

Do You Live on Easy Street?

Burglars are often opportunistic thieves who prey on houses and flats. They seek out any opening that they can take advantage of, specifically doors and windows that are left open or unlocked or are easy to force.

- -Point of entry is gained by burglars using ladders, garden furniture or drainpipes to get on top of flat roofs.
- -They will then enter through a bedroom window to gain access to the upstairs of the property
- -Jewellery seems to be the main target, however all valuables are at risk, especially if easy to grab and go. Some suggestions to reduce likelihood of becoming a victim:
- -Lower fences at the front around one-metre high are preferable to high fences as they allow for a clear view over the top and don't provide cover for anyone wishing to hide.
- -At the rear and sides, taller fencing is recommended to prevent easy access.
- -Trellis, thorny plants, or a suitable anti-climb topping such as plastic spikes make it difficult for anyone climbing over a
- -Gravel driveways and paths will make sure you hear anyone approach.

Neighbourhood Watch Update



There has been a spate of keyless car thefts around Wycombe where offenders are using key cloning equipment which picks up the key signal from inside victims' homes, allowing thieves to access and steal cars without physically having the key. If you have a keyless car:

- ✓ Consider putting your car key in a Signal Blocker (contact: office@wdnhwatch.plus.com)
- Consider investing in CCTV or 'Ring' doorbells that cover your driveway.
- ✓ Report any suspicious activity to the police on 101 or on the TVP website.
