

A meeting was held by the committee on 3 October. Various items were discussed, mainly the usual items along with the upcoming boiler replacement which should be up and running by the time this is read. #### I can hear you knocking, but you can't come in!

Nottingham Knockers are a pretty unsavoury bunch. Whilst presenting outward appearances of respectability, they are unscrupulous and tend to target the elderly and the vulnerable.

They get their tag name because traditionally they travel to their target areas from the East Midlands by mini-bus or van, accompanied by a team leader. Usually, they go from door-to-door selling cleaning materials and small household goods.

Some of them are honest and earn a living doing this, but the real aim of most of them is to assess houses and householders in order to pass information back to their leader, targeting particular properties for burglaries at a later date. It is understood that whoever spots a property for a subsequent successful burglary earns a commission. There is often a recognisable track record of burglaries following their calls – usually within a few weeks of their visit.

So, what happens when you hear that knock on your door? First, the 'salesman' will usually be offering cleaning materials, but these will be expensive. The salesman may try to gain your sympathy by saying the goods were made


by a charity. He may also tell you that he is only doing the job while he seeks something better, or that he has just come out of prison and is making a genuine effort to go straight via probation scheme.

Legitimate door-to-door salesmen must have a Pedlar's Certificate signed by a senior police officer. Our man just wouldn't get one! He may produce some piece of dogeared paper, but this will not be a Pedlar's Certificate or anything to do with his supposed probation course. Tell him that you would like to make a note of it prior to checking with the police. He will probably leave very quickly! They often use quite abusive language when you don't buy from them. Don't be worried by this.

Always report these visitors to the police by phoning 101 or by using the Thames Valley Police website. They will appreciate the significance of your call, especially as these guys may be wanted for crimes elsewhere.






A short reminder to you all that the Annual Remembrance Service will be held in the Village Hall on Sunday 13th November at 2.30 pm.

# Chairman's Report October Full Council Meeting

One of our most important tasks this autumn will be to select the companies that provide us with important practical services such as grass cutting, hedge and verge trimming and maintenance of allotments and other Parish property. We have gone for several years without competitive tendering and this is our opportunity to shape future services around our current priorities.

Last Autumn, the Parish commissioned a residents' survey. Due to changes of Councillors and Clerk, it's taken us longer than we'd have liked to analyse the responses, but we now have a presentation, approved by the Council, ready to share with residents. We know that some residents feel that the survey was not particularly well designed but we believe it has some valuable results that should be shared. We continue to listen to community feedback.

What are some of the key findings? Speeding is by far the issue most on residents' minds. The majority of respondents thought that facilities for younger people, especially over-9s, needed to be improved. The Council has established a working group to focus on playgrounds and facilities for young people and there will be more updates coming. Just under 10% of respondents owned allotments – but the vast majority thought they were an important resource for the Parish. On a happy note, very few residents reported problems with crime or anti-social behaviour and pretty well everyone was happy and liked living in the area.

The findings from the Survey will help shape our priorities. For example, we've pushed hard in recent months to get Bucks Council approval to put up Community Speedwatch signs in the Parish. You might have seen these yellow signs in Hazlemere, for example. Councillor Stan Jones, aided principally by John Marchant and James Perkins, has led the negotiations and twelve locations have been approved. The signs will allow us to deploy more speedwatch stations around the Parish. This is in line with the results of the residents' survey, where respondents asked for more signage and more checks.

During the Pandemic, we saw a significant dropoff in grant applications from organisations doing great work in the Parish. We'd like to remind associations, clubs and action groups that the Parish Council welcomes applications for grants to help improve life and amenities around the Parish.

One consequence of the period we experienced without a Clerk and with an inquorate Council in the Spring was that we got behind on the important work of maintaining Parish land, trimming verges and hedgerows, and keeping road signs and footways clear. Under the guidance of Emily Ranahan, the Clerk, and Cllr Jill Armshaw, who chairs the Environment and Services Committee, we kicked off a Tidy Up programme in August. Post-drought grass cutting of the verges has been done, street signs are being cleared and cleaned, some overgrown allotment plots have been cleared, and village gates are being cleaned and repaired.

The Parish Council has recently brought to a conclusion a long running issue over the ownership of several plots of land on which we rent out many of our allotments. The issue revolved around complex and sometimes contradictory legislation going back to the middle of the 19th century, and over the past couple of decades has been subject to a great deal of legal advice, Tribunals and appeals, by both the Council and individual residents. The Council was unable to support a proposed resolution that there remained strong enough grounds to dispute the existing rulings that the land was not Parish-owned land, and hence decided it could not support spending more money seeking to challenge this. Hence it resolved to pay the outstanding overdue lease payments to Hughenden Community Support Trust.

# Overgrown Hedges and Trees Bordering Roads and Paths (Encroachment)

You may not be aware that there are laws governing the encroachment of trees and hedging bordering footways and roads.

There should be clearance of at least 2.2m (7' 2") above a footway, pavement, or verge to allow pedestrians free passage.



Hedges/vegetation should be cut back to the property boundary line so as not to overhang or encroach onto the highway (meaning carriageway, footway, or verge). It is very easy for hedges to get thicker just by a little bit each year, despite being cut back regularly, to the extent that they eventually take up quite a lot of space on a pavement. That hedge may require some radical pruning to put it back where it should be. Indeed, your hedges may need more than one pruning session to keep them inside your boundary line.

Hughenden Parish Council (HPC) own very few hedges, mostly around allotments, the Common in Great Kingshill and some open areas. HPC also looks after a small number of hedges on behalf of Buckinghamshire Council. The vast majority of hedges are owned by you, our parishioners.

We request that you check all of your boundaries to make sure that you are compliant with the above. Especially those with hedges bordering pavements and encroaching onto roads. Hedges should not be cut within the period 1st March to the 1st September, to support our wildlife, unless they are causing a risk to health and safety, when they can be cut back regardless of date.

Should you be unable to maintain your hedges within the legal guidelines, please contact the office who may be able to suggest a list of contractors who undertake this type of work.

If you are not sure which are your boundaries hedges, you can check them at

https://mywycombe.wycombe.gov.uk/ by clicking My Maps option and ticking the Land Ownership category. This will take you to the website where you can purchase land registry details of your property which may help you. (Please see QR code below)



#### Bradenham Parish Council

At our last parish council meeting it was confirmed that the Bledlow Ridge Recycling Centre will be reopened, much to the delight of the parish council. Buckinghamshire Councillor Carl Etholen was thanked for his work to get the site reopened together with former Buckinghamshire County Councillor Bill Bendyshe Brown.

We were informed the new data centre being built in Saunderton will require high voltage cabling to be laid from Amersham to Saunderton, this cabling will come through our parish sometime in the future. The new stretch of road surface on New Road is a much quieter, we have asked if that type of road surface could be used when the A4010 gets resurfaced. The white lining on the road in Bradenham village is starting to show through again, we have brought it to Buckinghamshire Council's attention.

It was decided to write to Affinity Water about the frequent repairs to the water pipes on New Road/Main Road asking for a permanent repair, Buckinghamshire Councillor Carl Etholen provided support and we will copy Buckinghamshire Councillor Gareth Williams in our correspondence.

We will undertake some maintenance work to our war memorial, the Lychgate, at St Botolph's church.

It was noted that the time tables for the bus services that run along the A4010 have been changed.

Over the summer months there have been several incidents of vandalism on the green in Bradenham, mainly someone doing "wheelies" on the green. These have damaged the green and the cricket pitch and are unsightly. The National Trust own the green and are aware of the problem. The parish council had been asked if they could consider putting CCTV on the green, but as we don't own the green we are not able to place CCTV there.

Electric vehicle charging points were briefly discussed but as we don't own any land, we have nowhere to place any.

Our next meeting will be Monday 7th November at the Cricket club starting at 7pm. All welcome.

**Local Tales: The Hanging Man** 

The precise date of this incident is uncertain, but it must have been in 1945, towards the end of World War II. At that time the Mead family lived in Vivaldi, an attractive white house in Stocking Lane next to Lane Wood. Mr Mead was a talented musician who played the organ in Naphill Methodist Chapel. They had two daughters and a son: all just children at the time. The daughters, Sheila and Hillary, had a bedroom on the side of the house facing the wood.

One dark night they were woken by someone loudly shouting and swearing outside their bedroom window. When they looked out, they could just see a man hanging in a tree on the edge of the wood. It became apparent that he was tangled up in the branches by his parachute and desperately wanted help to get down.

Mr Mead explained that he did not have a ladder but would get one immediately. He then hurried off, a quarter of a mile up to Little Mosely Farm at the top of the lane. There lived a farm worker, Joe Stroud (his son still lives in the village). Mr Mead briefly sketched the situation and asked for a ladder. Not knowing the details of the case, Mr Stroud, quite sensibly, chose the longest ladder on the farm. At the time they had a large cherry orchard, so the best choice was a wooden fruit picking ladder. These are enormously heavy, very long with splayed feet at the bottom. (If you have never seen one, go to Hildreth's garden centre where two are displayed on the ceiling of the shop.)

Joe struggled down the lane carrying the ladder, but when he had manoeuvred it into the wood and to the vital tree, he found that he could reach up and touch the hanging man's feet! He was only a couple of yards off the ground. Joe was not pleased. However, the man was rescued to everyone's relief and with smiles all round. I remember the silk parachute lay at the base of the tree for only a day or so and whilst the harness hung there for ages but of course, this too is long gone!

Unfortunately there is a sad ending to the tale. The airman was a gunner on a British Mosquito fighter/bomber which was struggling home after receiving serious damage. It eventually crashed at North Dean on the hillside just to the left of Piggotts Hill. The brave pilot had avoided the houses, but I believe he was killed. A large black patch marked the hillside for many years.

Friends of Naphill Common

By the time you read this, West Wycombe Estate will have brought a 'mulcher' onto the Common. This is a large caterpillar-tracked vehicle equipped with a flail that can reduce piles of offcuts and holly thickets to woodchip, just a few inches in length. It won't clear every pile of brash in the newly thinned area, leaving some as wildlife habitat - similarly for the holly stands, 'reduce but not eliminate' is the intention. The same type of clearance was carried out on the previous areas selected for thinning, with positive results. This operation should take a few days, and after completion there are no plans for any further thinning work this year. New growth of foxgloves is already noticeable in the recently cleared area, and we can hope for a good show next spring (as we've seen previously in thinned areas).

The refurbishment of the noticeboards at the various entrances to the Common is progressing slowly but surely. The board on Chapel Lane has been returned in its new, cleaned state, and the one on Forge Road has been removed to the workshop. Once this has been renovated, there only remains the board at the Bradenham end of the Common. Buckinghamshire Council have contributed half the costs of this work.

As in previous years, the Bucks Fungus Group held a walk across the Common. The weather was very kind to us, with the Common looking at its preautumnal best, and even some dragonflies still active on the ponds. We found a good selection of fungi, including some rarities, and a detailed report and photos can be found on the BFG web site. To keep numbers manageable, the BFG now restrict their walks to members only, but joining is very cheap and easy if you would like to participate in future walks.



#### When Parables Become Real

I am downsizing! My husband has retired from his post as Rector of All Saints, so we must move from our generously sized vicarage to a far more modest property. All the paraphernalia that has been a constant of vicarage life needs to be reduced, reused, recycled or repurposed. I've had a lot of enjoyment from putting out boxes of unwanted items accompanied by a notice inviting people to help themselves to free stuff and help save the planet by reusing, recycling or repurposing our unwanted items. I would put out two or three boxes in the morning, go to work, come home and it was like the tidying fairies had come – everything was gone. On one occasion, even the box containing the items had gone!

The liberation of getting rid of stuff has been amazing. I'm not going the whole hog as suggested by James Wallman in his book 'Stuffocation' (excellent popular psychology read) where you put everything into boxes and only take out what you need as you need it. After 10 days, you should have everything you require, so the rest of your stuff can be discarded. A bit too radical for me, but I do reckon I've been pretty ruthless with my stuff.

So I'm feeling good about getting rid of shed loads of small stuff. Much harder were some of the larger items, like our daughter's cot. My parents had bought a (then) fancy cot for their first grandchild. It was robust enough to stand up to our next child and, since it was a fancy cot, served as a small bed whilst daughter number two grew from a baby to a young child. It was a good cot. I should

have sold it or donated it to charity, but we had the space, so I kept it on the fanciful whim that my daughters would want to place their own babies in what had once been their cot. The treasured cot was flat packed and lovingly transported from vicarage to vicarage awaiting the day when it would come into use once again.

Now there is no storage space, no prospect of any grandchildren and the removals company wants to charge for every item we shift. Sadly, the cot has to go, but we are consoled by the fact that we can take it to the recycling centre and another baby will benefit from it. Wrong! Recycling centre rules have changed. 'It's a bed!' they say, 'We don't take beds!' My beautiful, treasured baby's cot is now useless junk! If I had passed it on 25 years ago, it would have been used by others, but now it is worthless rubbish.

Jesus once told a parable about stuff. He warned against storing riches and stuff, because they can be corrupted and destroyed, becoming useless rubbish. Instead, he spoke of riches in heaven, things that really count and that money can't buy. These things do not rot or rust or become ravaged by time. #### From the Vicarage

It's good to be back! I have had the huge privilege of spending three months over the summer on sabbatical from my parish ministry, and I had a wonderful time.

Highlights included a three day retreat at a Franciscan monastery in rural Worcestershire, a walking holiday in the Lake District, driving around a bishop from overseas prior to the Lambeth Conference, attending a Music Festival in the grounds of a stately home, to watching Cricket at Lords, Edgbaston and Taunton.

However, my most memorable time was two weeks spent in South India. I serve on a diocesan committee that seeks to strengthen links which Oxford diocese has with three overseas dioceses in Sweden, South Africa and India.

Nandyal is a city located some 180 miles South of Hyderabad, in the South of India. It is also the name of the diocese with which we have a link, and I was invited to spend some time visiting my Christian brothers and sisters, which I was able to do in September.

Those who have been to India for themselves will surely never forget the warm and generous hospitality of the Indian people, the amazing food, driving on Indian roads, which are not for the fainthearted, and being immersed in a culture so different to our own in leafy High Wycombe.

I spent 10 days being hosted by Bishop Pushpa, the only female bishop in Asia. I enjoyed good health throughout my stay, and was able to visit many of the churches, schools, orphanages and other diocesan projects, as well as preach three times in the Cathedral of the Holy Cross.



As well as fostering stronger links with my new friends in Nandyal, my trip to India also had a personal family history dimension. My great Aunt and Uncle spent twenty five years in the 1930s – 1950s serving as missionaries in South India, and I was able to explore some of those family roots, which included visiting a Church in Pulivendula, where there is a plague laid in their memory, and the school where my great Aunt was headmistress for five years.

It felt such a privilege to know that I was walking in their footsteps almost 100 years later, and still able to see evidence of their work and lasting legacy.

Rev Dr Chris and Rev Helen Rolles served with the London Missionary Society. Much of their work was itinerant, travelling from town to village, treating the sick with a team of doctors and nurses, as well as bringing the Christian gospel to many who were hearing the good news for the first time. As a result, missionaries such as my ancestors, brought Christianity to India.

I encountered a thriving Church of South India, with ambitious plans to build new churches, help bring hope, healing, and practical support to the most vulnerable in society and a desire to be salt and light within their communities.

I returned to the UK with a renewed appreciation for just how richly blessed we are as a society in so many ways, a commitment to stay in touch with my new friends in Nandyal and a hope to perhaps return to India one day in the not too distant future.

#### **Church News**

#### Gordon the Birdman



Those hot summer days have long gone and with them the summer migrants, but autumn brings visitors from the north to enjoy our relatively mild winters. Locally, we will only see Fieldfare, Redwing, Brambling and if lucky a Waxwing. The others being species we regard as our resident birds but the chances are that the Blackbirds, Robins, Starlings and Finches we see in winter have come from the continent.

To see the majority of visitors (Geese, Ducks, Swans and Waders) we have to travel to the coast. These birds travel long distances from above the arctic circle, the long distance champion being the Light Bellied Brent Goose, unlike it's cousin the Dark Bellied Brent Goose which breeds in Russia and can be found all along the eastern and southern coast. the Light Bellied can only be seen in Scotland and Northern Ireland. These birds breed in the high arctic areas of northern Canada and it is quite possible they nest further north than any other bird, being as little as 300 miles from the North Pole. Most of the geese nest on bare rock and shingle which is incredibly exposed to unpredictable weather.

If the geese demonstrate supreme hardiness on their breeding grounds, it is nothing compared to their migration to Britain which at around 4,000 miles is the longest of all wildfowl. It isn't just the distance that's impressive – it's the conditions they endure and the terrain they pass over. They have to negotiate the entire Greenland ice cap then have the first of two North Atlantic crossings from Greenland to Iceland. The Greenland ice cap reaches 9,000 feet above sea level and satellite tracking suggests that sometimes the geese sit out adverse weather on the ice cap.

Iceland is a treat in comparison, they being able to refuel on the extensive Eel Grass beds on the west coast. Then having regained their strength they take on their second North Atlantic crossing. This takes them to Ireland where the main body of birds stop at Strangford Lough with some carrying on to the west coast of Scotland.





#### Cardio fitness – Getting Started



The importance of keeping fit is well known and understood, however often it can seem very daunting to get started. As with many things, it is better to start with small steps (no pun intended!), and gradually build up. Below is a simple guide for the first 4 weeks. I would suggest starting with walking, especially as we are lucky enough to have plenty of lovely places to walk in and around Naphill and Walter's Ash.

#### How long should I train and how many times per week?

First 4 weeks	Duration in minutes	How many times per week
Week 1	15-20	3
Week 2	20-25	3-3
Week 3	20-25	3-4
Week 4	25-30	3-4

#### How hard should I be working?

A scale that is often used to assess how hard a client is working is the "Rate of perceived exertion (RPE)". This is a method where the exerciser assesses how hard the exercise feels on a scale of 0 to 10, where 0 is rest and 10 is maximal effort. When starting off with training, you should aim to work at a "moderate" to "somewhat hard" pace, which equates to 3 and 4 out of 10. As fitness improves, you will be able to cover more distance and walk at a faster pace for the same level of effort.

#### How can I track my progress?

If you are someone who likes facts and figures, you can measure and record the distance covered in each of your workouts, and track the improvement over time. Alternatively, you can do the same route once per week, and measure how long it takes you, or simply enjoy being able to walk more briskly over the weeks without measuring it specifically.

#### Other considerations

It is important to feel comfortable and feel safe on your route, so think about the terrain. Footpaths in the woods can be uneven and muddy, so you may prefer to start on the pavements.

It can be more fun to find a walking buddy to share your walks with, or maybe join an organised walk (see the Gazette for details of regular FONC walks, for instance).

#### At the end of your exercise

Always cool down, by walking at an easy pace (1-2 on the effort scale) for 5 minutes at the end of your walk, to help the body return back to its normal state.

BEFORE starting any exercise programme, you should consult with your GP to confirm that it is safe for you to do so.



**Growing Your Own** 

Firstly, a tip. For many years I have had problems growing parsley. Whether I sowed seed indoors or directly in the ground, I had very poor results. Then, last spring, I bought a small pot of parsley from the supermarket. After taking the crop I extracted the plants from the pot and carefully split the tangled mass of tiny roots into six groups. I planted them in the garden a foot apart and, hey presto! I had the most enormous crop of superb moss-curled parsley. Now news about strawberries. I crop my strawberries in the garden from the end of May until the end of July. The plants then usually produce some flowers in late summer which rarely produce any fruit. But not this year! After our record hot dry summer I had masses of strawberry flowers in late summer and they produced some large ripe strawberries in the autumn.

I have been asked by a reader to praise the hoe. The hoe is undoubtedly the best tool the gardener has. If you can catch the weeds when they are less than an inch high they are very easy to kill off with a little shallow hoeing. If you can go round your plot once a week it is surprising how little time it takes, leaving the small weeds on the surface to dry out. However, if you go away for a few weeks it is a different matter! Then you may need to go round like I do with a spade, shallowly hoe with the spade, grab a handful of weeds, bang them on the spade to release loose soil, then the weeds

go into a bucket en route to the compost heap. Then weekly hoeing with a hoe can resume. I have had my hoe for 53 years. It is a "Dutch hoe", with a stainless steel blade and a long wooden handle. It has been a good friend.

I have made what is, for me, a momentous decision. I'm now into my 50th year of working my allotment at Walter's Ash. I am the longest-serving tenant and the oldest. I won't tell you how old I am but I have celebrated my 21st birthday four times. I am a great-grandad (twice). During the past two years I have found it increasingly difficult to keep on top of my allotment, so I have decided not to renew my tenancy. It is not goodbye to growing my own though. I have always had a big vegetable plot in the garden, plus a large greenhouse and ten espalier fruit trees. I have been expanding my vegetable plot and shall work it more intensively, intercropping and planting another crop as soon as one is finished. Nevertheless, there are some crops which I will no longer be able to grow, such as potatoes and asparagus since they take up too much space. For other crops I shall grow reduced quantities, concentrating on favourites.


