


What a bargain thought the couple who chatted with the man and discovered that his company operates from an area of London with which they were familiar. Luckily our vigilant Ward Leader, Anne Smart happened to chat to the couple and pointed out that no one has 'spare tarmac' and that they should get at least 3 (written) quotes for any works. She contacted **Trading Standards** who were able to confirm that the company operated out of Southampton. Neighbourhood Watch has also been alerted as this is highly likely to be a scam.

Neighbourhood Watch adds:

'At the risk of repeating advice that we have given consistently over the last 25 years or so, do take considerable care in doing business with these callers. In fact, we would recommend that you do not engage with them at all as so many of them result in overcharging, providing poor quality workmanship, or creating extra work for themselves to do.

Always get written quotations on headed paper if you should consider using their services and get more than one auotation'.
