, I'm not great at waiting and so I seem to focus more on the journey than on the destination. Just as the Queen's jubilee celebrates a lifetime of service and the events of Holy Week to Easter recognise Jesus' ministry and journey to the cross, so a pilgrimage gives people an opportunity to consider the journey as much as the place they are headed towards.

Just before Palm Sunday heralded the journey through Holy Week, I was on leave and decided to walk the Archangel Way across the top of Dartmoor. This route, set up by "Devon Pilgrims," winds its way from St Michael's Church on top of Brent Tor to St Michael's in Chagford. It takes in another 10 churches along the way and pilgrims carry a "passport" which they can stamp at each church along the way and record their progress.

I was curious to see how the different churches along the way welcome visitors and pilgrims and look forward to sharing some of those ideas back at our own St Michael's as we think about how we can make people feel welcome as they come into church. Some were tiny churches in the middle of nowhere and others were in towns where tourists were regular visitors to the church building.

The slightly cryptic title to this article comes from an experience at the church in Sourton, where the Archangel Way follows the Granite Way (a disused railway) for a while. In the grounds of the church is a labyrinth and so we paused from the long-distance route to take some time to pray as we walked in the slower, more mindful way that people have for centuries.

During the previous day, my walking boots had rubbed on the back of my ankles and so that morning I had decided to walk in soft trainers with almost no tread (after all, it was only a disused railway!) ... BAD IDEA! ... I was on the top of a TINY grass bank above

the labyrinth and slipped on the damp grass in my eagerness to discover what was below! It seems that knees DON'T bend sideways!!! The good news is that after a couple of days of just walking on the flat, things were much better and I was able to continue on to St Boniface Way from Crediton to Exeter where Bishop Nick of Plymouth kindly signed my Pilgrim Passport!

The main things I think I learned are ...

- 1) A welcoming church is an open church.
- 2) Pilgrims have as many ways of coming to our doors as purposes for their visit.
- 3) It doesn't matter if it's a small church or a large cathedral, as long as the welcome is real.

Lifecycles

They have been watching our magic beans turn in to beanstalks, and have been fascinated by the roots and shoots! I'm certain there will be lots treasures found during walks in the woods and local area during our Easter break.

We have been very busy developing our curriculum at the Nursery. As always, we consulted with our team, our families, our local school and our children. The children were amazingly vocal about what they felt it was important to learn. It ranged from learning more about dragons to being able to do their own zips. We love sitting together for afternoon tea discussing how they feel about their Nursery. It is always such a pleasure to hear their thoughts.



Over the last few weeks, it feels like COVID-19 infections are rife, and certainly have caused disruption in our lives and businesses. I thought it might be useful to share some tips on ways to boost the immune system, and provide better protection against respiratory tract infections specifically.

#### Carbohydrates

Carbohydrates fulfil many functions in the human body, key role is to support the immune system. Carbohydrates have, to some extent, been demonised over recent years, leading to some choosing to reduce consumption of them. Research has shown however that low carbohydrate diets come with an increased risk of acquiring upper respiratory tract infections.

Sufficient levels of carbohydrates also support the body during and after exercise, by helping the blood sugar to remain even, and minimise the release of stress hormones, this helps post exercise recovery too. I fully support reduction of carbohydrates such as processed cakes and crisps as these offer high calories but without helpful nutrients, however we should also ensure we have plenty of good sources of nutrient dense carbohydrates such as whole fruits and vegetables and whole grains which are as close to nature as possible.

#### Vitamin C

Consumption of a wide range of different coloured whole fruits and vegetables (for example broccoli, oranges, potatoes) also helps us ensure we obtain enough vitamin C in our diets. Vitamin C has long been recognised as vital to health, however the body cannot make it itself so we have to obtain it from our diet. Research has shown a link between vitamin C deficiency and impaired immunity, which leaves the body more susceptible to infection. Vitamin C can also help the immune system when we are suffering from infection, so we should endeavour to maintain a good intake of fruits and vegetables when we are ill. If insufficient vitamin C is obtained from the diet another option may be to consider supplementation of 200mg of vitamin C daily, as this has been shown to help reduce the duration and severity of upper respiratory tract infections.

#### Vitamin D

Vitamin D is known as the sunshine vitamin, because the UV-B rays in sunlight cause the body to produce it when the skin is exposed. It is also available in small quantities in oily fish like salmon and egg yolks. Research has shown that vitamin D is important in protecting the body against unwanted virus and fungal infections, and therefore adequate levels may help reduce the risk of respiratory infections. In a study of 6,789 British adults, Berry et al noted that respiratory infections were lowest in the summer coinciding with the time when the subjects' vitamin D levels were at their highest. If specific diets prevent the intake of foods containing vitamin D naturally, then you can buy certain breads and cereals which have vitamin D added and alternatively, consider supplementation in autumn and winter months. Adults need 10 micrograms per day, and when exposed to sunshine in the summer months should be able to obtain enough that way.

Eating a wide range of fruit and vegetables and good quality meat, fish or other protein sources, also infers many other health benefits. If in doubt, choosing natural unprocessed food is a great place to start.


