Naphill Village Hall & Playing Fields Council -Chairman's Report

A meeting of the committee was held on the 3 August. It was held online and there were 15 members present. Reopening of the hall was discussed and it was agreed that a checklist would be circulated to the hirers. This would include the principle that they would be responsible for the cleaning of the relevant areas before and after they used the hall. Cleaning materials would be provided and the hall would also be cleaned each evening. When we have a firm commitment that the long-term hirers will work within these rules and we are confident that this will be financially viable we will consider reopening the hall. The committee has bought sanitisers and will provide a register so that track and trace could be pursued if needed. Until all this is agreed we will keep the village hall closed.

The Pizza van's current use of the Village hall carpark on a Thursday evening was also discussed. As the village hall will hopefully reopen in September it was agreed that the car park will once again be used by the hall hirers and so will no longer be available for the Pizza van to use.

The play area has not yet been inspected and so we cannot open it at present. When we are able to open this area, the current corona restrictions will apply so that anyone

using the playground equipment will be responsible for wiping down before and after their children use it.

Due to the lockdown there has been increased use of the crick. Unfortunately, there are a few people who do not consider the playground is closed and they have clambered over the fence and taken their children and dogs into the playground. The fence surrounding this area has been damaged and will now need to be repaired. The increased use of the crick has resulted in more litter being left lying on the crick, many people have cleared this rubbish up and I would like to thank them for picking the litter up. They include Jackie Johnstone, Margret Hunter, Claire Christan and the staff of Bon Ami.

Although the hall has been closed some work has been done. The faulty ceiling lights have been replaced with LED units and the heating boilers have been inspected and serviced

I hope you are all safe and keeping well.

Parking – a sore point in Hughenden Parish Area?

According to Local Insight 2018 published by Buckinghamshire Council 6% of households within the boundaries of Hughenden Street Association (in other words, the Parish) do not have a car. The average across England is 26%.



Looking at the number of households with more than 1 car may help us understand why the issue is a sore point at times. The table above reveals some interesting facts. When we add in the number of 'visitors' whether for the school run, football club, keep fit sessions, family visits, etc it becomes clear why there might be an issue. Even though there are some rather urban areas within the parish for the most part it remains semi-rural. There is easy access to the countryside and plenty of open places to walk the dog, take a stroll or have a picnic.

During the early days of easing the lockdown people came out to Hughenden because their local parks were so full. If you drive into High Wycombe on a sunny day cars are parked on the pavements near to the entrance to Hughenden Park.

What can we do?

Firstly, residents must lead by example. Clubs and groups in the parish that bring youngsters together should also do their bit. It needs to be continuous and consistent for the best impact.

Call to action!

Hughenden Neighbourhood Action Group (HNAG) members have joined forces to try to address the issue of visitors parking without consideration. It equally applies to residents. The HNAG members are Thames Valley Police, Neighbourhood Watch, Hughenden Street Association and the Parish Council. The Group has created a leaflet which can be placed on the windscreen of cars parked inappropriately. The information provided in the leaflet aims to remind vehicle owners of their responsibilities... including residents.

Friends of Naphill Common



While walking on Naphill Common it is likely that you will form the impression that it is woodland composed predominately of a mixture of beech and oak trees, with a scattering of yews and rather a lot of holly. Sharp eyes will spot the occasional ash, especially at the edge, and a few whitebeams, cherries, birches, and hornbeams. Over towards Bradenham, on the Clumps, there are horse chestnuts and lime trees, but they were planted along with ashes and other species on the banks of the rings. The richness and interest of the natural tree population rests mainly in the survival of so many ancient beech pollards and oaks, together with a few really fine yews. These ancient trees are rare even in the Chilterns.

The composition of the Common woodland reflects its origins. The heavy clay soil is unsuited to agriculture so was left as open common land dotted with a few trees. No doubt the grazing animals kept the area as open grassland with gorse and juniper bushes dotted over it. As grazing declined more young trees and bushes appeared, and by the end of the 19th Century almost half of the area furthest from the village was tree covered. Even in the 1960s large areas on the village side were still essentially heathland. The area opposite Beehive Cottage was the last remnant. Eventually there survived only half a dozen straggling old junipers and just a few ancient gorse bushes.

The Friends of Naphill Common have taken cuttings from the few surviving junipers and planted out nine specimens (one of which has mysteriously disappeared) and fortunately they have turned out to include both sexes, and one already has a rich crop of berries. The recent felling has let in much more light and this is likely to transform the vegetation. It has certainly encouraged magnificent displays of foxgloves, but the way bracken is prospering is perhaps a little less welcome. We are endeavouring to ensure that it does not swamp the young junipers.

The oaks are almost all the English or Pedunculate Oak Quercus robur, but in the literature concerned with making the Common a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) there is a claim that there are also some Sessile Oaks Quercus petraea. The English Oak is the most common on clay soils in the Midlands and the South and East of the country, while the sessile Oak dominates in the North and West. Both can grow to almost forty meters (130ft) when unpollarded. It is not easy to spot the difference between them, but this is the time of year when it is easiest because the acorns are prominent. The English Oak bears its acorns on peduncles or fine green stalks an inch or two long while the sessile Oak has them 'sessile'; that is growing close to the twig on stalks less than ½ Inch long. There are also differences in the leaves opposite to that of the acorns: those of the Sessile Oak are on short stalks while the leaves of the English Oak have almost no stalk. This difference is emphasised by the shape of the leaf itself. That of the English Oak has lobes which hide what stalk it has, while the leaf of the Sessile Oak tapers down to its stalk thus making the stalk more obvious.

We hope to resume our long (roughly 2 hour) FoNC walks in August, while observing all the relevant 'social distancing' requirements (subject to no late change to these). The first walk should have taken place by the time you read this. The Thursday morning working parties have similarly resumed – if you're interested in joining either of these activities please contact Ron Collins on 01494 562240. The Sunday working parties and short walks remain suspended for the time being, as (of course) do our other activities.

Growing Your Own



At the start of the EU's Common Agricultural Policy subsidies were paid to farmers for the quantity of food produced. That led inevitably to "wine lakes" and "beef mountains" because of over-production. The policy was then changed to what we have today, which is payments to farmers based upon the amount of land they cultivate. That has led to the wealthiest farmers being paid a great deal. Now, as the UK leaves the EU, we have to subsidise farmers ourselves instead of relying on payments from Brussels. What is being considered is payments based upon ecological aspects, such as making the countryside pretty, providing habitats for wildlife, etc. Subsidies to farmers are very important, amounting generally to half a farmer's income, so the government can easily influence farmers' behaviour.

But we have gone well away from encouraging food production, which fell from 78% of our needs in 1984 to about 60% today. We produced 70% of our fresh vegetables in the year 2000 and that had dropped to 53% in 2018. If we now pay subsidies to farmers based upon ecological factors one can only expect a further reduction in the amount of food we produce ourselves. Food self-sufficiency seems to have been completely abandoned as a national aim, which makes us increasingly vulnerable to dislocation in our food supplies from one cause or another. It is therefore increasingly important to grow your own if you can, in your garden or on an allotment.

How has 2020 been so far? We had no rain in February, March and April apart from a very heavy downpour early in April. The weather was fine throughout and we did not have damaging frosts. From early May onwards we have had very good growing conditions - warm sunny weather with periods of rain when needed. Therefore, a very good year for growing your own. Unfortunately

the weeds also found the growing conditions ideal and I have had great difficulty keeping on top of the weeds.

The muntjac deer have been a big problem on the Walter's Ash allotments this year. There is nothing more galling than to have planted out a nice row of broad bean plants only to find next day that they have been cropped down to the ground. Many plotholders have resorted to erecting fences round their crops as a defence. With the greatest reluctance I have followed suit and have chosen to fence off the entire centre of my allotment where I grow crops which the muntjac have on their menu. It is a simple fence of plastic netting about three feet high. It seems to work. I have suffered no damage since I erected it. Although the deer can clear a fence 8 feet high I find that they are lazy and will not make the effort to clear my barrier.





Why Woke and Cancel culture could be the greatest danger of all.

Have you ever felt scared to speak up? Have you hidden your opinion for fear of being berated? It seems its more and more common these days with emotion driven topics dominating the media for years now – "I wouldn't dare say anything", " its best not to get involved", "it feels like no one agrees with me".

In 1910 Thoedore Roosevelt gave his famous "Man in the Arena" speech, arguably one of the finest speeches ever and an excellent read if you need a pep talk. "The credit belongs to the man who is actually in the arena, whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood; who strives valiantly; who errs, and comes short again and again"

These days it seems all too common for an immediate shut down, people are afraid to speak for fear of saying the wrong thing, or people refuse to comment without having had a chance to have time for a measured consulted approach. Of course, sometimes you should not speak in haste and will undoubtedly wish words could pop back in your mouth but surely to be "scared to speak" for fear of offending is far more dangerous. Debate is good, nuanced debate is better but sometimes just blithely discussing can also teach, open eyes and horrify. Any reaction is potentially positive even if it starts off in offence and our ability to speak without fear of making a mistake is important.

Mistakes are key to learning, we don't give up when we try walking for the first time, we repeatedly crash down but our human nature wills us to keep trying – we have to keep talking and discussing and , yes, sometimes say the wrong thing because no one is perfect and it's an impossible ideal – we shouldn't be afraid to strive for something for fear of something we may have said or done years ago. Mistakes can lead to great things and as Roosevelt said over a century ago "to judge a man merely by success, is an abhorrent wrong."

Letter from Bradenham Vicarage

As summer slides into autumn, the cycle of prayer and blessing that began with Plough Sunday in January and continued to Rogation Sunday in May now finds further expression in Lammas or Loaf Mass, traditionally celebrated on 1st August, followed by Harvest. The Coronavirus outbreak that saw lockdown begin on 24th March has driven a coach and horses through any form of 'normal' church celebration of most of these events, but the dates remain fixed in the pattern of worship and we do well to call them to mind. Such celebrations give us anchor points in our lives.

Lammas or 'Loaf-mass' is an English feast in origin, held as a thanksgiving for the first-fruits of the wheat harvest. It is followed by Harvest. Traditionally, at both festivals, a newly baked loaf from the wheat harvest was presented before God within the mass of that day. The loaf should ideally be baked by members of the congregation, using local produce wherever possible and may be used as the Eucharistic bread in the service.

It's easy to think of these festivals as reaching back to an ancient society that lived close to the land. They do indeed have pre-Christian roots, involving the symbolic offering of bread and beer to the god and goddess of the harvest. Much of this is bound up with the need to provide food to sustain human life, and the accompanying sense of a proper humility before God as source of all things, gratitude for his goodness, and responsibility in stewarding the resources of the earth.

When our ancestors lived, hundreds of years ago, the harvesting and processing of grain was crucial. If crops were left in the fields too long they spoiled, bread could not be baked and families would starve. Taking care of one's crops meant the difference between life and death.

In our modern world, it was often easy to forget the trials and tribulations our ancestors had to endure. For us, if we needed a loaf of bread, we simply drove over to the nearest supermarket and bought some. If we ran out, we just got some more. The events of the past few months have seen the abundance we took for granted shaken to the core. Panic buying in the early days of the pandemic led to empty supermarket shelves and shortages of such basics as pasta, rice and flour. Quarantine restrictions and labour shortages led to more, often strange gaps on the shelves (remember lack of the Marmite?). Suddenly, we were not so far removed from the world our pre-industrial ancestors inhabited. In our comfortable, 21st century lives, it is good to take time to reflect on how fragile our communities are and how dependant we ultimately are on God's favour and goodness towards each us. Festivals within the church's year give us the opportunity to do this and acknowledge God's presence and importance in our lives.

Red Kites: Nice Or Nasty?

You have probably read some reports in the local press about red kites "attacking" pets and people, including children, in an attempt to get food. They are certainly getting increasingly bold in their relationship to us humans and when they see people holding something edible it seems that they occasionally swoop to grab it. Since they live largely by scavenging this is predictable behaviour as they get used to a close proximity with us. There can be little doubt that the widespread practice of feeding kites with various scraps – even holding tempting samples up for them to take – has contributed to their increased confidence.

It would be a great pity if this undesirable behaviour leads to people fearing these beautiful birds and even to their being persecuted. The official advice from the Chiltern Conservation Board is as follows:-

'Red kites can survive well in the Chilterns without artificial feeding, so it is not necessary to supplement their diet. It is acknowledged that feeding has helped the local re-introduced kite population to increase

more rapidly than it might otherwise have done and has kept the population at a level that chicks can be re-located to other parts of the country. However, it is feared that providing too much additional food can prevent the population from spreading naturally and cause the birds to cluster in large numbers where food is offered. The Chilterns Conservation Board urges the public not to feed red kites. We believe they should be left to feed naturally in the wider countryside, thus enabling them to find a naturally sustainable level.' http://www.chilternsaonb.org/about-chilterns/red-kites/red-kite-faqs.html#Q9

In brief, the population of red kites in the Chilterns is too dense and it will benefit both them and us if we stop feeding them. They will then disperse more widely over the country and be less over-familiar with their human neighbours. This will produce a more natural relationship and allow us to enjoy their grace and beauty without fear of undesirable behaviour.



Mr Robert George Davis, our Dad, but known to all as Bob was born in Tottenham on 10th of December 1929. Despite living through the second world war in a part of London that suffered horrendous bombing raids, our dad enjoyed a very happy childhood.

One our dad's first childhood memories was of his school teacher instructing the children of the rules they should follow if they heard the siren. If the siren went off whilst walking to school, they were always

to run to whichever was the closer whether it be to school or home. In the hope that he would be closer to home and could skip school, he'd always do his best to walk as slowly as he could. He also recalled a daily paper round and a particular morning when he left home to discover that there was only half of the house opposite was left standing, with a bed still inside the remaining half of the bedroom with a picture still visible on the wall.

Despite living during these tough times, he always felt loved and protected by his Mum and Auntie and always talked fondly of his Mum Rosie and his dad Micky who was away serving in North Africa.

Dads first job was as an assistant in a menswear shop which only lasted a short period before he joined Tottenham RDC as a clerk. This opportunity led him onto a career that lasted until his retirement at the age of 60. Dad was an extremely popular and well liked man working in local government in Sussex, the West Midlands, Slough, Maidenhead and High Wycombe.

Just after Dad had completed his national service in the late forties he took a week's break with a mate to Croyde Bay Holiday Camp in Devon. There he met the love of his life and future wife Hazel. Being the organiser of club entertainment and appearing to be a bit of a laugh, our mum soon fell for him and his rendition of Al Jolson's song, "Mammy". However, as he came from Tottenham and she Leicester, meeting would be difficult but not for Bob who frequently cycled the 120 mile journey.



Dad went through life helping others, from donating blood and plasma for many years, to obtaining grants for sports complexes and raising money at local fetes for community projects. Over the years he raised thousands of pounds all for the benefit of others and also reached over 100 blood donations for which he was honoured. He was also president of the Princes Risborough Bowls club and secretary of Naphill FC for a number of years.

Dad could be a bit of a comedian when he wanted to be and was proud of the fact that he knew and was aware of the workings of just about every speed camera in South Buckinghamshire, but was the only person who managed to get two speeding tickets within 10 minutes of each other on the same stretch of road. To our knowledge he also holds the record for being the oldest person (aged 81 at the time) to drive a quad bike through rough terrain in Bansko, Bulgaria. In fact a video was made promoting the service using dads experience that day. He was generally up for anything and in particular liked challenges that would take him out of his comfort zone. He was always the first one to turn up in fancy dress for any party, he loved his quiz nights and socialising. He didn't have many vices and was always proud to tell people that he never had a fag in his life. However, loved his red wine and never refused a glass when offered.

Dad was our hero and adored by his daughters in law, grandchildren and great grandchildren. Even in his later years and dealing with dementia he was still looked upon as the head of family. He was happy, jokey and never stopped smiling, and was such a ray of sunshine. Everybody who knew him showed him nothing but respect. He was so loved by his family and has left a tremendous legacy. Bob will be very much missed by all.

A Message from Saint Michael's and All Angels Hughenden Vicarage

As I write these words in early August, we are in the middle of a heat wave in the UK. Daily we have grown accustomed to a diet of mixed news reports across the media, whilst some are enjoying meeting outside at a local café or in a pub garden to enjoy a half priced meal and drink, as we catch up with friends who we have only been able to greet at a distance, or wave to on Zoom for the past 5 months.

I am sure I am not alone in shaking my head in disbelief at times, as I witness how Cov-19 has impacted our world. Different nations have coped with the epidemic with varying degrees of success, and we are now experiencing perhaps the most challenging economic outlook in a generation, as job losses are announced in the thousands, beaches are crowded, high streets deserted, with no one quite sure what to expect around the next corner.

When I left school, just after my 18th birthday, and joined Barclays Bank, starting at the branch in Virginia Water, Surrey, I didn't give landing my first full-time job a great deal of thought. I do remember walking from the train station on my first day, feeling awkward, dressed in my first suit, but like many of my contemporaries at the time, there were lots of options open to me, and I was fed up of studying, so embarked instead on an 8 year career in banking.

What a different world for young adults leaving school, college or university in 2020. Jobs are as rare as hen's teeth, and not even a strong academic record guarantees you paid employment. Students who have been setting their sights on the next stage of their elevation into the world of employment, a mortgage, a car on HP and a last-minute skiing trip to Val d'Isere, are having to re-evaluate their expectations. It must feel as if the carpet has been pulled from under them.

In chapter 29 of the Old Testament, the prophet Jeremiah speaks the following words of hope during a time of crisis in exile for the Israelites:

For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart.

I commend these verses to you if you are experiencing hardship and an uncertain future at the moment, or you know someone close to you who is struggling. God knows our needs before the words are on our tongue, and from my own personal experience, I can testify that

a life placed into God's hands, in order that he might mould and equip our hearts and minds to become more like his Son Jesus Christ, is one which gives us hope and a future.

Dear Lord, we ask that you would fill the hearts of those who are experiencing despair, doubt and fear during these uncertain times. As they turn to you in prayer, may you give them hope and a future, help them to see the world through your eyes, and may they know your peace, and a sense of your presence beside them always, amen.



But along this journey the Israelites learnt so much about themselves, their relationship with God and their reactions to external influences. And this has made me think about how I view journeys. Yes, this season we are in is dragging and it's got it's sucky bits, but I'm challenging myself to not simply wish to be in the future, but to see what I can do to help the journey be more enjoyable and to grow in this process. To build up my patience muscle and to choose peace in the midst of worry... I'm not saying this is easy, but it's a journey within a journey, and as I grow, it's not a question of 'are we nearly there yet' but 'am I ready to be there yet?'

Chiltern Hills Arboriculure - Staycation Ideas





I'm writing this at the beginning of the second week in August, so I don't know what the weather is like as you read this, but I am sure you will remember the 30+ deg C temperatures and pictures in the tabloids of packed beaches in Bournemouth and Brighton.

I am pretty sure that Friday 7th August 2020 was billed as the hottest recorded day in the UK since 2004. We were planning to go on a hike in the Chilterns, followed by a picnic somewhere nice. After reviewing the forecast, some sanity kicked in. So we decided that some time on the water "messing about in boats" would be a better idea. For this, we needed a boat.

Hobbs of Henley are celebrating their 150th anniversary this year. Founded by Henry Hobbs in 1870, they offer an extensive range of self-drive boats and river cruises. We opted for an hour hire of a four seater Pearly class launch at £43.50 an hour. We didn't book, but were able to hire a boat at 20 minutes notice. Not bad for the hottest day in 16 years.

There are plenty of sights to see from the water. Travelling upstream you will reach the weir and Marsh lock fairly quickly. There are a few eyots (islands in the middle of the river) that are home to properties with no vehicular access. One modest four bed bungalow is currently up for sale, don't ask the price. We turned our boat around and headed downstream, back to the town and on towards Temple Island, a fishing lodge, constructed in 1771 for Fawley Court.

At this point we turned around and headed back to town. Henley is a picturesque town, particularly from the water. I was channelling the spirit of Ratty and Mole from The Wind in the Willows, but was time to return the boat head to head out for our picnic.

However, if you want to go further you can press on past Hambleden Lock and get views of Danesfield

House at Medmenham. This place has an interesting history far too detailed to go into here. It is now a luxury hotel (George Clooney had his English wedding here), but in a previous life it has been headquarters to Carnation Foods and was requisitioned by the RAF in WW2 by the Reconnaissance and Photography Section for the interpretation of aerial photography.

Once you are done with the boating, get on the A4155 towards Reading. After about half a mile turn left into Mill Lane. Just past Henley Town FC there is a free carpark. Marsh Meadow and the riverside is just a 2 minute walk. Plenty of space to lay down a picnic blanket and soak up some sun. The kids can run around, kick a ball about, and let of some steam while you read a book or just chill out.


