



Naphill Village Hall & Playing Fields Council Chairman's Report

There were 15 trustees present at the village hall meeting on the 1st .July.

We agreed to renew the Hallmaster booking system for another year. There are still some problems with some of the hall bookings. These appear mainly to do with the weekend hirings. The hall has been left in a mess and extra cleaning has to be done before the next hirer comes to the hall. We have discussed ways and means of regulating the situation but basically it comes down to having someone at the hall when the hire period expires, which is sometimes after 10.00 pm. All the committee are volunteers so it cannot be guaranteed that someone will be on hand to supervise the end of the hire period. The committee are trying to come to a solution but it is difficult to find a way to enforce any sanctions. The other alternative is to put up the hire rates for the weekend users to cover the cost of extra cleaning as sometimes the cleaning costs end up making the money we earn from the hire not worth the effort!

The playground was also discussed. The committee has three quotes for the equipment and we agreed to go ahead with one of these quotes. Unfortunately, the lead time for the play unit from the manufacturer is several weeks so the playground will not be in full swing until early autumn. Work to clear the condemned equipment will happen soon. Welcome news is Hughenden Parish Council have approved the grant for the playground. This is 20% of the final cost, so we will use some of our reserves to pay for the balance.

The Scout and Guides have asked the village hall to pay for double glazing and new doors for their meeting place. The cost will be £5220 and we are looking to applying for some grants to help us finance this improvement.

Fireworks event is on 2nd. November, the tickets cost will be the same as last year if purchased before the event, with price increasing nearer to the event. On Sunday 1st. December the village hall Christmas Fayre will be held at 1 o'clock with many stalls for Christmas present ideas.

The committee still urgently need a secretary for the village hall, at the moment we do not have one. The role would be to answer any emails with reference to the hall, compile the next meetings agenda, (there is a template for this) and save any relevant documents to dropbox. If you think you could help please email me at chairman@ naphillvillagehall.org.uk

There is also a vacancy on the committee for somebody to oversee the maintenance of the village hall. This entails keeping the hall in good repair and liaising with various tradespeople to do the required work, probably an hour or so a week.

Having finally got some sunshine, the plants have shot up (including weeds, of course)! This includes the wild orchids that bloom around the Chilterns at this time of year. Bradenham (where the farmer, Andrew Stubbings, has left many areas as wildflower meadows) has thousands of them – mainly Pyramidal Orchids, but there are also Bee orchids and Common Spotted orchids to be found. Activities

By the time you read this, the first of our special activities for the year should have taken place, with local naturalist and conservationist, John Moorby, leading a guided walk around Little Burnham Meadow and Spinney (owned by the Parish Council) in Hughenden Valley.

On Sunday 11th August at 3pm (starting from Naphill Village Hall), John Tyler will again lead a minibeast safari on Naphill Common. Suitable for ages 6 and above, these events have proved very popular in the past.

Finally, on **Friday 27th September at 7pm** (again starting from our Village Hall), Julie Hopton will lead another Bat Walk around the Common, bat detectors will (as usual) be supplied!

FoNC Working Parties

We're delighted that a dozen volunteers from the RAF joined one of our working parties on the Common, helping to control the invasive holly and clear fallen timber. So next time you're out and about, keep an eye out for these little masterpieces, you never know when a painted pebble might cross your path and remind you of the strength and solidarity we share, turning an ordinary day into something extraordinary! As the Naphill Brownies did for me!

If you have not been before, then the Thrift Shop on RAF High Wycombe's 3 Site is a little goldmine! Books, clothes, bric-a-brac, jewellery and children's toys fill the 4-roomed shop and welcomes both civilian and military personnel. Many of the items are brand new, still in the original wrapping and would make wonderful gifts for all occasions.

"We sell all sorts of things in equal quantity. There is no real best seller, although we tend to sell fewer DVDs these days. Donations have even included a boomerang," said Jean, one of the shop's long serving volunteers. "On one of our Tuesday late night openings we had over two hundred people turn up!"

Donations that are in good, saleable condition (preferably laundered if clothing) are always gratefully accepted. Electrical items are also accepted if they are brand new and boxed.

To understand the importance of the shop's work, last year it made a donation of £5000 to the military Charity Hounds for Heroes which provides specially trained assistance dogs to those serving (or have served) in the military. Your patronage really does matter.

The Thrift Shop, which is located opposite Templewood, is open every Wednesday between 0900-1300 during term time and once a month on a Tuesday evening between 1830-2000hrs. There is no parking on site and the shop is strictly cash only.

We are delighted to announce that this year's Classics on the Crick, Charity Car Show, raised a total of £20,234. As usual all profits go directly to the Thames Valley Air Ambulance and brings our fundraising total to £113,608 since we started in 2014.

In 2024, the Air Ambulance celebrated 25 years of operation, achieving nearly 35,000 lifesaving callouts over that time. Minutes matter with major trauma incidents. Their Airbus H135 helicopter can reach speeds of 160 mph, and based at RAF Benson, it can get to anywhere in Berkshire, Buckinghamshire or Oxfordshire in just 15 minutes. It needs just the size of two tennis courts to land.

Once again, we would like to thank everybody who helped us with this year's show including Naphill Village Hall, The Horse Trust, Chiltern Vale Scout Group and Sytner High Wycombe BMW/MINI.

Finally, it would not be possible without our fantastic band of hard-working volunteers. To thank them for their efforts, after the cheque presentation, many of them joined us for a well-deserved drink and bite to eat at The Wheel.

We hope to see you all again next year, so put Sunday 8th of June 2025 in your diary now!





Growing Your Own

Climate change food prices, and imports



During the past three years food prices have increased by about 30% in the UK. Grow your own.

But the situation for our future looks far worse. According to the UN Environment Programme the planet is on track for a temperature rise of up to 2.9C above pre-industrial levels, rather than the 1.5C target agreed at the Paris climate talks. High temperatures affect crop yields. By the end of this century maize crops are expected globally to be down 7 to 16%, rice 2 to 9%, soyabeans 3 to 10% and wheat 6 to 20%. Yet these are the staple crops for the planet. The UN has said that we need to double food production by 2050 to cope with increased world population and a change in diet towards meat. That does not square with a decline in food production caused by climate change. Disaster beckons.

How will this affect the UK? One thing is certain - world food prices will increase markedly caused by the market forces of supply and demand. Prices will increase markedly in the UK. After the Second World War families spent about half their incomes on food. That has now dropped to about 9% owing to our rise in affluence resulting from increased productivity in the economy. In some parts of the developing world people already spend about half their incomes on food. Perhaps that will happen again in the UK.

And what about the security of our food supplies? We import about half our food at present, so our very

existence depends upon "the kindness of strangers". With significant parts of the world not able to have the bare minimum of food, one can see wars breaking out, and migration being the only solution for many people. Yet in the UK, with an increase in population of above 700,000 per annum currently because of net migration, our Climate Change Committee is planning to take about 20% of farmland out of production for forests and peatlands by 2050. Cannot people do the sums? We need a department of government examining where our food comes from and the threats to those sources of supply – and the threats to our ability to keep shipping lanes open.

Back to growing your own. In Naphill and Walter's Ash there are those who would like a little more land to cultivate, and there are those who are finding it difficult to maintain their gardens. Put the two together! If you need more land, take the initiative, contact a neighbour and do a deal!

So far this year we have had fairly incessant rain. That has made it very difficult for bees to collect pollen and beekeepers have had to feed their bees with sugar syrup just to keep them alive. In the UK honey crops are 20% of what they were at this time last year. Will crops be down as a result of the lack of pollination by bees?

Not from the Vicarage - Of mice, men and cats

When out on duty, we are the only people who actually live on North Mole in Gibraltar, but there are other beings with which we share our space. I refer to the small colony of feral cats that can be seen every evening at around 10.30pm, hanging around the security gate waiting for their dinner. On cue, a small white car draws up and a lady brings out trays of cat food for them to eat and replenishes their drinking bowls with fresh water. She patiently waits for them to finish eating, silently checking them over for any signs of injury or disease. Dinner over, the trays are collected back into the car, the lady leaves and the cats disappear back to their hiding places.

Though feral, the cats are not uncared for. They are fed and kept an eye on, yet remain suspicious of people; if you try to approach them, they run away. Even the offer of some rare titbit that has come from the leftovers of the latest restaurant meal I've eaten is greeted with suspicion and will only be accepted if I stand about 10 feet away.

I thought this all very quaint and kindly, but discovered that caring for these creatures is not just an act of altruism. A friend told me that every district of Gibraltar has its own little colony of feral cats and that they are 'looked after'in a sense by a number of caring individuals, their presence being welcomed as they keep away the rodents. 'You won't find a bait box in Gibraltar' my friend told me 'the cats deal with the rats'. Yeah! Right! There must be bait boxes. So I started actively looking in places where bait boxes might be laid. Places like the

restaurants in Ocean Village – none. Casemates Square – none there either. The Market – definitely no boxes. Europa Point – no signs of any. Camp Bay – not one. I was sure I had spotted one in Morrisons car park, but when I checked – zilch. Even McDonald's, that happy hunting ground for rodents, gulls and all carrion feeders – nothing.

It really does appear that my friend is right. The cats are quiet, discreet and wary; you are not aware of places being overrun by stray cats, yet they are clearly doing a great job. This isn't to say that there are absolutely no bait boxes anywhere on Gibraltar, but it does seem that this natural form of pest control is working well.

In the book of Genesis, when God made the world, humans were intended to care for the world in partnership with the other creatures that had been created, working together in harmony and balance. Sadly, we have not always done that, often exploiting animals and birds for our own ends. Our modern world is finally beginning to realise that the earth does not just belong to us and that when we make space for nature, nature will come and reward us in a wonderful variety of ways.

As we face the challenges that we have made for ourselves on our God-given planet, may we rediscover the way to work in harmony with the created.

Naphill Neighbours

Our post war celebrations in the crescent where I lived in Northolt included a street party at which we had a bonfire, topped by a 'guy' in the shape of Adolph Hitler. I was 5 years old and just enjoyed the jelly and cake our mothers had managed to get together. This month's talk by Richard Anderson provided an interesting background to Hitler's domestic life. It was entitled 'Hitler and his mistress"



6th June 1945 - Victory in Europe street party, Briar Crescent, Northolt, Middlesex

Hitler had three sisters and numerous mistresses, including Eva Braun whom he eventually married as he lost the war. He was a vegetarian, living on a diet of huge amounts of vegetables which played havoc with his digestive system. He loved dogs and the countryside, hence his mountain retreat 'Berchtesgaden' where he and Eva built a house. Eva organised the build and the decor. The house was high up the mountain and Hitler and Eva could be private there. There were underground passageways from the administrative area up to the house. Eva was Hitler's companion for much of the war despite the fact that he had numerous mistresses.

Several of Hitler's women committed suicide, including Celi Raubal: she is reported to have blown her brains out but there is strong evidence that Hitler shot her.

In contrast, Hitler loved chatting to children; he did not have any of his own. Eva Braun could not have children for anatomical reasons. He also liked to have the company of secretaries, with whom he took tea in the evenings.

Our speaker showed images of the house that were taken after the war. These glimpses of domesticity showed another aspect of Hitler. Hitler and Eva died together in the bunker in Berlin.

A Message from Padre Andi - Loading Summer - ERROR 404 Summer not found...

At the time of writing, it seems like summer has yet to be found. It's almost as if it's begun to load, then either a cold snap arrives, or westerly wind brings rain from the Atlantic then ERROR 404... Summer not found.

In my mind, summer should be about long sunny days, walks with the dogs to village pubs and meeting with friends for BBQs, like that of previous years. Yet, for what ever reason it's just not got going. My expectations are that summer should be glorious, and that's not happened... so far.

We all have expectations in our lives about how things should go, whether that be a promotion at work, a holiday or something as simple as how our fish and chips should taste. Wild About Naphill

"We might even see "wild" cattle, horses and pigs"

First the depressing bit. Everyone must be aware of the appalling decline in the quality of our natural environment. Official studies show that almost all wild species of both flora and fauna have declined in number and variety over the last few decades. Some declines have been dramatic: we have lost 97% of our wildflower meadows and, along with them, pollinating insects such as butterflies (down 76%) and moths (88%) together with many beetle and bee species. Our mammals, reptiles and amphibians have all suffered and both farmland and woodland birds have plummeted dramatically. According to the Common Bird Census between 1970 and 1999 tree sparrows declined by 95%, corn buntings by 88%; spotted flycatchers 77%; starlings 71%; turtle dove 71%; song thrush 56%; bullfinch 53 %; skylark 52% and the cuckoo by 33% - just a few examples. But many do not need official surveys to tell them of the tragic changes. When did you last hear a skylark or a song thrush singing near our village, let alone a nightingale? Familiar species such as yellowhammers, chiffchaffs and even the humble greenfinch have become an unusual sight. When did you last see a hedgehog, wild violets, or a grey partridge?

The causes of this catastrophe are generally well known. Chief among them are the excessive use of insecticides and "weed" killers, which kill and poison the foundation of all life that rests upon them. Then habitat loss: whether the grubbing out of hedges, the felling of woodland or the growing of houses. Other factors such as climate change, new agricultural practices such as the autumn sowing of corn crops, increased disturbance by people and their pets etc., are of increasing significance.

What can be done about it? Despair at the failure of small-scale measures has fostered an interest in "rewilding": the process of returning an area, as near as possible to its original ecology. This involves creating the earlier vegetation and re-introducing lost species of animal, from mice and shrews to large herbivores and their predators. In America and on the continent of Europe this can involve huge areas of land, wild cattle, horses, pigs and deer, together with bears, lynx and even wolves. In these islands our projects have to be more modest and amount to "wilding" rather rewilding: that is trying to return to a natural system as wild as is compatible with the pressures of our human population. There are several projects underway, including on the Knepp Castle Estate in West Sussex. (See 'Wilding' by Isabella Tree.) What can we do around Naphill? Wilding enthusiasts claim that three Cs are essential: cores, corridors and carnivores. There needs to be a core area which is large and as rich in species as possible. This must be connected by corridors of relatively clear land to allow animals and plants to migrate and spread to other suitable habitats nearby, thus ensuring gene flow. The carnivores are needed to control the numbers of large herbivores and stop them reducing the vegetation to monotonous grassland.

For Naphill the obvious core area would be the Common – already a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) and a Special Area of Conservation (SAC), but it has its drawbacks. It is not a very varied habitat, being almost entirely woodland. More significant is its popularity. Of course, it is a real asset and visitors are to be welcomed, but they have a severe impact on the wildlife. This is especially so with dog walkers which ensure that the Common could never support

a variety of deer, cattle or horses, let alone wild boar, whilst we are host to so many dogs. This also applies to the ponds: if dogs that have been dusted for fleas go in the ponds, they do serious damage to the daphnia and other minute organisms at the base of the food chain for such things as newts, frogs and fish. Another problem with the Common is that there is a constant danger that it will lose its corridors connecting it to the surrounding countryside, as has happened with the development in Clappins Lane. If the Council and developers pick on Great and Little Mosely Farms or the meadows behind the Wheel pub, the village will constitute an impenetrable barrier to the movement of species.

So what practically can be done? On the Common we could conserve the ancient pollards and encourage the spread of undergrowth: the brambles, juniper and

gorse so necessary for birds to nest and mammals to shelter. We could see the line of woodland and meadows on the other side of the village, from Courns Wood, Stocking lane Woods, across to Chalkpit Wood and Combe Lane as a second core area and encourage a richer, more varied pattern of environments, from chalk meadows to scrub and woodland. We might even see "wild" cattle, horses and pigs. Above all we must defend the few remaining connecting corridors against spreading suburbia.

Perhaps these are just dreams, but why not set some targets? Imagine: it is possible within a decade that we could stand on the Common in the evening and hear a nightingale sing.

Gordon the Bird Man - Woodpeckers and Deer

As with the Long Eared Owl the Lesser Spotted Woodpecker was, in Victorian times, the most widespread and common member of its family in the British isles. Also like the Long Eared Owl it has not adapted well with urbanisation. The species also suffered with loss of traditional orchards in the 1940 and 50s. It is now, by far, the rarest of our three woodpeckers. We used to have four but the Wryneck, always a scarce summer visitor, has been considered extinct since 1988 as a British breeding bird.

Owing to it's small size, at 5.5" about the size of Sparrows, Robins or Great Tits, the Lesser Spotted Woodpecker has always been difficult to survey. Added to this it is a bird that is very rarely seen in gardens. Recently, an experiment was carried out in four areas known to have Lesser Spotted Woodpecker territories with three feeders placed in each location and monitored with trailcams over three months. Throughout this period there was not one visit recorded by a Lesser Spotted Woodpecker. Organisations sometimes receive reports of Lesser Spotted Woodpeckers at garden

feeders which virtually always turn out to be Greater Spotted Woodpeckers. The confusion arises in June and July when juvenile Greater Spotted Woodpeckers appear in gardens. The youngsters sport a red crown for a few months after fledging and this can be confused with the red crown of a male Lesser Spotted Woodpecker but at nearly twice it's size should be readily recognised.

From a bird occasionally heard but never seen locally to an animal I have never seen here until the third of July. Walking home with the dogs along the path leading from/to the Piggery under the telegraph wires we were confronted by two Fallow Deer hinds which sedately wandered off into the woods. About 10 years ago after bumping into a chap I used to work with, who suggested I came over to look at Workaid to see what they were doing I signed up as a volunteer for one afternoon a week.

The aim of Workaid is to provide tools and equipment for vocational projects in Africa. To teach young people skills and to empower them to make a sustainable living or set up their own small businesses. Projects may include woodworking, tailoring & sewing, plumbing, engineering and vehicle maintenance.

The tools are all donated to Workaid by the public who have a shed or workshop to clear out, moving house or following a bereavement. Everything from woodworking tools, hand tools through to sewing machines, knitting machines and haberdashery. Equipment is then cleaned and serviced, packed in relevant kits, loaded into containers and exported to Africa where local agents supervise the allocation.


Any surplus or non-suitable equipment is sold either through our "Charity shop with a difference" or on eBay to raise funds to pay for the containers and workshop running costs. I volunteer in the "heavy" machine workshop where we service and repair larger machines such as woodworking and engineering machines, compressors, air tools etc. I also do maintenance and safety on the charity's own workshop machinery.

I work with an amazing bunch of people who have worked in different industries and have retired but have so much experience and skills to offer. We also have a Duke of Edinburgh award volunteer. Not only do I feel a huge satisfaction doing a great job training people in Africa but I've made some really good friends there.

Volunteers are welcome from across the community, retired people from every discipline who have something to offer, skilled or unskilled, people with learning difficulties or recovering from illness or injuries. There are two shifts a day and the charity even provide free tea & biscuits!

Cognitive Hypnotherapy - Fear of Flying



So many people suffer with common phobias, such as Arachnophobia (fear of spiders), and Trypanophobia (fear of injections). There are also many less well-known ones, including the recent addition - Nomophobia (fear of being without your mobile phone). - Relaxation techniques breathwork calms the nervous system and even a big, audible sigh out will alleviate some anxiety immediately.
- * Choose the right seat: Sitting near the front and by a window reduces the effect of turbulence and provides a visual anchor.
- Tell the flight attendants: They are used to offering support.
- * Stay hydrated and avoid caffeine: drinking plenty of water can help reduce physical symptoms of anxiety.
