


Thames Valley Police – Rural Team Update

The **Rural Neighbourhood Team** has been busy across the local area talking to businesses and residents. Here is some timely advice:

We have been doing some work with local residents to share crime prevention advice following a series of burglaries we have seen in the areas. From our reports, a few burglaries have taken place while the resident(s) have been away for a longer period of time. Burglars will take advantage of any opportunities they spot, such as a house in darkness with no cars on the drive, or if they spot that the house is the only one on the street with the bins still out. These factors communicate that no one is home.

While our Detective teams continue endeavouring to identify those responsible, we would recommend certain preventative measures such as a timer switch. A timer switch can be timed to turn a light on in your house when it becomes dark outside, making it an effective way to make your house look occupied if you are away and can't turn a light on yourself.

If you do plan to go away, you can also try to speak with a neighbour and ask them to park on your drive or return your bins so your home doesn't look unoccupied.
