There was a meeting of the village hall committee on the 6 September and for the first time in many months we were in the village hall. We had nearly a full house, there were 19 in attendance. We heard from Tanya the lettings secretary that more groups are returning to the hall and the lettings are nearly back to normal. Peter Williams reported that he had inspected the play area and noted that the teen swing needs attention and it will need replacing in a couple of years. The play area also needs to be kept clear of weeds and the willow tunnel needs to be trimmed. That has been trimmed this week. The faulty cctv camera will be replaced on the 18 September.

Last Saturday Napfest was held and it was great to see people out on the Crick. There were 3 flypasts, the Red Arrows, the Spitfire and the Typhoon, fortunately the weather was kind, although it was cloudy it was warm. Hopefully everyone enjoyed themselves and the music event in the evening was well attended. The village Best Neighbour Award went to Cathryn and Ron Carter for their help for many years in fundraising activities in the village. On August bank holiday Sunday, Classics on the

Crick was held. The village hall ran the Beer Tent and the profits from the bar went to the village hall instead of a rental fee so about a Thousand pounds was raised.

The next village hall fundraising event will be the Fireworks event on the 6 November, the only reason that the event might not take place is a Covid problem. Hopefully that will not happen and The Best Fireworks Display in Bucks will take place along with the bonfire, BBQ and Beer tent. Unfortunately the village hall seem to have misplaced a barrel BBQ, if you know where it is we would like it returned please.

The village hall upkeep is ongoing and we are getting quotes for new doors, along with the maintenance of the hall. Mark Butler has agreed to look after the War Memorial garden. With the poor phone reception in the area I will look into the possibility of a phone mast at the village hall.

## Classics on the Crick – Charity Car Show August 2021

## Together we raised a fantastic £14,000 for Thames Valley Air Ambulance!

Due to COVID this event was cancelled last year but we were delighted to rearrange the date for this August and so get to hold Classics on the Crick again!

Entries opened on our website, in mid-June via the Classics on the Crick website, http://www. classicsonthecrick.co.uk There was a steady stream of entries to the point that we reached capacity a couple of weeks before the show, so unfortunately, we had some disappointed Classic Car owners!

Setting up the show required a bit more effort this year, as we were going alone. The Naphill Fete were unable to share the same weekend due too many of their organising team being unavailable over the bank holiday weekend. However, with the field free all Saturday, we could make an early start and by first thing Sunday morning we were ready for an influx of cars, bikes and visitors. The weather stayed dry, and soon after 9am there was a steady stream of colourful vehicles arriving at the Crick. Some were local, there are plenty of petrol heads in Naphill & Walters Ash, whilst some made long journeys from all over the South. By noon we had nearly 350 cars on the field and at least 50 motor bikes parked on the Village Hall car park.

There was diverse display from a rare 1920 Hispano Suiza H6 described in its day as the "best car in the world" to some once humble cars such as the Austin Metro that could be found on every street in the 1980's. As usual we had a good array of vendors selling tasty food and drink who were kept busy serving the many visitors. Special thanks to Clive and the Men's Club who worked tirelessly to provide a great bar stocked with those essential Rebellion beers!

During the afternoon there was live music from a couple of local artists. Chris Weeks started with his energetic 50's inspired set and later we saw the return of the talented Laura Williams with a string of popular songs. At just after 3pm, we announced

our three main competitor awards.

- Best Car in Show went to Dave Kentish with his fabulous Chevrolet 210 Street Hot Rod
- Best Bike in Show went to a rare Ardie 250
   which was brought at along at the last minute
   by Gerry Whisker.
- The Public's Choice Award All the visitors to the show had the opportunity to vote for their favourite car or bike. This year the most popular was a flamboyant purple VW Beetle owned by Tony Nixey.

The show closed at about 4pm, after another very successful day! With the fantastic support from our Classic vehicle owners and the many visitors, we raised an amazing £14,000 for the Thames Valley Air Ambulance!





#### Events

On Friday 13th of August, our local bat expert, Julie Hopton, led a walk around the Common to see and hear some of our bats – bat detectors, to scale down their ultrasonic chirps to be within range of human hearing, were provided. We had a good turnout of about 25 people and saw and heard numerous bats.

The next 'special event' will be our annual guided Fungus Walk on Sunday 10th October. As in previous years, we will split up into a few groups, each led by a 'local guide' (drawn from the FoNC Committee) and, more importantly, an expert in fungi, who can help identify the finds. And these really are experts, including professors and people working on fungi at Kew and the Natural History Museum. It's a real privilege to take a walk through the woods with them.

#### News

The other major news is that we expect the next phase of felling to commence this autumn (subject, as always, to weather and other possible delays). As before, West Wycombe Estate and their contractors (Wessex Woodland) have helpfully offered to involve FoNC in the planning process. Once again, we will identify trees that should be retained (although the Estate has no desire to cut down healthy veteran trees) and those that require thinning. As this phase of the process will include work around Dew Pond, we are keen to ensure that no damage is done to the remains (bank and ditch) of the Romano-British Farmstead. The wheels of the tractors used can (particularly in wet and muddy conditions, not unknown on the Common during winter) leave deep ruts, as many of our readers will have seen after previous felling phases. But it isn't as simple as 'keep off', because falling trees cause 'root heave' that can also damage archaeological remains.

#### The Common

We're now entering the "season of mists and mellow fruitfulness" and nature's bounty is once again to be found in the hedgerows. Our plum trees (survivors from the days when fruitgrowing was a significant Chilterns activity) are laden with Damsons, Mirabelles (a cultivar developed in France) and Bullaces – a smaller version of the Damson, which tastes bitter when raw, but can be cooked with a suitable addition of sugar.

There are also Sloes, for those with a taste for gin! Remember these must, by tradition, be pricked with a thorn from the blackthorn bushes on which they grow, before being added to the gin to infuse. The blackberries I've found a little disappointing this year – fewer in number and rather small – not worth the trouble of gathering for a bramble and apple pie or making jelly, but still tasty for 'grazing' on the move.

#### **Activities**

Our guided walks are again taking place, with longer walks (around two hours, finishing with optional lunch at a local hostelry when possible) being led by Ron Collins and Neil McMinn, and usually held on the third Monday of each month, starting at 9:25am prompt from the Village Hall. Shorter walks (around an hour, finishing with optional coffee and cakes at the Bon Ami) are led by Chris Miller and are generally on the first Wednesday of each month, starting at 10:30am from the Village Hall. The walks are free, and all are welcome.

Our working parties are also in full swing and take place on most Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Because they, too, are dependent on the weather, it's best to check our web site for details (where our walking and other activities are also listed):

## A Nocturnal Walk in Search of BATS!

Being an outdoorsy family with two boys, we are often on the lookout for new and interesting adventures! Luckily, friends told us about a nocturnal walk around Naphill looking for bats. The boys were particularly excited at the thought of using bat detectors!

So, on Friday 13th August we arrived at Naphill Village Hall in the early evening to meet Julie Hopton who is truly batty about bats! A sizeable group gathered round to listen to all sorts of amazing bat facts and little known information. Did you know that bats are the only mammals whose knees bend backwards or that their muscles are relaxed when they are clinging on? The group consisted of couples and families with young children all geared up for a bat hunt around the village. Julie gave us all a bat detector to use and explained what frequencies to use to hear different species of native bats resident in the area. We headed off excitedly listening out for clicking and a rather unusual raspberry noise!

The sun had just started to set as we walked into the first field with our detectors pointed skyward, looking and listening. After a few false alarms (pigeons mainly!), some of the children managed to pick up the noises as their younger ears were more sensitive to the high frequency

noises bats use to locate their prey. As we reached the first pond we were all treated to not only noises on our bat detectors but also the sight of bats swooping low over the water catching small insects. Everyone was excited by this point with lots of shouts of 'there's one!' and 'I think that's a soprano pipistrelle'.

We walked around several small ponds and wooded areas as the light faded away searching for the mysterious mammals. We were also lucky to find a violet ground beetle and see a few owls sweep through the trees calling to each other. As we walked back to the Village Hall we all felt so appreciative of the nature we have around us and of people like Julie who give up their time to impart their knowledge to others so freely. It was a worthwhile evening out and we'd highly recommend it to others. I'm sure that we'll be back again next year!

### Growing Your Own

For many years we have been warned about global warming, along the lines of "if we don't cut our emissions there will be terrible consequences". It therefore came as quite a shock the other day when the government announced that the consequences had arrived and that our climate in the UK was being adversely affected by global warming.

Here in Naphill and Walter's Ash I have been commenting for some time that extreme weather patterns were affecting the growing of crops in our gardens and on our allotments. Nothing on the scale of elsewhere in the world mind you, with coverage on our TVs of catastrophic fires, floods, hurricanes and whatever. But we have already been affected in our small way. In 2018 we had a period from May to July when we had no rain at all for three months. That had me really worried and it was difficult to get seed to germinate and a lot of watering was necessary. This year, we had a month of very cold weather in April/May which was accompanied by a complete absence of rain – a most unusual combination.

The weather can be so critical; a matter of days can make a big difference. An example was the pollination of my apricot and flat peach trees. Both were late in coming into flower this year because of a long, cold winter. I always have to hand-pollinate because of the absence of pollinating insects in February/March. This time, I hand pollinated in April. The apricot blossom was slightly ahead of the peach. We had a brief bad frost when both trees still had blossom. The result – the best crop of apricots I have ever had, and no peaches at all. The frost had occurred just after the apricot blossom set and the peach blossom had yet to set.

After the 3-month drought of 2018 I took steps to capture moisture which arrives at the surface from the depths and then evaporates. On the allotment I put down strips of black plastic in order to provide dampness under the plastic, which would enable the vegetables either side of the strips to benefit from

the damper soil. And then? You guessed it. We were deluged with rain in the summers of 2019, 2020 and 2021. You can't win them all, but it would be nice to win some!!

I keep experimenting with new vegetable and fruit varieties. It is really amazing what the plant breeders are achieving. I must tell you about the tremendous climbing French bean I have tried this year – "Fortex". Cropping starts 10 to 12 weeks after sowing. The pods are about 8 inches long and completely stringless. The size of crop is very impressive. They are simply delicious on the plate, especially if boiled with a little garlic.



I LOVE this time of year! The nights drawing in and the bobble hats coming out. The excuse to light up the lounge with fairy lights and lamps, duvet days and the awesome changing of the colours outside. The markers at this time of year from battle of Britain day, October half term, Remembrance and then the advent approach to Christmas...Autumn...one of my four favourite seasons!

A few years ago I spent a whole year in winter. Nope, I didn't stumble into Narnia, I was deployed to the Falklands for the British summer which meant I was there for their winter. It was during that year that I realised how much I love the changing seasons in this country. There is something about the rhythm of the seasons which help my own rhythm in life.

I wonder what your rhythm is at the moment? Are you enjoying the change in season, have you been longing to get the bobble hats out, or are you clinging on to the summer wardrobe!?

Having a rhythm in a year is important. A rhythm which gives time for preparing, 'harvesting', working, resting, gathering and celebrating. More Bobbins Bobbin' 11th September was a very busy day not only on the Crick but also at Lacey Green Village Hall where lace-making was being celebrated with a Bobbin Lace Taster Day.

The date chosen for the event seemed most appropriate as the second Saturday in September is National Lacemaking Day when lace-makers across the country share their craft with the nation. It seemed the obvious choice to Rosemary Mortham and I when we suggested to the Chalk Cherries and Chairs Woodlanders' team that we test the level of interest in lace-making locally by holding an event in the village where 'Countryfile' had recorded their item in April. Between the two sessions more than 30 beginners worked the 'Have-A-Go' pillows guided by experienced lace-makers, observed Binche ( a continental style) lace being worked and listened to talks on the History of lace-making given by C.C.C. volunteers, Rosemary Mortham and Sharon Howe .

Ladies from Risboro' Lacemakers very kindly gave their time and expertise. They also loaned various items of lace for our displays, one showing where regional styles of lace developed in England, another the wide range of uses for bobbin lace evolving and a third illustrating key features of the basic equipment for bobbin lacemaking.

The Lace Guild kindly supplied us with second-hand equipment which was complemented by a similar stall set up by Chesham's Work Aid centre ... together their sales amounted to almost£250.

Although constrained by the pandemic the day was very successful, several adults and children wish to build on this experience and in response to enquiries it may be repeated possibly in Wycombe next year.

### Message from Bradenham Vicarage - A Covid-time parable

Like so many, for the duration of lockdown, I have made extensive use of social media. This has waned of late due to the plethora of well meaning, overlong posts that 'reflect' on various issues, contain worthy messages and then manipulate 'true friends' into forwarding the post to other contacts. That said, my brother in law (who lives in Malaysia) recently sent a story to our private family WhatsApp group which I thought was actually worth sharing. I share it with you below as a modern parable. Anonymous and set in a fictional context, it makes a valid point and gives food for thought.

A blind boy sat on the corner of the road with a signboard at his side.

It read 'Pease help me. I'm a blind, poor boy.'

People barely noticed the board and he only earned a few small coins each day, though it was a busy corner of the road.

One day, a man walked by him and noticed the board. He stopped and gave the boy a few small coins. He did another thing too – he changed the words on the board. A few moments later, the boy was surprised by the sounds of more and more coins being dropped into his box. A lot more people than usual were noticing him and placing coins in his box. The boy was amazed and wanted to know the reason why this had happened.

The next day, the man came again to see if there was any difference for the boy. The boy recognised him by the sound of his footsteps. He asked the man 'What did you do yesterday?'

The man told him. 'I did nothing apart from make a change on your signboard.' I wrote 'Today is a beautiful day and I can't see it.'

The boy said 'But the meaning is the same. Why did people help me more than usual?'

The man told him 'Yes, you're right, but the original sign simply told people you were blind. The second sign made them aware that they were not blind.'

The boy now understood. You often don't value a thing until you no longer have it.

A modern, Covid-time tale of how we should value even the tiniest blessings in life before it's too late. It's also a tale of how a change in perspective can make a big difference. Jesus often told stories and spoke in parables. Living in the present and valuing what we have were key themes of his teaching, as was viewing things from a different perspective. The different perspective he asked us to consider was that of how God views each and every one of us. Time and again the New Testament tells how we are precious to God and how He loves us as a father, with all that that implies.

Romans 8:17: Now if we are children, then we are heirs – heirs of God

May you know the blessing of God's love in your life.

Clappins Lane Monitoring Team Report

It has been a while since my last update, mainly because the lack of communication from Dandara and Coinford has prohibited me from sharing anything remotely useful for the community. However, as we head into Autumn, an update for those who don't live in the vicinity is probably due.

On the Dandara website it states that the first houses are being launched in October – at the moment, it looks like foundations have been laid for a few houses, but other than that, we have been looking at huge mounds of hardcore and dirt for a few weeks. I have asked Coinford /Dandara for an update on their build schedule and when they plan to install fences to border Allen Drive and Woodcock Avenue, but I have yet to receive a response to any of my emails.

Despite a somewhat disappointing Summer, there was definitely a distinct lack of sunshine, during the warmer months, some residents were unable to open windows or doors and they were unable use their gardens during the week. This was made more difficult when Coinford began to work every Saturday! This was a tipping point for many of us, especially when works commenced as early as 7.45am.

Residents of Clappins Lane, Batting's Wood Gardens and Allen Drive as well as commuters, have battled unregulated road closures and have sometimes also had their drives being blocked by HGV vehicles. The noise pollution and constant clouds of dust have been a continuing issue for residents both bordering and living close to the field.

Various HGV vehicles have also been using Woodcock Avenue and the aforementioned roads to turn around or park up until they are needed on site. Many residents have reported large stones and rocks on the roads, where vehicles have shed some of their load.

I did not anticipate the impact this development would have on our daily lives nor how mentally draining this would be. Having fought this development so passionately for so long, many of us just want to get the estate built so that we can all move on and have some semblance of peace and normality returned to our community.

8pm Hero Award winner Geoff Pegg, Director of Operations, Neighbourhood Watch, will bring us up-to-date, with his team, on Cons and Scams.

Members of the Police are attending to hear the talk and the meeting will be run by Acting Chairman John Russell.

#### **Environment**

Together with local residents we invited Alastair Cunningham, Senior Arboricultural Officer for Planning & Environment at Buckinghamshire Council, to examine a small woodland off Downley Road which he decided to safeguard with a Tree Preservation Order.

We have added our objections to an application to replace the 2-bed cottage with a 5-bed house because the problems the related traffic will cause seem insurmountable.

We have expressed our concern to Enforcement over development in Green Belt in Battingswood Gardens and in farmland off Louches Lane.

Some residents in Chapel Lane are objecting to an application to increase the size of the Romanian Church (previously Methodist Chapel) because, amongst other things, extra traffic will follow.

Crime Figures between 20th June and 24th August 2021 - provided by the Police for Neighbourhood Action Group - Naphill: 5 incidents: 2 assaults, 1 drug offence, 1 public order, 1 theft. Walter's Ash: 4 incidents. 2 thefts, 1 public order, 1 burglary from a garage. Hughenden Valley: 6 incidents, 1 arson, 1 assault, 1 burglary (caught red handed), 2 criminal damage and 1 drug offence.

Hedgerows Overhanging Roads and Pavements If you have a hedge that overhangs a pavement or road, please could you keep it cut back so people in wheelchairs or pushing a buggy don't have to avoid it by taking the risk of going to the edge of the pavement or further into the road. I was sent a photo of an elderly man whose wheelchair had slipped off the pavement when avoiding an overhanging hedge. He lay on the road helplessly, caught up in his wheelchair which had fallen on its side for a considerable time before people walking past helped him up.

### **Community Speedwatch**

The number of vehicles caught speeding through Naphill in the last two Speedwatch sessions has been 10 and 13. The average for the Parish in the last month has been 60 per week. Our Speedwatch team used to number 8 but now only numbers 3. We could do with a few more. Passing the Police video test on your computer to qualify is really simple and quite fun. 


